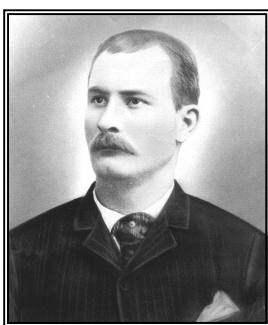

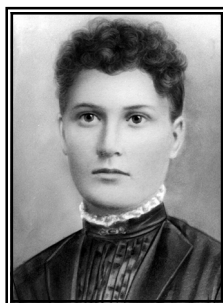

Reading This Book

If, while reading the following pages of this book, the reader will keep these few facts in mind, a much clearer understanding of the contents will result. The format or style used in this book is known as the **Modified Register System**, which has been refined by the National Genealogical Society.

Two types of numbers are used: one to uniquely identify the individual and one to denote his or her birth-order within the nuclear family. The identification numbering system used in this book is called **By Descendants, in Sequential Order**. The starting person is 1, his first child is 2, his first child's first child is 3, and so on. After all the descendants of the first child are listed, then the descendants of the second child are listed, and so on until 7 generations. The ID numbers are in sequential order.

When an individual is introduced in his/her separate sketch, the name appears in boldface letters with the surnames in all capital letters. The name is preceded by the identification number.

When the list of children is presented, the plus (+) sign indicates that more about this child will be presented in his/her separate sketch. The ID number is printed, followed by M/F indicating the sex. Next a small roman numeral in front of the name designates birth-order. Next the name is followed by the birth and death dates.

The term "Spouse" may have several different meanings: husband, wife, partner, mate, parent, or significant other. The couple involved may not be legally married. The term "stepchild" may have several different meanings: the child may be a stepchild, adopted child, foster child, or just raised in the home. If there are any other children of the spouse, they will be designated as stepchildren.

The index is arranged alphabetically by surname. Under each surname, the given names are alphabetically arranged. The number to the right indicates the page where this name appears. The wife appears under her maiden name.

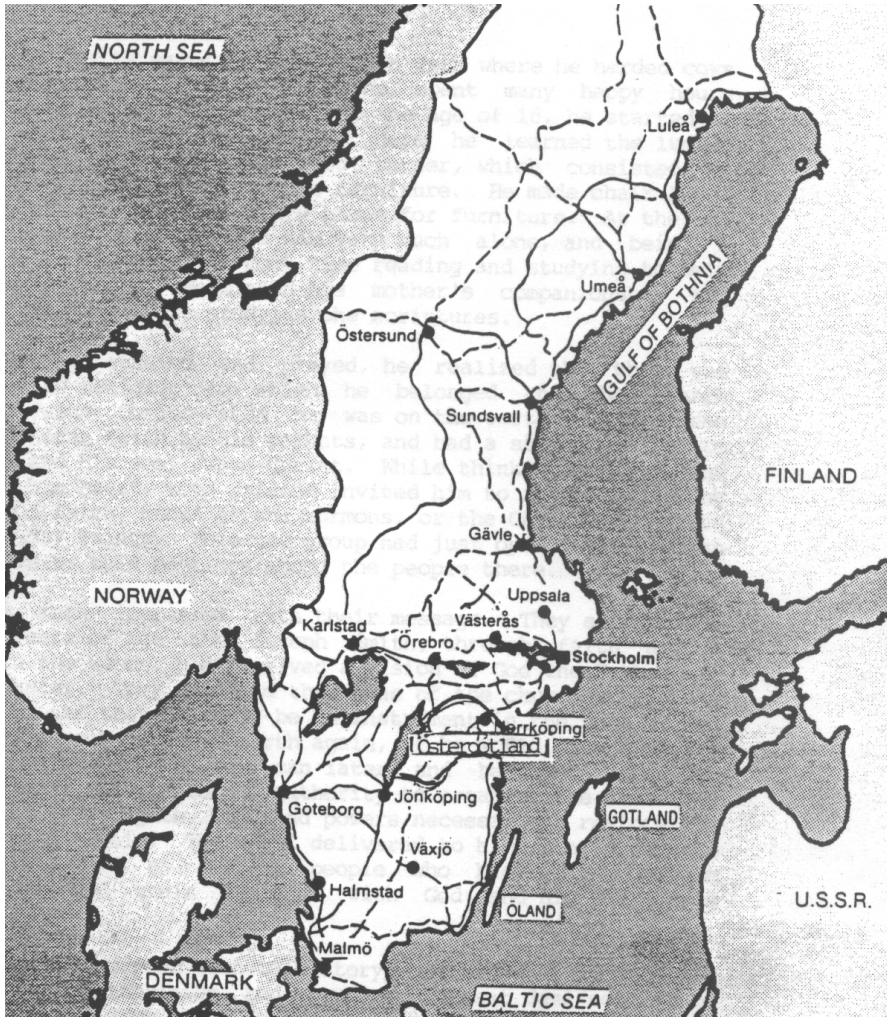

Introduction

Historical Background



The ancestors that we honor in this book were born in Sweden in the 1800's; therefore, it would be helpful to understand the history of their circumstances to better understand the decision they made to come to the United States of America.

The Swedish ruling family adopted General Jean Bernadotte of France and made him Crown Prince of Sweden and Norway in 1810. These countries were afraid of Napoleon and his aggression, and Bernadotte came to their rescue when he commanded an allied army that helped defeat Napoleon at Leipzig in 1813. This victory allayed their fears of

aggression and strengthened their economy. They soon made Jean Bernadotte King of Sweden and Norway under the name of Charles XIV. After his death, his son followed him to the throne and ruled as Oscar I.

The religious atmosphere at this time is also pertinent to our story. The Lutheran Church had been growing and strengthening its position for 300 years. It had become the State Church of all Northern Europe, including the Scandinavian countries. In Sweden, the Priests had great power and influence to the point of controlling people in high and low places. They did this according to the individual's willingness to conform to the Church's dictates. They were given the power to exile or imprison non-conformists, require every child to be baptized into the Lutheran Church,

and make a ruling that no other denomination could hold services while the State Church was in session, which was usually all day.

In 1850, a cause of great concern to the Priests of this State Church made its appearance. Young men traveling in pairs from a far-away place in America called Utah began teaching an entirely new concept. The first of these missionaries to arrive was Elder John Forsgren, a native of Gavle (pronounced Yev-la), Sweden. He had joined the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints while living in America, and was now returning to his homeland to share the gospel message. He had been set apart by Apostle Erastus Snow.

Many times the way is prepared for the missionaries by the Lord through vision or dreams. Elder Forsgren discovered that his sister had previously seen a remarkable vision which had made a deep impression on her. "She was sitting in church on Sunday morning, having previously engaged in devotional exercises. As the hymn was sung, she saw clearly a personage standing before her who said, 'On the 5th of July a man will come to you with three books and all those that believe in the things written in the books shall be saved.' When Elder Forsgren arrived with the Bible, Book of Mormon, and Doctrine and Covenants, she believed his testimony." (Taken from Scandinavian Jubilee Album, by Lund, Jenson, Spodahl, and Arloh.)

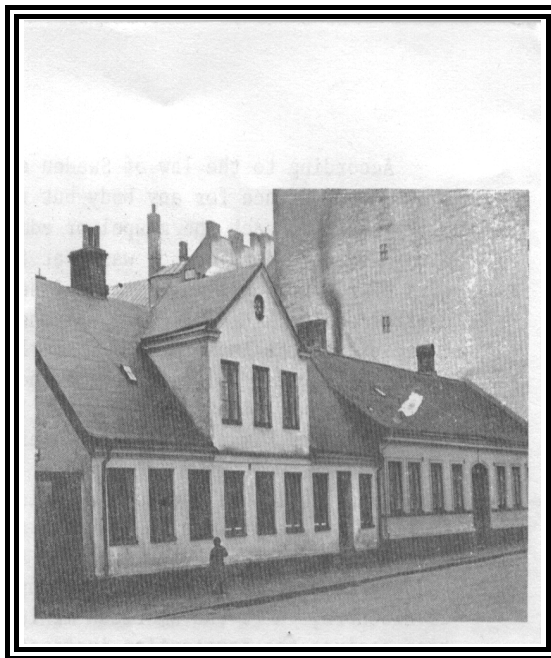
Another miracle was granted when John Forsgren's brother, Peter, was completely healed from consumption through faith and prayer and became the first to receive baptism and join his brother in sharing the gospel message. Peter later related a remarkable incident that happened to his brother, John:

"[John] was one day summoned to the office of the public prosecutor and the latter asked him for a picture of the Prophet Joseph! He procured a picture and the officer set fire to it. While it was burning, Elder John Forsgren had a vision in which he saw the city of Gavle destroyed by fire. He told his friends of this vision and also that they would be in America when the vision would take place. Nineteen years later from the date of the burning of Joseph's picture, the city of Gavle was almost totally destroyed by fire and the conflagration started in the very house where the picture of the Prophet had been sacrificed to the flames." (Lund, Jenson, Spodahl, Arloh)

According to the law of Sweden at that time, it was a criminal offense for anyone but appointed clergymen to preach the gospel or administer sacred ordinances. If anyone was found breaking this law, they were arrested and sent to Stockholm, the capital of Sweden. John Forsgren experienced this incarceration, but he taught and bore testimony to the truthfulness of his message, and many flocked to him and believed his message. When Elder Forsgren continued to find success, even after being in prison, the authorities decided to banish him and send him back to America. But when the captain of the ship took a liking to Elder Forsgren, the captain allowed him to escape. Today there is a monument to John Forsgren on city property next to his original home in Gavle, Sweden. Two of his descendants sculpted a bronze bust of him and mounted it on a pedestal made from Utah granite in 2001.

Even under these very adverse conditions, the gospel message continued to be shared. Subsequent missionaries were sometimes arrested, transported in chains, and sentenced without trial. In spite of the adversity, by 1853, the Skane Conference was organized with four branches from four different cities. This organizational meeting took place in the evening of June 25, 1853 in the city of Lund in the barn of Carl Johan Capson which is pictured here.

It is under these conditions that our ancestors heard a message that rang true in their hearts, left their homeland behind, and came to be with others who could worship freely as they believed. We owe them our love, honor, and loyalty for their sacrifices that made it possible for us to live in this great United States of America. May each of us be motivated to live a life that we would be happy to share with them when we meet again someday.



BENGT NILSSON MALMGREN and CECELIA SVENSDOTTER

Bengt Nilsson Malmgren was born 7 Jan 1804 in Malmo, Sweden. His parents were Nils Hansson and Karna Bengtsdotter. He was given the soldier name of Malmgren during his period of mandatory military service. This was a common practice to distinguish between soldiers with the same names. Bengt retained his soldier name when he came to the United States where it was used as a surname for his family.

He married **Cecelia Svensdotter** (Americanized to Swenson) 26 Oct 1828 in Malmo, Sweden. She was born in Malmo, Sweden, 26 May 1806. She was the daughter of Sven Olsson and Karna Andersdotter.

They had five children (all born in Malmo, Sweden); three lived to adulthood:

Elder Andrus Winberg was the missionary who introduced the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to Bengt and Cecelia and their family. They were baptized June 26, 1852. The first branch of the Church had just been organized in the spring of 1852. By the end of that year, 70 persons had been baptized. The Malmgren family attended that first conference that was held in the Capson's barn. The evening meeting lasted until 7:30 the next morning.

Because of the state church domination, the Mormon meetings had to be held secretly at night. A short time after they had joined the Church, Johanna Caroline's parents returned early from a church meeting and found that their home had been raided and Caroline, 14 years old, had been arrested and put in jail. Leaving Sweden were the terms offered for her release, so Caroline consented and went to Denmark where she earned her livelihood for the next year.

In Denmark she met a cousin who had a passport to America which she was unable to use because of illness. She gave it to Caroline, whose only asset

was \$1.50. However, she was given the opportunity of tending one of the passengers who was ill. Caroline was a very attractive girl and the captain of the ship become infatuated with her and wanted to marry her. She told him she was a "Mormon" and was going to Utah.



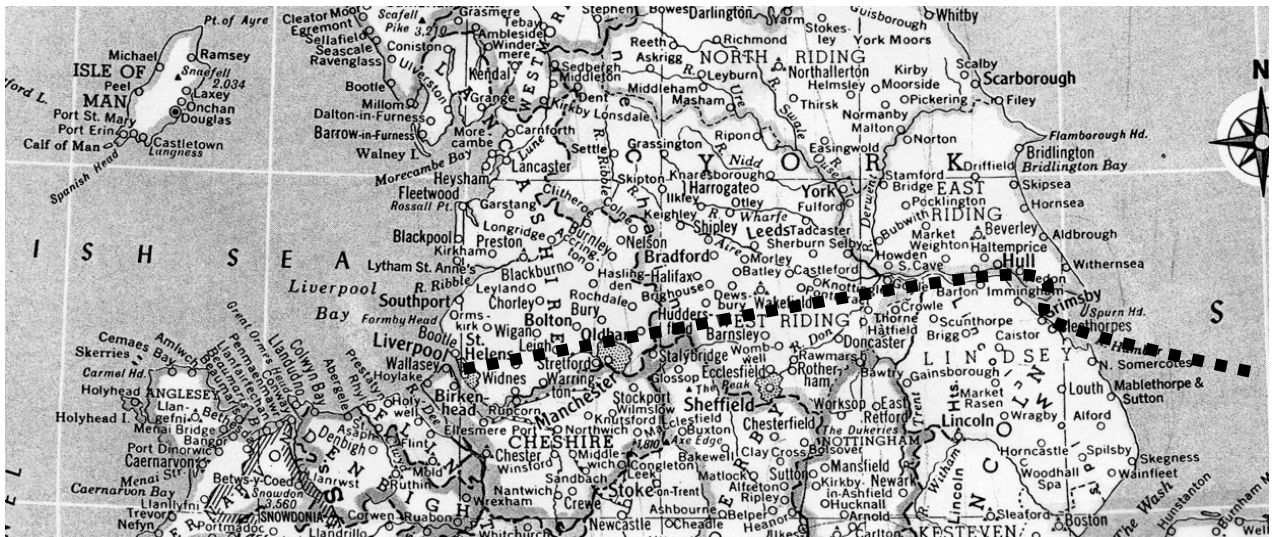

Caroline left Liverpool, England, on January 7, 1855, and entered the Salt Lake Valley on September 7th. On October 16th of that year she became the plural wife of Carl John Capson. She had known him when she lived in Sweden and had gone to church meetings held in his barn.

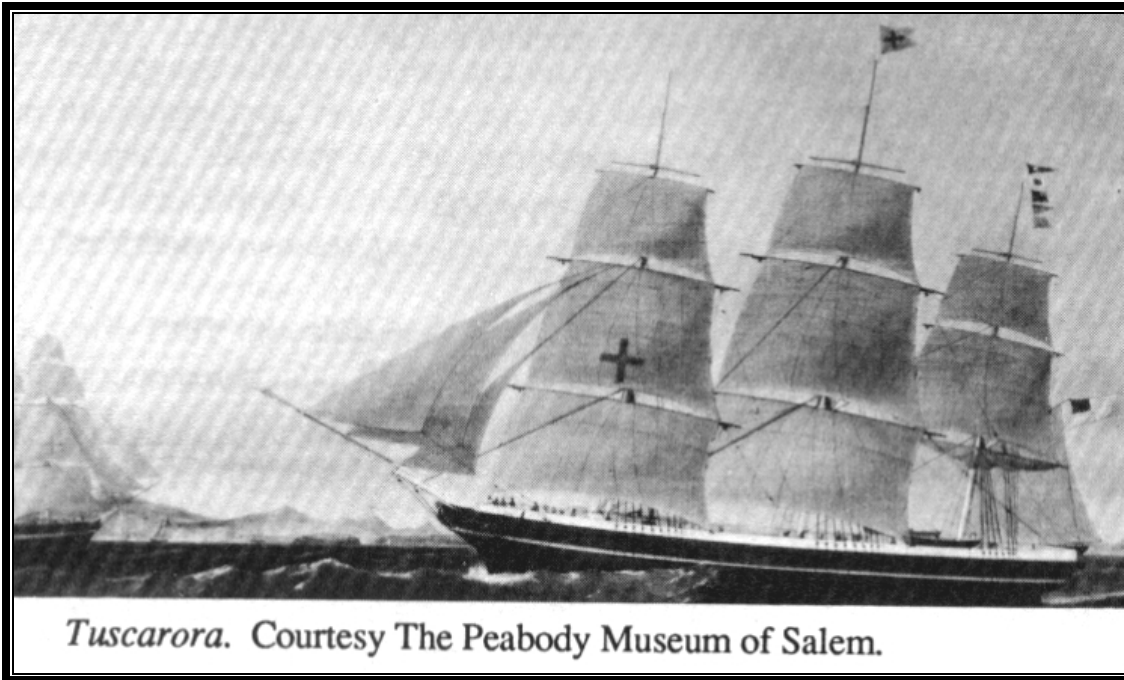
Bengt and Cecelia Malmgren were separated from their daughter, Caroline, until they were able to come to the Salt Lake Valley from Sweden on the ship Tuscarora.

Malmgren Journey – Bengt Nilsson Malmgren and Cecetia (Sissa) Svensson and son, Sven Peter. Sailed from Malmo, Sweden to the North Seas to Hull England. Took the train across England to Liverpool. Sailed on the Ship Turcarora to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.



Two hundred and ninety-eight of the passengers were from the Scandinavian Mission and the remainder from the British Mission. Elder Richard Harper was appointed president of the company, with Joseph Stapleton and C.M. Funck as his counselors. Saints who sailed in that vessel only contemplated going to the States that season, there to labor and procure means to enable them to cross the plains to Utah another year. After a pleasant voyage lasting about five weeks the Tuscarora arrived in Philadelphia on the Third of July. From that port most of the emigrants continued the journey by rail to Burlington, Iowa, where they scattered in search of employment.

When Bengt, Celia, and Sven Peter actually arrived in Utah is not certain, however there are some clues. Brigham Young suspended immigration to Utah in 1858 because the territory was under siege by Johnston's Army. There were several large companies that came west in 1859 leaving in late June and arriving mid-September. We know that one of the young women who shared passage on the Tuscarora with Sven and his family was among the 380 members of the Robert F. Neslen Company that started west on June 26, 1859. Since very little has been written about either the voyage of the Tuscarora or their subsequent travels to the midwest, it is difficult to learn of the route taken by the group during their travels in America. At best we can speculate. However, since this company arrived in Salt Lake City on September 15, 1859, and there is mention of Bengt Malmgren in the Deseret News (Vol. 9, p. 157) on September 20, 1859, I feel comfortable in suggesting his family was part of this Neslen Company. Jennie indicated that Swen had only been in Utah a few months when he returned with a team that aided her mother's trip across the plains. However, there is no oral history of the family staying for an extended time in Iowa. Since no Malmgrens appear in the U.S. Census until 1880 when they were counted in Levan, this source does not aid us in our quest.

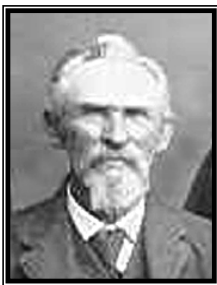
The R. F. Neslen Company traveled at a slow rate, owing to the largeness of the company and the lameness of the cattle arising from the fowls of foot evil. There was some concern their supplies would run low before they reached Salt Lake City, but relief parties sent to check on them reported that they were doing well.



There was a little excitement reported along the way. Apparently, while someone was trying to hitch a wild cow into a yoke, it began to bellow. This noise frightened five teams (ten teams by another account) and they ran away killing one man instantaneously and breaking the leg of one and wounding five others. One report indicates the man implicated in starting the stampede went to the Platte River to drown himself but couldn't find enough water to do the job. He was later persuaded to rejoin the group.

Another account of a man who had crossed as a young boy recounts one time being surrounded by a prairie fire, but they escaped without injury. He recalled that one day they encountered a great herd of buffalo which stopped the wagon train for some time. Several were killed for meat for the company. He also reported they came in contact with many tribes of Indians to whom they gave food and sometimes presents so they would be able to travel in peace with them.

The Deseret News account of the arrival of the company indicated that this company was composed of mostly Scandinavians. Nevertheless they came from many different nations, spoke different languages, and had different peculiarities and national characteristics. The company consisted of 56 wagons and enjoyed good health generally all the way. There were six deaths and three births. They lost 24 head of cattle from disease and lameness which was a comparatively small number for the crossing.

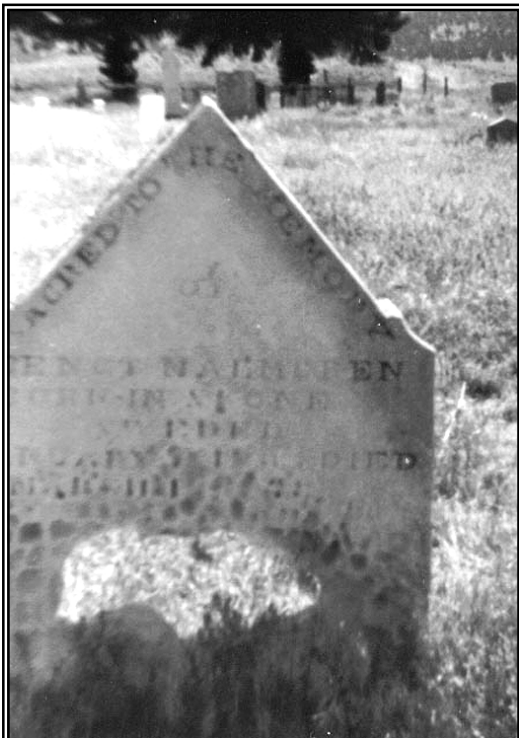
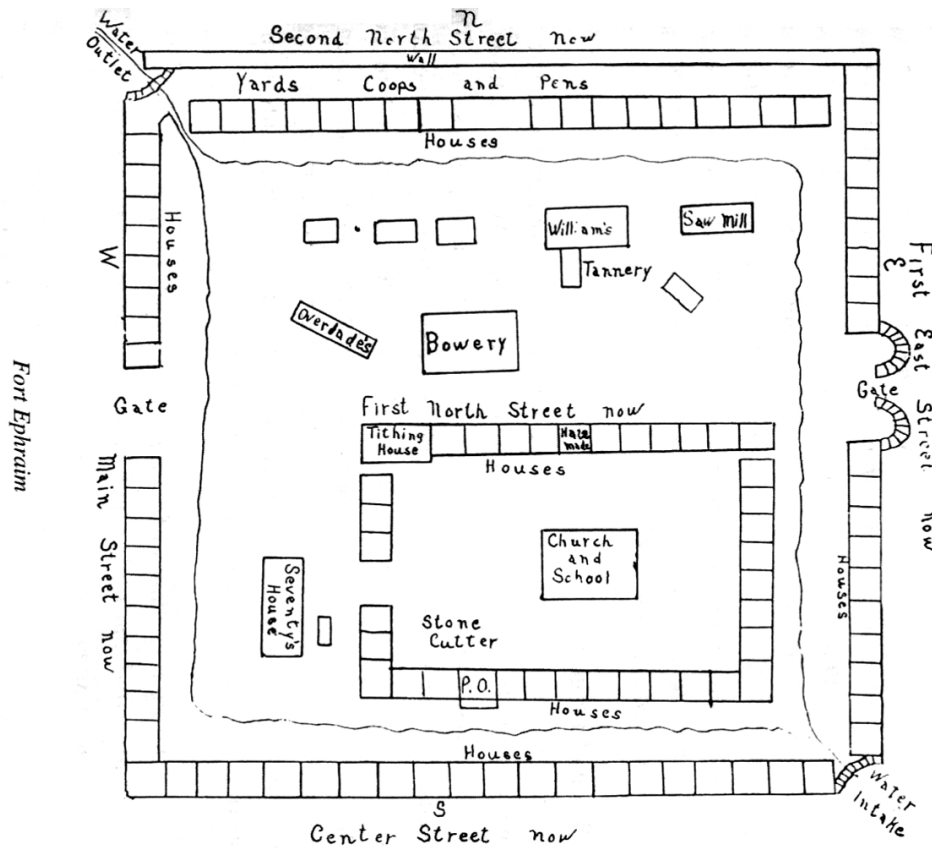

Niels Adler, the oldest son, also came to Utah but the family has no record of when he made the journey. Since Caroline was forced to leave Sweden in 1855, Bengt and Cecelia were undoubtedly anxious to move on to Utah at their earliest opportunity. With two years to work and outfit themselves, they should have been ready to make the journey in 1859 when relations between the Mormons and the U.S. government allowed for the movement of Saints to Utah again. Whatever the date, it was undoubtedly a happy reunion when Bengt, Cecelia, and their son, Sven, arrived in Salt Lake and were able to embrace their Caroline again.

Bengt and Cecelia were called by Brigham Young to help settle Ephraim in Sanpete County. Bengt was a carpenter and cabinet maker, skills very valuable when building a new home and a new town in which to live. The town had been settled in 1854 and had its own fort for

protection from the Indians. Following is a diagram of this fort. They spent their remaining days there, and went through the hardships that those pioneers endured.



Cecelia is buried in the Spring City Cemetery (just off present day Utah Highway 89). Bengt is buried in the old Pioneer Cemetery just north of Ephraim where there is an explanation of the origins of that cemetery. Originally the settlers in the surrounding area, including Ephraim, were buried in the Spring City cemetery. One day when the settlers were on their way to bury someone who had died in Ephraim, they came under Indian attack and couldn't get to the cemetery in Spring City. The people had to bury the person right where they were, and that became the Pioneer Cemetery that is there today.

Shown here is the original headstone for Bengt Nilsson Malmgren in the Pioneer Cemetery north of Ephraim, Utah. Notice the hole through the middle. It was replaced with a new marker by Keith Malmgren when he also replaced Cecelia Malmgren's marker in the Spring City Cemetery.

News Release on the May 30, 1957, crossing of the ship Tuscarora

DEPARTURE.---- The ship Tuscarora, Captain Dunlevy, bound for Philadelphia, cleared on the 29th, and sailed early on the morning of the 30th of May, having 547 souls of the Saints on board, of whom 298 were from the Scandinavian Mission; the remainder were from the British Mission. Elder Richard Harper was appointed president of the company, with Joseph Stapleton and C.M. Funck as his counselors. These Saints contemplate going only to the States this season, there to labor and procure means to enable them to cross the plains for Utah another year. May the blessings of a kind Providence ever hover around them, preserve them from disaster, and provide for comfortable homes on the other side of the water. As doves flock to their windows, so the Saints of the Most High are annually gathering to Zion. It causes us to rejoice with joy unspeakable, when we contemplate the blessings that will crown the heads of the faithful Saints of this dispensation of the fullness of times, in which the honest in heart who are willing to make a covenant with God by Sacrifice, are to be gathered together of all nations, and the scattered tribes of Israel are to return to the land of Judea. O that the Gentiles only knew in this their day the things that belong to their peace, but they are hid from their eyes, as the Prophet Isaiah predicted they would be, chapter XXIX 9th and 10th verses: Stay yourselves and wonder; cry ye out, and cry; they are drunken, but not with wine; they stagger but not with strong drink. For the Lord hath poured out upon you the spirit of deep sleep, and hath closed your eyes: the prophets and your rulers, the seers hath he covered. And the vision of all is become unto you as the words of a book that is sealed. (Millennial Star, 19:24. June 13, 1857, pp. 376-7).

"ONE HUNDRED AND FIRST COMPANY.--- Tuscarora, 547 Souls. The ship Tuscarora, Captain Dunlevy, sailed from Liverpool, Saturday, May 30th, 1857, having 547 of the Saints on board, of whom two hundred and ninety-eight were from the Scandinavian and the remainder from the British Mission. Elder Richard Harper was appointed president of the company, with Joseph Stapleton and C.M. Funck as his counselors. Saints who sailed in that vessel only contemplated going to the States that season, there to labor and procure means to enable them to cross the plains to Utah another year. After a pleasant voyage lasting about five week the Tuscarora arrived in Philadelphia on the third of July. From that port most of the emigrants continued the journey by rail to Burlington, Iowa, where they scattered in search of employment. (Millennial Star, Vol. XIX, pp. 376, 489)

"Saturday, 30 May 1857 -- The Ship Tuscarora sailed from Liverpool, England with 547 Saints, under the direction of Richard Harper. It arrived at Philadelphia July 3rd, and the emigrants continued by rail to Burlington, Iowa, in the vicinity of which most of them sought temporary employment." <CC, pp. 58-59>

"... The second division of the season's emigration from Scandinavia, Consisting of 286 souls, sailed from Copenhagen, May 20, 1857, en route for Utah. The company arrived at Liverpool, England, on the 24th, being accompanied that far by President Hector C. Haight. Together with a large number of emigrating Saints from British Mission, the Scandinavian emigrants sailed from Liverpool, on the 'Tuscarora,' early on the morning of May 30, 1857, under the leadership of Richard Harper...." INGABORG ANDERSDOTTER ROSEQUIST JONSSON

On February 5, 1817 in Malmo (Okiling) Sweden, the home of Anders Larsson and his wife Boel Andersdotter was blessed with the birth of a little daughter, their first child. She was given the name of Ingaborg Andersdotter.

She had five brothers, Anders, Lars who died in infancy, a second Lars who died as a child, Niels, and a third Lars who lived to adulthood. She had three sisters, Petronilla, Marna who died as a child, and Marna(Mary) who lived to adulthood. A daughter of Marna told me that her parents lived seven Swedish miles out of the town of Malmo. Little is known of their childhood.

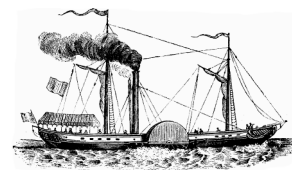
About 1842, Ingaborg married Peter Rosequist and their home was blessed with two children, a girl, Johanna, born July 1, 1843, and a boy, Andrew, born October 8, 1845. Peter died suddenly from cholera on August 20, 1850, forcing Ingaborg to work in a glove factory to support her two children ages seven and five. She married Truls Jonsson in 1852 and a year later a daughter, Elna, was born in 1853.

Ingaborg was contacted by LDS missionaries in 1857 and joined the Church with her children and her youngest sister, Marna (Mary). Marna was still living at home with her parents at the time and was told by her parents and her brothers that unless she renounced the Church they would disown her. This she refused to do and left home with only the clothes she had on her back and walked the seven Swedish miles to her sister Ingaborg's home. Marna left Sweden with her sister, Ingaborg, and her family in 1862 to join the saints in Utah. Marna fell in love with one of the young men in the company and they were married when they arrived in Salt Lake.

On the eve of April 13, 1862, Ingaborg, Truls Jonsson, Johannah 17, Anders (Andrew) age 16, sister Elna, age 8, and Ingaborg's sister Marna, with a company of saints started on their journey to America. Elder Soren Christoffersen, who was returning from his mission, was put in charge of the saints.

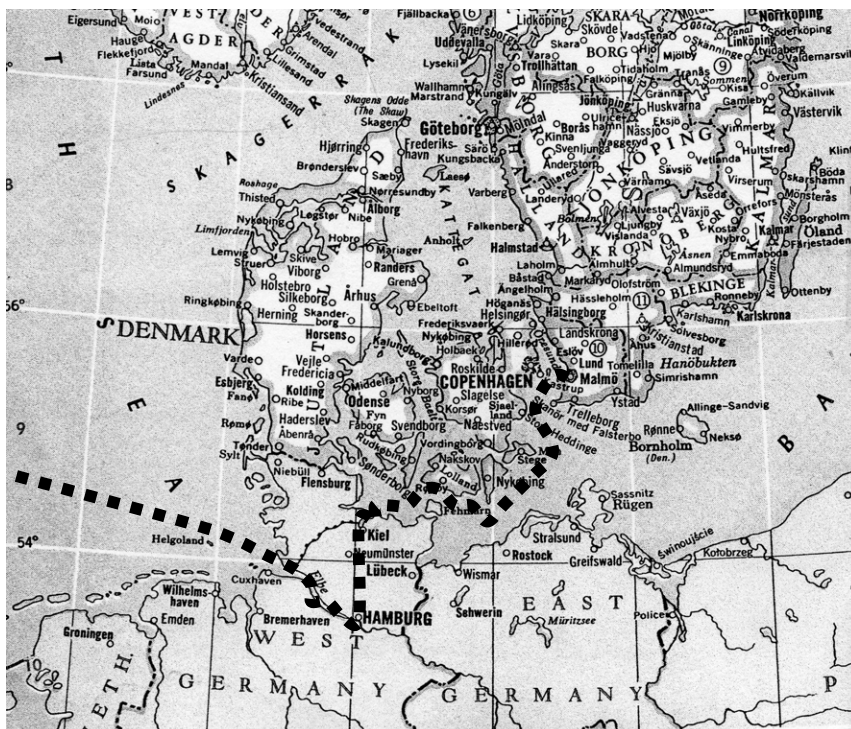
For several months, the preparation for this large emigration had been going on in the different conferences throughout Denmark, Sweden and Norway. The emigrating saints from the Jutland Conference in Denmark went directly to Hamburg, Germany, while most of those from the other conferences first gathered in Copenhagen, Denmark, and thence made their way to Hamburg in different companies. The steamer 'Albion' sailed from Copenhagen, Denmark, April 14, 1862, with about 500 emigrating saints on board, and after a

successful voyage, arrived at Kiel, Germany at 8' clock a.m. on April 15th.



After spending about two hours in transferring the baggage of the emigrants to the railway cars, the company left Kiel on an extra train for Altona, Germany, where they arrived at 1:30 p.m. President John Van Cott, assisted by other brethren, proceeded immediately to read the list of the emigrating names and bring them on board the ships 'Electric' and 'Athenia' which, like the 'Humbolt' and 'Franklin,' were anchored in the Elbe River off Hamburg. On Friday, April 18, the ship 'Electric' with Captain H.J. Johansen sailed from Hamburg, Germany, with 336 emigrating saints bound for Utah in the charge of Elder Soren Christoffersen from Manti, Utah. The emigrants were from Lolland and other conferences in Denmark, and from Norrkoping Conference in Sweden. The original plan

was that the Norrköping Conference contingent should have sailed on the 'Athenia,' but this arrangement was changed so that some of them sailed on the 'Electric' instead .

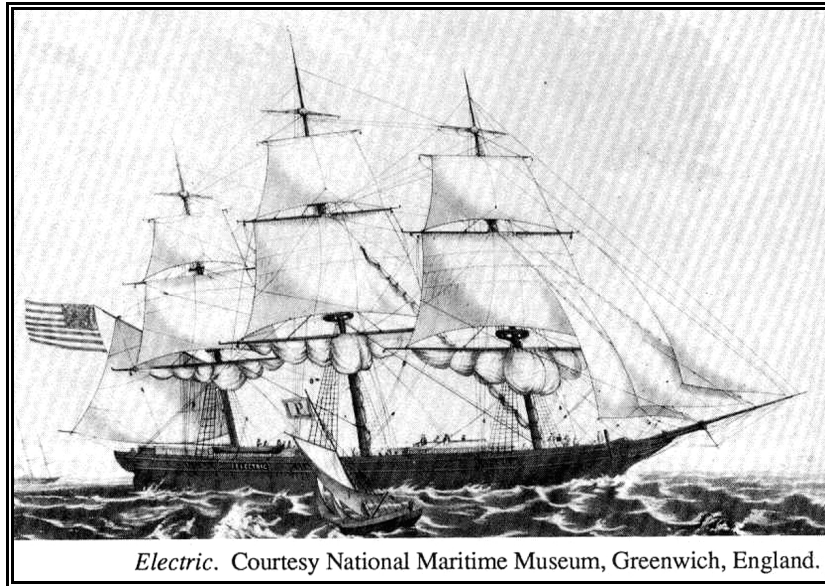


Rosequist Journey – Ingeborg Anderson Rosequist and daughters Johanna, Elna (Mary Ellen), son Anders (Andrew) and sister Marna (Mary) sailed from Malmo, Sweden to Kiel, Germany, took the train to Hamburg, Germany then on to New York City on the ship ELECTRIC.

The 'Electric' sailed down the Elbe River to the mouth of the river arriving there about noon. Here the anchor was cast near the ship 'Athenia' which had another company of emigrating saints on board. At this time there were 335 emigrants on board the 'Electric' and 486 on the 'Athenia.' The 'Electric' lifted anchor April 22 and sailed to a point off the coast of Hanover, where anchor was again dropped and the ship waited for the wind to change. Favored at last with a good wind the 'Electric' made the final start for America, April 25, sailing out into the North Sea. Before sailing, President John Van Cott came on board and assisted in organizing the emigrating saints, who were divided into nine districts, in each of which there were from 25 to 40 persons.



On the 31st of May, one of the sisters gave birth to a child who received the name of Electric Sophia Sorensen.

During the voyage a number of the emigrants died. They buried seventeen persons before they reached New York. There was no rain, they were unable to get fresh water, and their supply became very foul before reaching shore.

They found there were several couples in the company who were engaged and deemed advisable that they marry considering the long journey before them. On the 20th of April, 1862, there were twelve couples who presented themselves for marriage.

The ship was divided into two decks with a row of single bunks on each side and a double row along the center. Most of them were Scandinavians. The young unmarried men were in the forepart, and unmarried ladies in the hind part of the ship.

A number of meetings were held on board during the voyage, and union and harmony existed among the emigrants during the entire journey.

Their food consisted of pork, peas, beans, pearl barley, rice, prunes, syrup, vinegar, pepper, salt, coffee, tea, sugar, butter, rye, bread, flour, sea biscuits, and salt herring. The special treat for each day of the week was Sunday- sweet soup, Monday- pea soup, Tuesday and Wednesday- rice, Thursday- pea soup, Friday- Barley Mush, Saturday- salt herring and potatoes. Hot cakes were made for the sick who could not eat sea biscuits and wheat bread for the older people. They soaked the sea biscuits in water or tea from 8 to 12 hours to make them softer and more palatable. The sick were served twice a day with porridge made from barley, rice, and sago.

They held a council meeting every night at 5:00 p.m. Each morning signals were given to arise by accordions or clarinets. Dancing and programs were part of their amusements.

The ship arrived safely in New York and the emigrants landed at Castle Gardens on Friday, June 6, 1862. Here the doctor's examination took place and they were pronounced in good health.

Here the company met the saints who had crossed the Atlantic on the ship *Athenia* who landed on the 7th. Both companies left New York June 9 by extra railroad train arriving at Albany at 9 p.m. From there the journey continued by train via Syracuse, Rochester, Niagara, Detroit, and Chicago to Quincy, Illinois, then by steamboat called *West Wind* and arrived at Florence, Nebraska, June 9th at 10:00 p.m.

On June 19, the emigrants who sailed across the Atlantic in the four ships mentioned (*The Humboldt*, *Franklin*, *Electric*, and *Athenia*) came together in Florence. From which place those who had not the means wherewith to equip themselves for the journey across the plains were assisted by the teams sent there from the Salt Lake Valley by the Church. While those who had means wherewith to help themselves were organized into two independent companies. Elder Christian A. Madsen was put in charge of 264 persons in his company, including Ingeborg, her children Johanna, Anders, and Elna, her sister Marna, and her husband Truls.

Before leaving Florence on July 7, a severe tornado struck accompanied by rain. Two of the brethren were killed and Joseph Young was severely hurt. Tents and wagons were damaged. They waited at Florence a little over a month for teams to come and help them.

The company left Florence, Nebraska, July 14, 1862, to commence their journey across the plains with Christian A. Madsen in charge. There were now 264 persons, 40 wagons, 14 horses, 17 oxen, 99 cows, 27 heifers, 7 calves, 6 dogs, 10 chickens, 22 tents, 32 cooking stoves, 5 revolvers, and 37 rifles. The journey was via Elkhorn River, Rattle Snake Creek, Fort Laramie, upper Platte bridge, Devils Gate, South Pass, and Green River to Salt Lake City. They camped wherever they could find grass for their animals and water. The women cooked over fires made of sunflower stems and buffalo chips gathered through the day, and most of them walked the entire distance, the men carrying the women across the streams.

They arrived in Salt Lake September 23, 1862, after traveling 71 days across the plains. They spent the night in Salt Lake and many friends came to visit the saints that night. The next morning Ingeborg and her children left for Tooele, Utah, to stay with friends and get work.

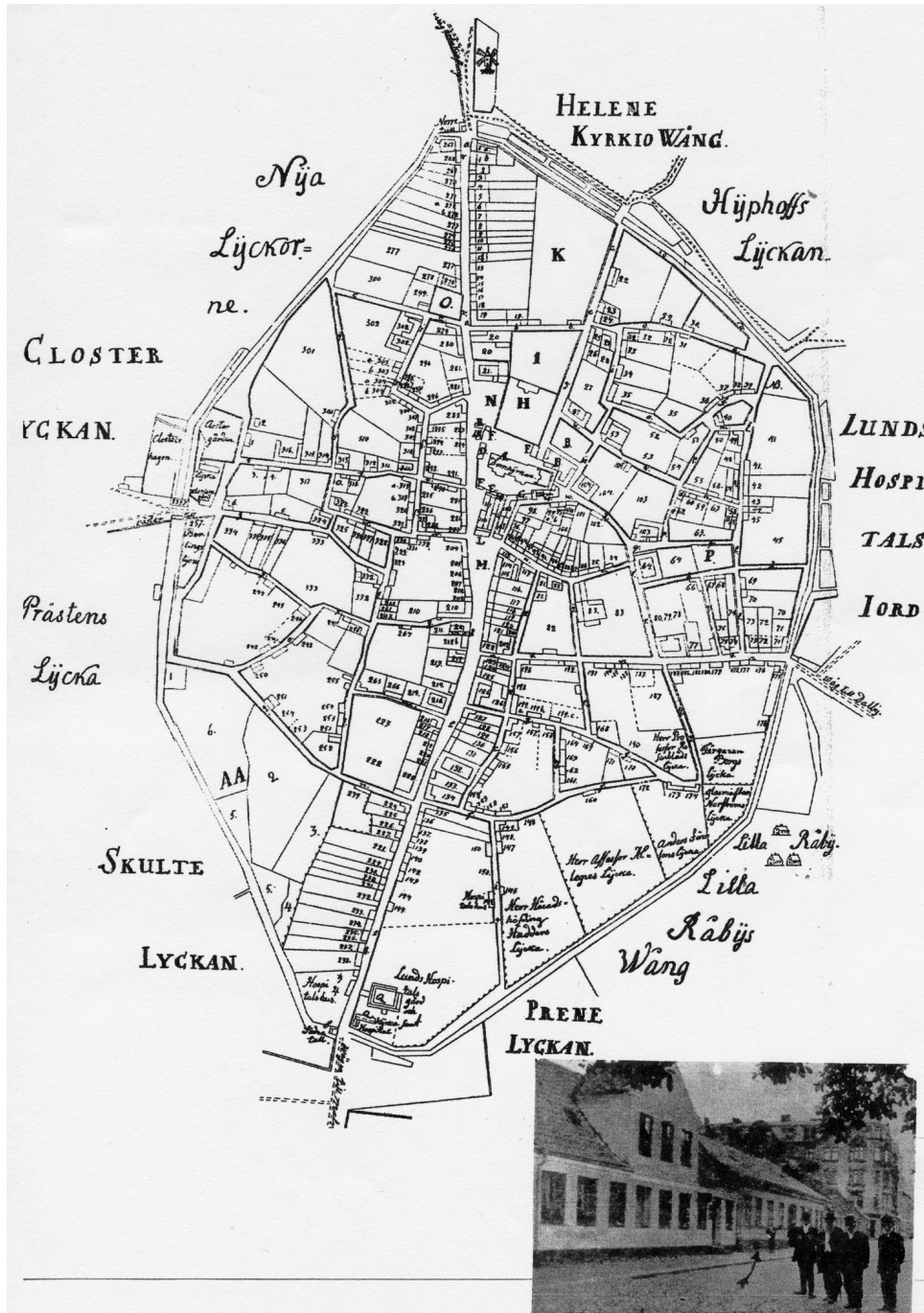
Andrew married Amelia Turkelson and had a daughter Emma Eveline. Later, he married Mary Peterson and they had a son named Seymour. Andrew settled in Levan in 1868 when his sister



On August 3, 1855, Castle Garden, under lease to the State of New York, was opened as an immigrant landing depot. Only a short time before Castle Garden had been joined to the mainland by fill and fenced off from the rest of the Battery. For the first time, the bewildered immigrants were protected from the unsavory characters who had roamed the open wharves at will to take advantage of gullible newcomers. Here generally reliable information about boarding houses, travel routes, and fares could be obtained. Needed medical attention and an honest currency exchange were provided as well as a chance for employment. Between 1855 and 1889, more than eight million immigrants -- two out of every three persons immigrating to the United States in this period -- passed through the Garden.

Johanna and her husband Sven Peter Malmgren moved there. Elna (Mary Ellen) lived in Grantsville and married Amos McBride.

In the year 1866, Great-grandmother Rosequist moved to Ephriam and found that her daughter and her husband had moved to Circleville. Word was brought to Johanna that her mother was in Ephriam so she returned and found her ill. She cared for her until her death on July 14, 1866. She was only 49 years old when she died, but she had accomplished her greatest wish to come to Zion and see her children happily married. She was buried in Ephriam.

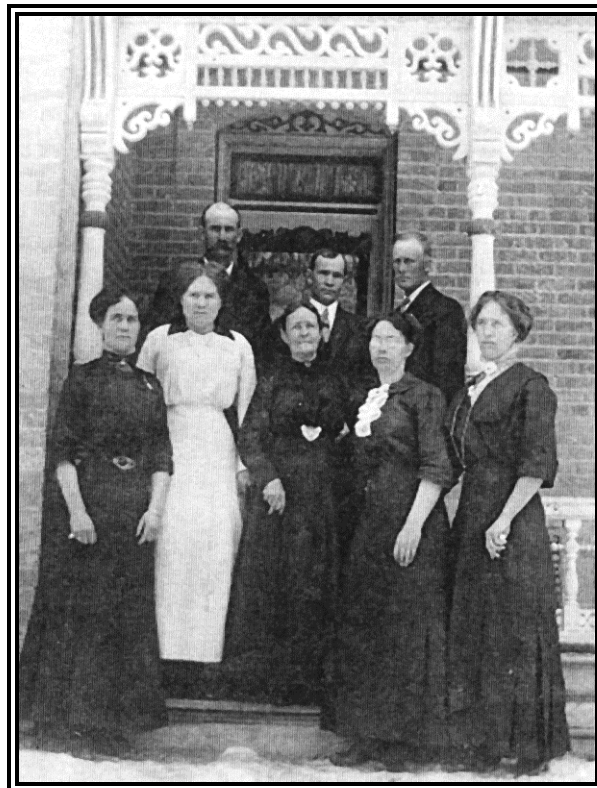

HISTORY OF SVEN PETER AND JOHANNA ROSEQUIST MALMGREN

Written by their youngest daughter, Jennie "V" Malmgren Hobbs, February 23, 1937

Rewritten by Joyce Hardy Jones, April 2001 and Genan T. Anderson, June 2002

Both Sven Peter Bengtsson Malmgren and Johanna Rosequist were born in the beautiful City of Malmo, Sweden. Father, Sven (known in the United States as Swen), and his family were introduced to the LDS Church in 1852 and left Sweden in 1857, the year Mother and her family met LDS missionaries. Mother had begun working beside her mother in the glove factory when she was nine-years-old in about 1852 and worked there for ten years until she left with her family to emigrate to Utah. Father worked in the same factory until his family left Sweden in 1857 and even lived on the same block in Malmo, but the two never met in Sweden.

Father came to the United States with his family in 1857 on the ship Tuscarora. When he and his parents actually arrived in Utah was never recorded.

In 1857, when Mother was fourteen years of age, she and her mother heard the LDS missionaries and understood the truth of the gospel and were converted. Grandmother Ingeborg and her children were baptized against the wishes of her husband and his family. The missionaries were always welcome at their home. Grandmother and Mother were so anxious to come to Utah that they continued to work at the glove factory that they might save enough money to bring them to Utah.

On the eve of April 13, 1862, Mother aged 17, her mother, stepfather, brother Anders (Andrew) age 16, sister Elena, age 8, and Aunt Marna, with a company of saints started on their journey to America.

July 1st Mother had her 18th birthday in Florence, Nebraska. While on the trip she met Father who had arrived in Utah with his parents a few years previous. He had acquired a team and wagon and had been sent by the Church as a teamster to help the emigrants from Wyoming to Salt Lake on the last part of their journey. This was one of two such trips he had made. It was common for these teamsters to bring a little brown sugar with them with which to entice a young lady to ride next to them. Mother was a beautiful girl and was proffered many rides by would-be suitors who drove the wagons. She always accepted offers for rides which were kindly given to her mother. Anthon Lund, a member of the company, had asked Mother to be his plural wife but she refused. A romance had started with Swen which ended in a marriage two years later.



They arrived in Salt Lake September 23, 1862 and spent the night in Salt Lake. Many friends came to visit the saints that night. Among them was mother's girlhood chum Christena, who later married Niels Stol of Brigham City. She had emigrated two years previous and they were to see each other the next day, but the next morning Grandmother and her children left for Tooele, Utah, to stay with friends and get work. Mother and her friend, not knowing where each other were, did not meet again for over 50 years as each of them married and did not know the names of the husbands. They found each other through the Brigham City Peach Day celebration and what a happy reunion as they talked over their lives.

In 1863, Mother came to Salt Lake to work and there met Father again. Father had acquired some 15 acres of land at State Street and 33rd South which he sold for oxen, a wagon, cattle, and supplies. They went to Ephraim where Grandpa and Grandma Malmgren had been called to settle and were married there on April 24, 1864.

At this time Black Hawk and his tribe were very hostile, and when the Saints would go for supplies, they would go in companies, some of the men staying home to guard and care for the women and children. While Father was away for supplies their first child, a son, was born. He lived just ten days and passed away, Father arriving home just before he was buried. They suffered hardships and saw many of their friends killed and injured. They would go in companies to their fields to work.



One day after working in the fields they saw a band of Indians riding out of the mountains towards the fields of Fort Ephraim. All the women and children who could be notified were rushed to the home of Peter Thomson who lived in a two story rock house. Here they watched from an upstairs window. The driver of a wagon by the name of Andrew Whitlock who had gone to Manti to get a doctor lady by the name of Maria Snow and an L.C. Larson, who came back from Manti with him, rode into this attack. They had a spirited team of race horses and they were able to escape, but an arrow was lodged in the left shoulder of Mr Whitlock and one of the horses was struck by a bullet, but the animal struggled into town and into Whitlock's yard. It dropped dead as soon as the harness was removed.

All the available men were out trying to protect their herds. When the Indians approached town, they turned their horses west into the fields. Here on the edge of Ephraim they found Martin Kuhre, his wife Hansine and Elizabeth Peterson, a girl of 17, picking up potatoes. Their young son two years old was with them in the big field but they had made a bed for him under some bushes near by, and he had gone to sleep. Soren Sorenson was there also. Black Hawk with a group of braves rode toward them. Sorenson had known the chief intimately before the war. Black Hawk had visited at the Sorenson home as a young Indian and had often been invited to eat with them. Sorenson walked up to Black Hawk and began talking to him but was horrified to see the other Indian kill Mr. and Mrs. Kuhre not 50 yards away. Black Hawk permitted Sorenson to escape without even taking his team. Then the Indians rode on and drove about 200 cattle toward the mouth of the canyon. The settlers pursued them and fought for several hours to protect their cattle. Later they found the naked body of Bill Thorpe who had been killed. Louis Larson, a cousin of father's, was wounded, but the Indians got away with the cattle and some horses.

That evening Father, with a party of others, went into the field to look for the Kuhres thinking they were all dead but they were happy to find the baby alive. When he had awakened, he had crept over to the side of his dead mother. He was crying on her breast and his clothing was saturated with her blood. He is alive today. His name is William D. Kuhre and is a resident of Sandy, Utah. Mother and Father had the pleasure of meeting him at a Black Hawk encampment at Ephraim before Father's death.

The following day after this incident a company went to look for three missing men who were working in the canyon. They found the bodies of William T. Hite and Benjamin Black badly mutilated. Elderly Soren Jespersion had been captured and tortured before he died. The savages had hacked him with his own axe. After this, every grown boy and man was drafted into what they called the standing army. They took turns staying up in the rock fort watching for Indians. Whenever they saw something suspicious, one of them beat a bass drum and then all the women and children would rush for the fort. The fort contained about three acres of land.

The fall of 1865, Father and Mother were called with other saints by the Church to Piute County to help settle the town of Circleville, Utah. Twenty-one families had been called to go to Circleville in 1864 so they were going to support the original settlers. They built a small log house, barn, and corrals, and were very happy in their new home; but the Indians still continued to steal their cattle and destroy their property. Four men were killed that fall, and the men were compelled to take turns guarding the place. They built a small fort about the size of a city lot. A few homes were built outside of the fort and Father and Mother's was one of them, building it before the fort was started. While Father would guard for Indians and go on trips for supplies, Mother would stay alone nights with only a large box to push in front of the door to keep out the Indians.



One night when the Indians had been very hostile and Father was away, friends coaxed mother to go home, get her bedding, and return to spend the night with them. But, when she arrived home she decided to remain home alone, rather than take her bedding back and sleep on the floor as they did not have an extra bed and bedding. She put the box by the door and just got to sleep when her friends came to see if she had arrived home safely. A few weeks later on May 21, another baby boy came to bless their home whom they named Swen Edwin.

The many attacks in the spring of 1866 caused Brigham Young on May 1st to advise the settlers of Sanpete, Piute, and Sevier Counties to collect themselves into bodies of not less than 150 men, arm themselves well and take measures as necessary to secure their lives and property from the Indians to guard their cattle by bodies of armed men going to work in the fields to mills or canyons and to build strong forts. This meant abandonment of many little settlements, and the ruin of many improvements the pioneers had just completed.

Manti, Mt. Pleasant, Moroni, Gunnison, Richfield, and Circleville became concentration points, and their populations swelled from the abandoned villages. So heavy had the villages loss in horses and oxen through Indian raids that some of the people could not move their belongings without the aid of teams and men from the larger settlements. Salina had been abandoned on April 21st after many Indian raids. One occurred at Fort Sanford, a log stockade on the Sevier River between Panguitch and Circleville. Companies from Iron County had come across the mountains early that spring to help the settlers who were there. When the news of the raid reached the little village of Circleville, the people were thrown into consternation. The men met to discuss the situation. They wanted to prevent a recurrence of the attack which had cost the town four lives the preceding fall. The settlers suspected the Piutes encamped in the vicinity. These Indians had claimed loyalty to the whites but they had not been wholly trusted. The report had come that two of these Piutes had shot a man.

The whites decided to arrest the Indians. They reached the Indian camp that evening and formed a cordon around it. In the hopes of avoiding resistance, two of the settlers went among the Piutes and talked to them. They asked the Indians to come to the meeting house and listen to a message that had just been received. One young brave refused to go and fired at the white men. They killed him. The others went to the town and were imprisoned in the meetinghouse. The message from Fort Sanford was read to them, and they were told they would be kept under guard for some time. Showing signs of unruliness, the Indians were deprived of their weapons. The next evening some of the braves broke out.

To understand what happened then, a reader should visualize the position of the white people. They lived in a hamlet far from any town of size, surrounded by a wilderness of rugged peaks and forests. Camping around in that wilderness were savages who had proved their cruelty in bloody attacks on the town only a few months before. Other settlements were being attacked throughout the territory. Turning the meetinghouse into a prison had weakened the defenses of the white settlers. They had, in fear of attacks, built most of their houses in fort style around the meetinghouse. Thus the enemy was within occupying the most sheltered place while other bodies of the foe might be lurking outside. If the prisoners escaped they would probably return and seek vengeance. Some had already broken out and overcome two guards. The rest were very hostile. In desperation, the white men killed the Indians saving only the children. Eleven Indians were held prisoner in a cellar and were killed one at a time. Father was on duty that night but did not participate in the killing. He never liked to recall memories of it as he said it seemed such a terrible thing to him and was always glad he had refused to help with the murder; but through fear, they were forced to do it. Circleville was attacked no more for awhile. Militia came from less troubled areas and kept watch over the town for sometime. Settlers from Marysvale had left their community and come to Circleville,



strengthening the town. On the same day the Piutes were killed in Circleville, more trouble occurred near Panguitch, and a company of whites were ambushed near Marysvale. The weaker settlements in Summit, Wasatch, Sanpete, Sevier, Piute, Beaver, Iron, Kane and Washington were abandoned to the stronger towns.

By June of 1866, most of their cattle had been driven off by the Indians, so they were advised to abandon Circleville or they might be killed. So the entire group of thirty families left with what they could take, leaving their homes, crops, and grain fields ready to be harvested to seek homes where there was less danger. They had suffered so much that none of that group ever returned to harvest their crops or get their possessions. A troop from Utah County helped the settlers cross the Sevier River which was swollen high. Some of them went back to Fort Ephraim reaching there July 4th. Others went to Beaver, Millard County and points farther north. Substantial forts were built and all the stock in the above named counties was gathered and guarded. Mother and Father and their month-old baby were among the group

who went to Fort Ephraim to live. Here they found Grandmother Ingeborg very ill, and she passed away July 14, 1866.

Overtures of peace were made with the Indians whenever opportunity afforded but

were defiantly refused. Notwithstanding every precaution, the energy and faithfulness of the militia troops in service, the enemy lying secreted would occasionally succeed in making a dash on some weak point and capture a herd of stock. Thus it continued through the summer, while all that part of the territory for 300 miles in extent was paralyzed. So many men were in service in the heart of the war area that little grain was raised, few improvements were made. Mills and ranches were burned, herds of cattle and horses were lost. Despite these conditions, President Brigham Young kept his head and encouraged the pioneers to feed the Indians rather than use bullets.

Regardless of the trouble, the war-stricken counties succeeded in raising their quota of teams to send eastward to aid the emigrants. That summer the settlers in Sanpete, Sevier, and Piute Counties promptly forwarded their quota of 500 teams that had been asked by their leaders to help the emigrants for the Church. I remember Father telling of wearing his shoes out on those trips; and when he arrived in Salt Lake, he had no shoes or money to buy any.

In 1867, Blackhawk, the Indian war chief quit fighting and started working for peace between the Indians and the settlers. "He visited all of the places in peace that he'd visited before on the war path. He asked for forgiveness in the Mormon congregations who voted on the issue, and for the most part, unanimously decided to forgive Blackhawk." (Christofferson, Megan. April 1998. Utah's Blackhawk War: Cultures in Conflict. BYU Magazine, pg 5).

On April 20, 1868 a baby girl was born named Amanda Josephine. In July, 1868, Mother and Father and their two small children left to help colonize Levan, Utah. Andrew Rosquist, Mother's brother, moved to Levan at the same time. Their first home there was a cellar. Three children were born while living in this cellar. A daughter Johanna Cecelia was born June 28, 1870 and lived until July 4, 1870. Then a son Henry was born July 22, 1871.

Father began making adobes for a home and built a two-room adobe house with a fireplace and mud roof. The muddy drippings would streak the white-washed walls and windows as well as creating mud puddles on the packed dirt floor, despite buckets and pans set out to catch the drippings. There was meager homemade furniture, wall-to-wall beds in one room, a homemade table with benches, a cupboard and a large storage bin for flour and sugar (protection from mice) in the other room. Outside was a storage cellar to keep the milk cold, a wash house, a rain barrel, and a pit privy within walking distance of the house. After I was born, a brick home was built to take the place of the adobe one.

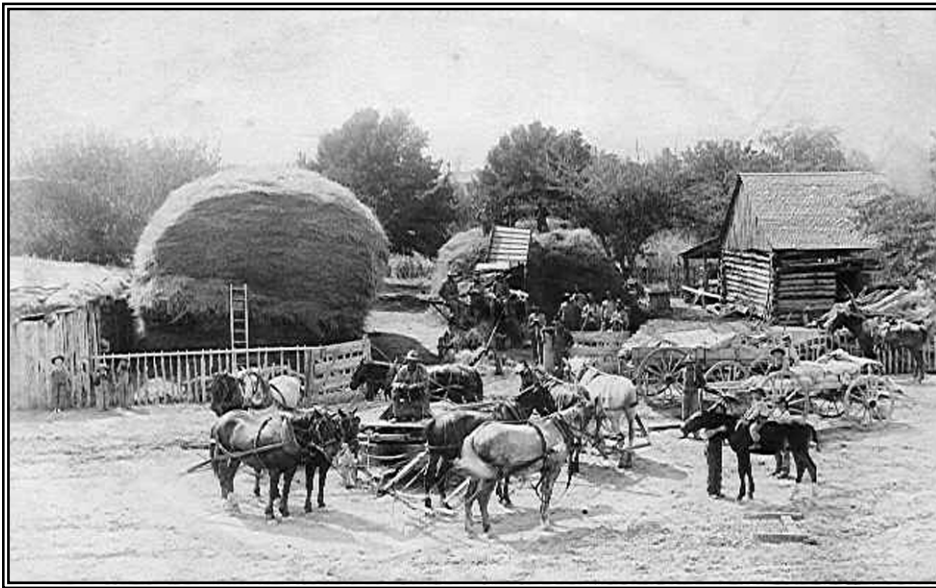


They homesteaded some land north of Levan where a small house and a barn were built and part of the time was spent living there. Their lives were happy after that as the community was like one large family. On January 29, 1874, a daughter Rosetta Ingeborg was born. She passed away August 9, 1875. On August 7, 1876, Emma Ottomina was born. December 7, 1878, Mary Rosa Nell was born. January 17, 1881, Herman Albert was born. He passed away December 24, 1882. April 11, 1883, Minnie Amelia was born. May 11, 1886, Oscar Lawrence was born. December 4, 1888, Jennie" V" was born.

When I was two-years-old I contracted scarlet fever and was very sick. The neighbor, Brother William Tunbridge, the town doctor, who gathered herbs and made medicine, came and sat up at night with Mother to help keep cold packs on me through the crisis of fever. Amanda was visiting Mother one day as I was getting better. As she went to leave, I hung on to Amanda and cried so hard Mother was impressed that the two sisters were to be parted. Mother thought that I was going to die because I had been so sick with the scarlet fever and three of Mother's children had died very

young. It turned out that Amanda contracted typhoid fever from the ditch water and died. Mother could not be consoled over Amanda's early death. She grieved so much that one day Amanda came to her as she was ironing and told her not to feel so bad. She said that she was happy and taking care of the four small children Mother had buried before I was born. This experience helped Mother accept Amanda's death.

Water was scarce in Levan. There was no city water or wells. Water came originally from Pigeon Creek in one ditch from the canyon to the bottom of the town. This had to be used for culinary purposes as well as to water the animals and gardens. Later, the water was diverted from the creek and conveyed to the settlement in canals and then divided into smaller streams so the housewives wouldn't need to carry the water so far and the water could more easily be used on the gardens and in the fields. The youngest child was given the chore to haul water for drinking, washing dishes and washing clothes from the ditch across the street and put it in a rain barrel by the house. We stored our water in a rain barrel by the house. When it rained, the ditch water became so muddy we would have to let it settle most of the day and then carefully lift out the clear water off the top so as not to "rile" it. Sometimes there would be as much as one foot of mud in the bottom of the barrel to rinse out before filling it again. In the winter we had to go to the creek a block away and break the ice to get water. We rushed in the morning to draw their water before the cows and horses came to drink and dirtied it. This lack of clean water brought early death to many, including my sister, Amanda, who contracted typhoid fever from contaminated water.

When we had thrashers it meant days of cooking and preparations of foods for Mother. Each of the women in the community tried to out-do their neighbors in the quantity and quality of food prepared for the threshers. Mother baked pies, cakes, and bread and prepared large quantities of vegetables, fried chicken, baked beans and beef roasts. She made the best wheat beer in town. The men never left her table hungry.

When the meal bell sounded, the men swept the threshing dust off with a broom, gathered around wash tubs and scrubbed up before the meal. One of the children's jobs was to keep the flies

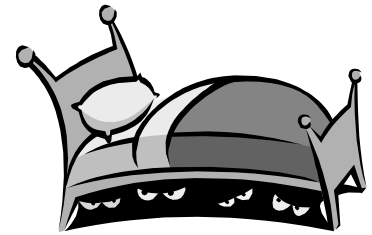
off the table by waving a willow branch before and during the meal. They had to eat outside because there were so many men to feed.

In the evening all the neighbors would come and eat the leftover food since there was no way to keep it from spoiling. There was no refrigeration.

Without refrigeration, chickens and game birds were eaten the day they were killed. Beef and pork were killed, cured (frozen in the winter) and shared with neighbors to ensure a supply of fresh meat. Vegetables were eaten from the garden and stored in earthen pits or cellars. Grain was threshed, stored in wooden granaries and traded or sold for flour, cereals, other foods and even clothes. When extra things for the house were needed, we would fill a sack with wheat and take it to the store in an express wagon and exchange it for things we needed.

When the harvest of the field crops and garden was finished and the grain in the bin and the plowing completed, Father and my brothers Ed, Henry, and later Lawrence would haul the winter supply of wood from the canyons. It would take two days for a trip and several trips had to be made each fall since they used wood entirely for heating and cooking. While the men of the family were gathering wood, mother and we girls would do the milking, feed the chickens, along with sewing clothes, and knitting socks and gloves.

Every fall when the corn and wheat was harvested the family would take out all the mattresses in the house, empty them, and refill them with corn husks and straw. The family all slept on mattresses made of striped pillow ticking sewed in a shape of a sack and the size required to fit the bed. This sack was then stuffed tightly with corn husks or straw or both and the ends sewed together. This took a



whole day and was lots of fun to do together. Lots of stuffing was needed because the fibers broke down with use during the year and became very flat, lumpy and hard. We stuffed them so full that at first it was hard to stay on them during the night. As we used them during the winter, the mattresses eventually became flattened and more comfortable. The mattresses were laid within a frame laced with rope, canvas stripping or boards.

The carpet in the front room was pulled up each fall as well. The carpet was homemade from strips of worn clothing that were dyed, cut up and sewn together by hand (before they had a machine) and rolled in balls. They were taken to a weaver and made into three-foot wide strips on a loom threaded with carpet warp, then sewn together to fit the room. The carpet was carried outside, hung on the line, and then we children beat the dirt out of it with a wire ship. We gathered up the old straw, swept and scrubbed the old floor and mop boards, then spread new straw evenly over the floor.

Father then tacked down the carpet to the floor over the straw. They first tacked one side and pulled, and pulled, and pulled to get it tight. Mother liked it tight. Sometimes we'd get it done and it didn't satisfy Mother so we would have to take it back up and stretch it again. When this happened, Father used Swedish swear words I didn't understand.



Father had a wonderful orchard. The Early Harvest apples were the first to ripen. He also had Early Junes, Codlen, Winter Pear Main, Winesap, Spitzenberg, Russel Porter, and Rhode Island Greening. There were also winter and summer pear trees, a pie cherry, and peach trees, currents, raspberries and gooseberries. We would put the apples and pears in a pit for the winter and in the evenings enjoy a pan full of apples and pears as we played games and sang songs and studied our lessons. We also dried apples so we had wonderful dried apple pie with whipped cream for Sunday dinner.

Mother and Father always taught their children honesty and dependability. We were taught to pray as soon as we were old enough to say the words and kneel at my Mother's knee. Every Saturday night all our clothes were ready for Sunday and church. If we didn't have black shoe polish, we would use soot from the lid of the stove to polish our only pair of shoes.

Saturday night also meant bathes for everyone. We would heat water and take turns bathing in the round tub in front of the kitchen stove. There was often debate over who would bathe first in the clean water and it was settled with drawing of straws. The one with the longest straw was first in the tub. A dipper or two of hot water was added for each successive person.

All the ladies in town tried to get the first sheets on the line on Monday morning. Washing had to be done on Monday or it upset the whole week. We made our own laundry soap from animal fat and lye. The water was so hard we would heat it on the stove in a boiler. We used lye to raise the scum. The hard water scum was skimmed off with a spoon and then we added the soap to the water. The white clothes were scrubbed on the scrubbing board. After scrubbing, we would boil the clothes on the stove several minutes, lift them from the boiler with a stick into a tub of cold water to rinse, dip them into the bluing tub, and then hang them up to dry on the line outside. In the winter, the clothes hung outside would freeze so stiff they would stand alone.

Tuesday was ironing day. Ironing was done by placing a covered board between two chair backs and heating heavy irons on the stove. We kept at least two and sometimes three irons on the stove heating to always have a hot iron ready to use. Sometimes pads were put on the table and it was used to iron on. You took a clamp with a wooden handle and picked up the iron. Everything was ironed: sheets, pillow cases, table clothes, the men's shirts, and full skirt dresses with tucks and ruffles. Mother was very fussy. The irons had to be wiped off thoroughly before being used in case they had any soot on them that might dirty the clean, dampened clothes. Each piece of clothing was handled ten times in the process of washing and ironing. It was sorted, scrubbed, boiled, rinsed, blued, hung on the clothesline, gathered from the line, dampened, ironed, and put away.

Although they had but very little schooling, Mother and Father were great readers. I remember father subscribed to the weekly Swedish newspaper, called the *Kerrerrpondenten*. When he had finished reading it, it was relegated to the outhouse, down in the lot, to be used along with the *Sears-Roebuck Catalogue*, as toilet tissue.

Mother and Father were always happy when they could be doing something for others.

Mother was a small woman. (Beth has a child's rocker Grandma Malmgren sat in as she rocked her when she was a small child.) She loved flowers and raised lots of them. Her favorite flower was portulaca. In later years, she kept her hands busy doing beautiful handwork. Mother did beautiful fancy work and crocheting for her family. She was never idle. She had a hearty laugh and everyone loved her. She had the ability to make each of her grandchildren think that he or she was her very favorite one.



Electricity did not come to Levan until 1912. The only form of lighting before then was from candles, which we made ourselves from bees wax and mutton tallow, and from coal oil lamps. The lamps had a holder for the coal oil, a cloth wick that was lighted, and a glass cover that was placed on top to give off light. By these forms of lighting we did the evening's work, read, and played. We played many games and cards. Mother loved to play Five-Hundred with playing cards. We also had to do our school studies by these lamps. Seeing to read and write by a coal oil lamp was not an easy task. Only two or three could get close enough to the lamp to

benefit by the dim light. One of the children had to clean the black soot out of the glass lamp covers each day and shine them with newspaper ready for evening.

Mother was the first in Levan (June 1910) to have a sewing machine which Father purchased for \$99.00 and a yoke of cattle.

Mother and Father's greatest joy was when they had their children and grandchildren at home with them. They also enjoyed their friends and parties. I recall on Father's 60th birthday, Mother gave him a surprise party and during the evening it snowed so hard that most of the guests stayed all night and most of the next day.

They were warm, loving parents. I often sat on Father's foot in the evening; with his legs crossed so he could teeter me as he sang a little Swedish song. When I would laugh and beg for him to do it again, he would continue until his leg was tired. Mother taught us to sing many songs, too. Mother's advice to her children was always to be happy when you have your children around you and can tuck them in bed each night.

Following are the words to the little Swedish song that Sven Peter sang to his children. It has lasted in the memories of several generations of his descendants.



*Rida rida ranka
Hasten heta blanka
Hvarska vi rida?
Till en liten piga
Anna Magareta*

*Den Bjocka oct jeta
Da ska du val veta
Var vi kom dit
Var deer ingen hemma*

*Bara en liten sketa
Som gick och sopa gata
Och tva telliga hundar
Som lag under en bank*

*Den stora as "Vor, Vor"
Den lilla say "Jipp, Jipp."*

Translation from Swedish to English:

We rode on a horse named Blanka to visit a little maid servant named Anna Margareta.

We were very sad when we learned, upon arrival, that no one was home and then happy at a little magpie who went and swept the stone pavement and two little dogs who laid under a bench.

The big dog said, "Vor, vor."
The little dog said, "Jipp, Jipp."



After years of successful farming, Father sold his farm and retired in 1907. One year while we lived in California, Mother and Father came to visit us. They were so thrilled to again see the ocean. Mother received a pension from the government after Father's death for services he had rendered in the Black Hawk War. Father had served 390 days and the pension paid was \$260. Mother kept in touch with her relatives in Sweden and one uncle left money for her when he passed away.

Mother and Father were both teenagers when their families were introduced to the gospel and they were baptized into the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. Each made the journey

across the Atlantic Ocean, the Eastern United States, and then on to Utah as young adults. Because of the persecution of people who did not practice the Lutheran faith in Sweden, Church meetings were held in secret and during the night. After they arrived in Utah, they lived primarily in outlying areas where physical survival was, by necessity, the primary goal of each family. Even though they were surrounded by neighbors who had also gained a testimony of the restored gospel, their opportunity to study the doctrine and teachings of their new religion was limited. Although early Church Meetings were scheduled around farm chores, chores always came first (whether inside the house or outside) making regular attendance at these meetings difficult.

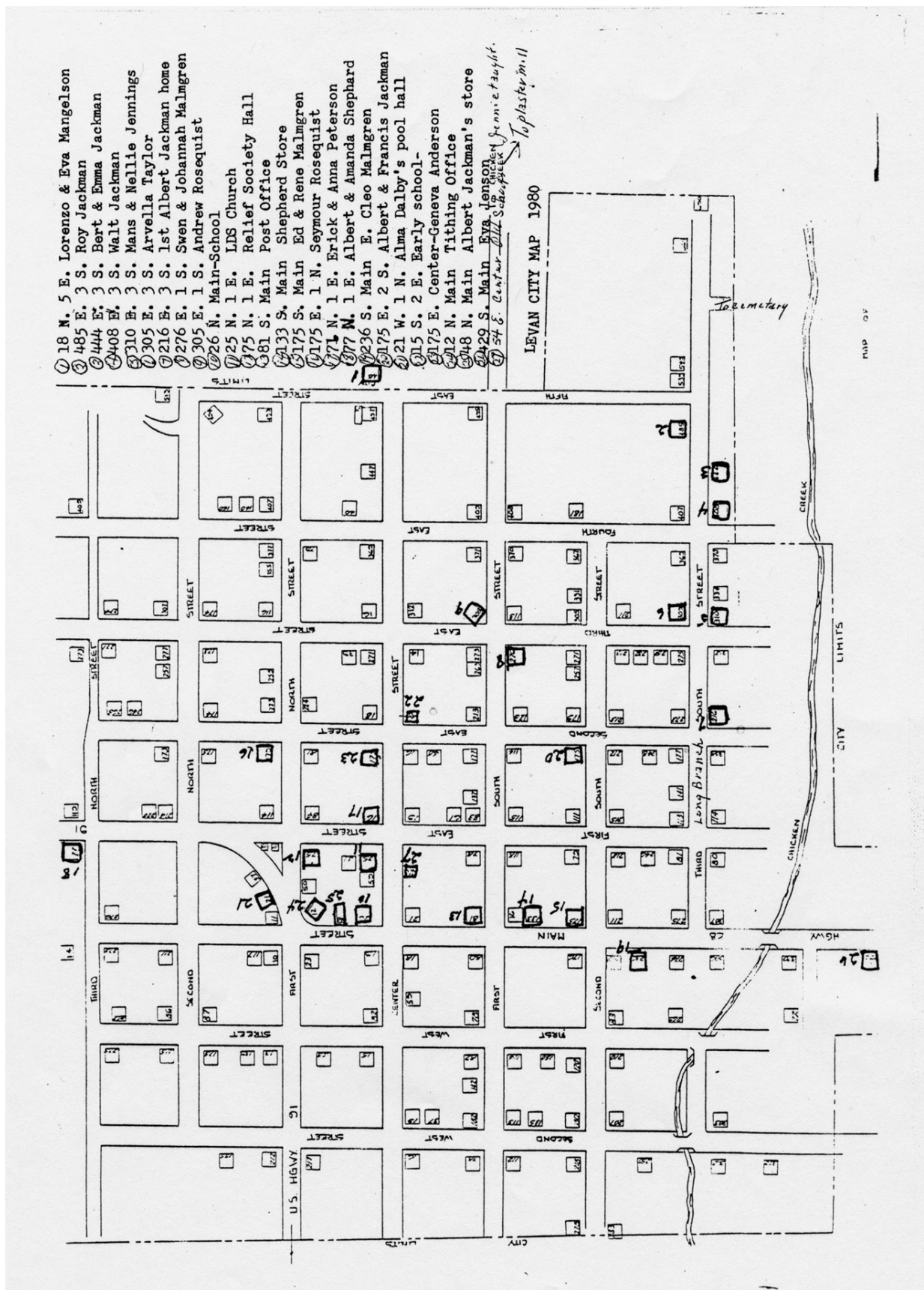
Father made at least two trips to Wyoming with his team and wagon at the request of Brigham Young to aid saints in their trip to Utah before he married Mother. He made at least one more after they were married while they were in Ephraim after being driven by Indians from their home in Circleville. Their colonization in Circleville came as a "calling" as was their move later to Levan. It was evident that both Mother and Father shared testimony with their neighbors that Joseph Smith was a prophet who had restored the gospel of Jesus Christ to the earth and that Brigham Young was also a prophet of God.

When Mother and Father arrived in Levan the town had been laid out only a year earlier by Apostle Erastus Snow. Elder Samuel Lee of Tooele had been sent by Brigham Young to preside over the new settlement in ecclesiastical matters and to help the settlement get firmly established. He remained only a short time. Brigham Young, himself, visited the settlement in September of 1868 and sent out a call for more families to settle in Levan. A one-room log cabin near the center of town served as a church and meeting house and school. It wasn't until May 3, 1869, when a Conference was held in Levan and the General Authorities of the church appointed Elder Samuel Pitchforth of Nephi as Branch President over the Levan Branch of the church. They also organized the Sunday School whose purpose, in those days, was for the religious instruction of the children and youth. Although Samuel Pitchforth served as Branch President and his wife the Relief Society President of the Levan Branch for three years, they never moved to Levan from Nephi. An adobe meeting house was begun in June. Most every man in town worked on the structure.

In the spring of 1872, Elmer Taylor was called as the President of the Levan Branch. The United Order was tried in Levan beginning in 1874, but Mother and Father were not among those who joined. 1876 the YMMIA was organized with Primary and Young Ladies in 1879. Levan became a ward in 1877 and soon after the United Order was dissolved. There is record that Mother was rebaptized at this time as the Levan Branch became the Levan Ward. In 1878 with 90 families and a population of 500, the town supported ten saloons.

Although Father had demonstrated his faithfulness by accepting repeated calls to take his wagon east to assist immigrating saints and by heeding the call to assist in settling both Circleville and Levan, regular attendance at church meetings was not a tradition in those days. Father never held a ward position to my knowledge and was excommunicated for "unbelief and neglect of duty" on March 25, 1901. He was listed as a priest in this record. Other members of the family who were also excommunicated on this date for the same reasons were Andrew Rosequist (Elder), Mother's brother, and Swen E. Malmgren (Deacon), my brother. It was not uncommon in those days for the bishop to visit with members in his ward who had not attended meetings for some time to ask if they wanted their names removed. As there was no formal Church court held for their excommunication, it is presumed that each of these men expressed indifference to having their records kept active and their names were simply removed from the records of the Church as current members.

Soon after Father died May 12, 1912, Mother took the opportunity to have her Patriarchal Blessing. Her heart was heavy because Father had not been rebaptized before he died. She was concerned that their separation would be eternal. However, the words of comfort in her Patriarchal Blessing gave Mother hope and sparked her desire to go to the temple for her own blessings and to be sealed to Father and her children who had died. Mother gathered the necessary records and Lloyd and I went with her to the Manti Temple in mid-February of 1916. Father was rebaptized and Lloyd stood as proxy for his endowment. I was sealed to Mother and Father February 16th as were all their children who were already dead. This was a wonderful day for Mother and for Lloyd and I. Swen Edwin Malmgren and Andrew Rosequist were rebaptized later.

Mother died January 5, 1923. They were parents of 12 children and have a large posterity who call their names BLESSED. They who knew them best shall bless their names and keep their memories dear while life shall last.

Patriarchal Blessing pronounced by Patriarch O. W. Stohl, September 20, 1912.
Brigham City, upon the head of Johanna Rosequist Malmgren, Daughter of Peter Rosequist and Ingeborg Anderson Rosequist, Born July 1, 1843, Malmo, Sweden.

Sister Johanna, in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, and by virtue of the Holy Priesthood I hold, according to your desire, I seal upon you a Patriarchal Blessing. Your Heavenly Father has been kind unto you, in permitting you to live in this momentous time, when the Father and his Son Jesus Christ, have made themselves known unto the young man Joseph Smith, and through him, have revealed the plan of Salvation and Eternal Life. You have great cause to rejoice, for the Lord loves you, and remembers you, for you have listened to the glad message of his servants. He has given you Faith, Wisdom, and Understanding, that you could know for yourself that the gospel was true. You became a member of the Church of Jesus Christ and came to Zion.

Our Heavenly Father has these many years blessed and assisted you in keeping the faith and in the integrity of your soul you have shown your willingness to stand for the right, and use your influence for good in being an example, for your loved ones and your fellow beings whom you have associated with. You shall be privileged to live as long as you desire, and be blessed.

There is a great work for you to perform by your noble teaching, and example, to influence those who are near and dear to you, to walk in the straight and narrow path which will lead you and them to eternal life.

You shall work in the Temple of the Lord and assist in bringing blessings unto your companion which he did not realize himself while in this probation, also others of your kindred who have died without the gospel.

Now dear sister take courage and be of good cheer. The Lord remembers you, His watchful care has been over you, and will continue. You shall have great joy in seeing your loved ones interested in work which will bring salvation unto their souls.

Thou art of Ephraim through the loins of Joseph, who was sold to Egypt, as one of the noble spirits which has been reserved to come to earth in this glorious age, entitled to all the blessings of his children, and have a right to the fullness of the priesthood.

Your companion shall be a king and you his queen with him, and your posterity shall be privileged to reign and enjoy your Father's Blessing, in the Eternal worlds, and shall associate with holy beings, even the Father and his Son Jesus Christ and his faithful children. You shall live in the millennium, enjoy the blessings of peace, under the reign of our redeemer.

Now these blessings are yours, through your faithfulness I seal them upon you with such keys, crown, and blessings, that will be for your good, in this and worlds to come.

I do this in the name of Jesus Christ, Our Redeemer, Amen.

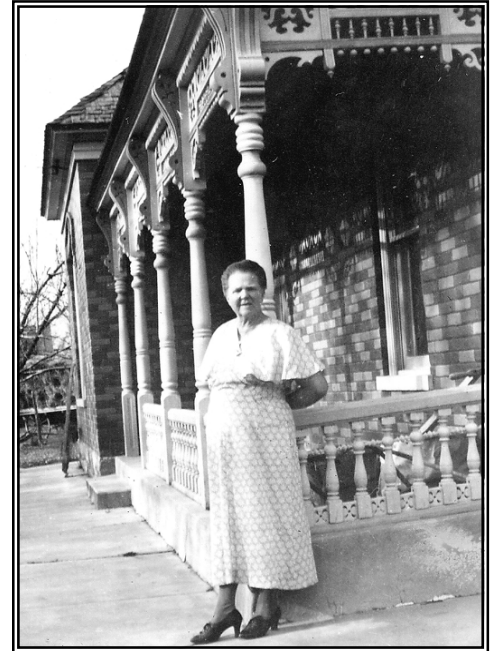
Swen Edwin Malmgren

Swen Edwin Malmgren, who went by Ed, was a tall, good-looking man with brown eyes that could look right through you. Honesty was his hallmark and he was the first to contribute to the needs of the community and the Church. He finished school through the sixth grade, then worked to help with his family as the oldest child. He watched out for his younger brothers and sisters and made a difference in their lives.

Ed married Sorena Peterson after a whirlwind courtship. They acquired a beautiful farm in Levan, Utah. Lloyd Hobbs, his sister Jennie's husband, and other family members helped him build the best barn in town. They had a lovely home where they served many delicious meals to visiting family and friends. They had the fanciest home in Levan with lots of "gingerbread" wood trim on their front porch and a very elaborate parlor that everyone loved with beautiful marble-top furniture. One of their prized possessions was the beautiful, upright Conway piano that sat in their parlor; and everyone treasured the times they were allowed to play it.

Ed worked hard raising his large family of 13 children, farming during the summer and working in the mines in Nevada or Colorado in the winter months. His family missed him so much during those mining trips, and the children would climb all over him when he returned each season.

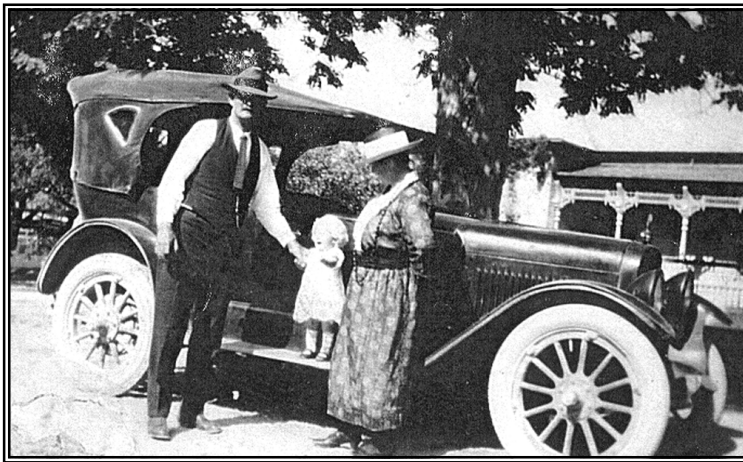
Farming was hard work growing crops and a huge garden to last a year, milking 5 to 6 cows, raising chickens, pigs, horses, and eventually a herd of sheep. There were fruit trees that supplied plenty for eating and canning. But there was still time for fun. Ed loved to watch baseball games in town, loved music, and enjoyed

seeing his 11 daughters looking pretty in new outfits. He and Sorena (Renie) would go to the youth dances at the church and look through the window to watch their girls dance.

Fun was definitely in Ed's vocabulary. He had horses that pulled the sleigh with bells over the snow during the winter. One time Ed and Renie went down to the Amusement Hall to one of the many dances. When Ed walked through the door, a basketball hit him on the head and knocked his toupee off. They laughed and he just picked it up and put it

back on his head. They had a Model T Ford car with side curtains and a canvas top. They drove the family to Salt Air by the Great Salt Lake for some swimming. Another trip was to Monroe to enjoy the hot springs, and another year they made a trip to California.

Ed took a bad fall from the back of a wagon when a team of horses started up too quickly. He went unconscious with a fractured skull and a break in his neck and spent some time in the hospital. He never fully recovered and hired help for the farm until his son, Cleo, was old enough to run it. This terrible accident contributed to an early death when his youngest child, Irene, was only 14 years old.

Now I'm suppose to talk about Uncle Ed, an' he was a quite an older man than me. I first remember him as I built a barn, me an' another fellow in Levan, carpenter, we built a barn for Ed. Anda I'm quite proud of the barn today because it still stands as straight, and the nails hasn't come out of it yet. An' it's a good barn; it's quite a monument to me, I think, having that such a good barn. The boards haven't even blew off the top or anything yet.

Now I remember Ed when he went to, I guess this is before I built the barn, he was out to Colorado. An' he had a string of mules, he and Henry, that they carried the packs into the mine, what they needed. An' they packed the gold out--that's at Ouray and Telluride, Colorado. I remember very dimly of Ed at that time.

Then later when I was married, why we used to go down to their place to parties. Aunt Renie and their family was very good cooks, an' Ed always used to say, "I'm glad you come today because I haven't had a thing to eat for two or three days." But they was always very good and very kind. An' they had a big family, an' the family had a good time. They had a big lot an' a big house with a big porch.

He was a man over six feet tall, very strong. He had a very fine horse. I have a picture of him when he's sittin' on a the horse-powered, driven thrasher machine. It had five strands of horses on this horse-power to turn the separator to do the thrashing for the many people in Levan. I've got a picture of him sittin' on that, horse-power. And I appreciated Ed. He was always very good to me.

I remember how Ed got hurt, too. He fell out of the back of a wagon an' lit on the back of his neck and broke his neck. Right out here not very far away from his home in Levan. He was standing up in this wagon that they was hauling gravel in. An' he was standin' up in the back an' someone hit the horses or somethin'. An' he give a jerk an' fell out of the back an' on the back of his head. An' he was a big man an' never did get over that. It was the day at my father died was when Ed got hurt that day.

History of Erick Cleo Malmgren and Fae Pierce

Cleo was the seventh child of Swen Edwin Malmgren and Sorena Peterson and the first child born in the home on Main Street. His parents worked hard to raise 13 children and thought the sun rose and set in Cleo. He was handsome with brown eyes and his mother said he was a good boy and always helped. Grandpa Malmgren was so proud of Cleo, he took him visiting and Cleo learned to like people and visit with older men.

At the age of 15 his father met with a serious accident by falling from a wagon. The wagon started up fast throwing him out fracturing his skull and breaking his neck. Herb was married and lived in Idaho. Dad quit school and worked and ran the farm taking the responsibility of helping grandmother raising the family. They all worked hard. They had 350 sheep his dad and him run. He went with the herded sheep down on the west bench and down by Scipio on public domain and the Sage Valley in the winter. He built and added on to the sheep lambing sheds on the west bench. He had the most sheep in Levan. He operated the Levan Co-op Sheep Company for 20 years.

Cleo had a little truck. He let his sister Velma and Faye, my mother, take the truck; Faye drove. Dad met mother at a dance. They both liked to dance. They went to a lot of dances in Scipio and picture shows in Nephi when they were courting. They were married April 17, 1935 in the city county building in Salt Lake City, Utah. Wanda Hansen, Dad's sister, was a witness. They went from there to the Salt Lake Airport and flew in an airplane. The pilot gave them a real ride. Wanda cooked supper and they stayed there overnight on a bed that came out of the wall.

They came back to Levan and Grandma Sorena Malmgren had a wedding supper and shower. She set the big dining room table three times. Anna made the cake. After a grand dinner they went to Levan Dance Hall and had a dance.

They moved into the home where Great-Grandma and Grandpa Malmgren (Johanna and Sven) had lived. Grandpa Ed came knocking on the door at 4 o'clock in the morning for Dad. He had slept in. They went to work early. The first child, Donna Faye was born in the north east room. The nurse was Christina Stephensen. Reva Christensen helped with housework. Dr. Francis Beckstead was the doctor. He charged seventy-five dollars. They lived in that house two years and then lived in a number of different homes until Dad bought Emma Christensen's house in 1938.

Mother and Dad went to dances in Scipio and shows in Nephi with friends. They were good dancers. Mother could do the Charleston and polka. They went to baseball tournaments and Lions Club and Ram Sales.

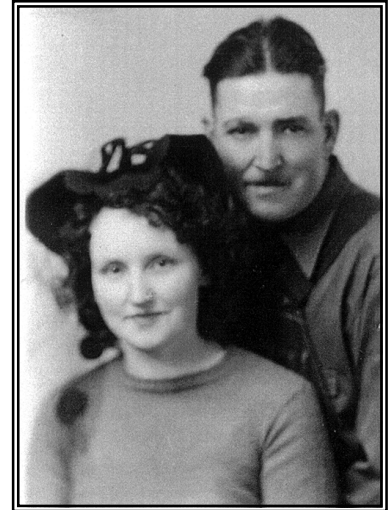
Dad bought purebred, Suffolk, sheep from George Ostler. Dad took mother to see the new sheep he had bought.

Dad was on the irrigation board, Supervisor on the Fair Board for the sheep show. He won a lot of Purple and Blue ribbons from the Juab County Fair. He also went to Ephriam, Spanish Fork, Ogden, and the Salt Lake Ram Sale. He was top sheepman in the county. He had many Grand Champion Rams. He also looked handsome in his hat.

Cleo had back surgery for a slipped disk. He was operated on in the Provo Hospital in 1945. He had pneumonia in 1944 and had to go to the Provo Hospital for complications with fluid around his lungs. He had Elders administer to him. He was very ill.

He sold a sheep herd in 1943 and bought a grey Plymouth. Dad had three new Chevrolet trucks. He bought the first new car in 1945. In 1946 and 1947 he built on to the house, three bedrooms and a bathroom. Mother was sick with tonsillitis and rheumatic fever and bleeding ulcers. Mother was administered to by the Elders.

Dad worked hard and had the first automatic bailer in Levan. Mother worked hard raising us five children doing our hair in ringlets for Sunday School. Mother made soap and heated the water on



the stove to wash clothes in a wringer washer on the back porch with bluing and rinse tubs. She scrubbed the floor on her hands and knees with a brush every week. We bottled fruit: peaches, apples peeled on the apple peeler turned with a handle. She made pounds of butter and baked many loaves of bread. When we came home from school there was fresh baked bread. She sewed dresses and we shopped for material. We always had a new Fourth of July and Christmas dresses. They raised a garden, chickens, pigs, short horn cattle, a team of horses named Prince and Pet, and lots of sheep and baby lambs. Dad milked cows and killed his own animals. He always taught us to be honest and we always knew we were loved and that we came from a good family. We had piano lessons on our beautiful piano.

Erick Cleo died in Nephi Hospital, Feb. 9, 1973. He was 66 years old. He was a wonderful father. He was about 5 feet 11 inches tall, dark and handsome. He was honest, hard working and loved to laugh and be around people. He sang songs to his children. They were "Down in the Valley," "Red River Valley," and "Burglar Bold." He was a man with guts to stand and see a bad time through. He put himself out to help other people. He had the best looking farm crops and garden. When he came home from plowing the west bench he had lots of red dirt on him. He always had satisfaction of a good job well done. When he wanted you to help you jumped, "Now." Dad was called Big Moose and E.C.

Mother remarried Earl Allred seven years later and they live in Nephi. Mother always waved and fixed her thick, brown hair. She always made us feel loved and happy.

Carrie was known as Wanda throughout her life. She had fond memories of growing up in Levan, Utah, where her Mormon Pioneer ancestors had settled. In her journal, Wanda recorded, "We, the family, all grew up with the savor of industry, the ultimate secret of which the beavers, the ants, and the bees have not yet revealed to man...We had plenty of freedom and discipline, the two so well balanced that one never destroyed the other." A favorite memory was the little sisters picking currants which grew along the ditch banks, and playing hide-and-seek in and out of the openings in the bushes on their way to the pasture with the cows. The big silver maple tree in the front yard always conjured up memories of children playing together and family gatherings.

She watched her older sisters and brothers fall in love and marry; and when her turn came, he was tall, dark, and handsome like her father. She married Harry Dean Hanson and had 10 children. They first lived in Salt Lake City, and then moved to Huntington Beach, California where they remained.

Wanda described herself as shy, compared to her brothers and sisters, but she always found life to be interesting, fascinating, and full of excitement. She was extremely fond of gardening,

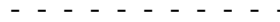

On April 20, 1868, Amanda Josephine was born to Sven Peter and Johanna Rosequist Malmgren in Fort Ephraim, Sanpete, Utah. Not long after in July of 1868, her mother and father and their two small children, Swen Edwin and Amanda Josephine, left to help colonize Levan, Utah. Their first home was a cellar. Later, as more children were born, they lived, they lived in a two-room adobe with a fireplace, then a brick home, and a small house on some land north of Levan.

Amanda was a beautiful girl with a sweet disposition according to her little sister Jennie. She was active as a young woman in the local drama organization that presented plays in the Opera House. She was baptized 22 Sep 1877.



Albert Edward Shepherd was well-like and had many friends in the Levan community, including Ed Malmgren, Amanda's brother. Albert's father, John Worlock Shepherd, was the first clerk in the Levan co-op store where he worked many years; later he entered the mercantile business, both in England and in Levan. There has always been a Shepherd store in Levan until 1950 when it was sold to Vern Mangelson. According to records, it is still there.

On November 22, 1887, Amanda married Albert Shepherd. Bishop Niels Aagard performed the wedding in Albert's parent's home. Sven Peter Malmgren, Amanda's father,

wanted her to marry another boy, but she could only think of the brown-eyed, black curly-haired Bert whom she deeply loved. Amanda's mother, Johanna, and sister, Emma, were present at the wedding.

Amanda lived in Levan her whole life. Prior to the marriage, Albert's father, John Worlock Shepherd, had given Albert a lot on which to build his three-room house. The home was ready to move into when they were married. They planted silver maple trees to the east and south of the house, which later grew to enormous size. Also, they planted lawn and flowers to beautify the grounds. They both had a love of beauty that found expression in their love of flowers and trees. Albert had a fenced-in herb garden, which he tended with great care, and used for medicinal purposes in the community. West of the house, they planted an orchard of fruit trees and berries and a vegetable garden. They often produced enough berries, vegetables and fruit for their family and sold the rest to the townspeople.

The Shepherds had more money than most of the people in Levan. There was a Shepherd store and they also had land to farm. Her descendant said Amanda and her husband were upper class in their attitude and the way they lived. But they were also hard working and very innovative. Albert was constantly laboring to improve conditions for the community as well as experimenting with farming and water innovations. Not only did they garden and produce a bountiful orchard and farm, they landscaped, raised fancy chickens, and ran a grain mill. He was constantly on the alert for signs of a spring that could provide safe drinking water, and when he found such a spring, he had it piped to Levan. He worked as water master for years. Also, he put in the first gasoline pump for motorists and helped bring electricity to Levan.

During the winter months, Albert went to Salt Lake City and worked unloading salt. He earned enough money to buy Amanda a new Singer sewing machine. However, she did not live to enjoy it. Amanda died of typhoid fever caused by drinking contaminated ditch water seven months after her second child, Ruby, was born. Ruby was given to Aunt Nellie Hartley who was Bert's oldest sister. Hazel was raised by Bert and had a rough life living with the stepmother who later married her father.



647. Hazel Amanda SHEPHERD was born 4 Jan 1889 in Levan, Juab, Utah. Hazel died 27 Dec 1972 in Fremont, Alameda, California, at the age of 83, and was buried in Salt Lake City, Salt Lake, Utah.



Hazel Amanda Shepherd was the daughter of Albert Edward Shepherd and Amanda Josephine Malmgren. She was born in Levan, the oldest of two children.

When Hazel was about 1 ½ years old and Ruby about 9 months old, their mother, Amanda died from typhoid fever. Hazel remembered standing at her mother's bedside and her mother singing "Lay My Head Beneath a Rose." Shortly after the song, she passed away. This song was sung by Hazel's great granddaughters, Jodi and Geri Ross, at her funeral in 1972. Hazel said her mother was a truly beautiful woman and very much a lady and that her father was a fine man.

After her mother's death, Hazel's father, Albert, remarried Emmeline B. Wells, whom the girls called Aunt Emmie. Six more children were born from this second marriage. By age 6, Hazel was put to work scrubbing baby diapers. The pot of water was set to boiling over a fire; she had to climb up on a small ladder or stool to be able to reach inside the tub.

Her young life was very difficult. Whenever her stepmother punished her, she was put in a potato cellar. One time, she almost forgot that Hazel was there. But for the most part as she grew older, Hazel had a happy childhood.

Hazel was a very pretty girl; she had a good personality and was very popular with many friendships that lasted throughout her life. She was very talented in many ways. She won certificates for her penmanship. She crocheted and tatted. She was a gifted artist, and loved to dance at the Church dances. She was very close to her stepbrothers and sisters; she loved them very much.

Hazel was very religious, the gospel was very important to her, and she attributes this to her father. He attended church and saw to it that his children did, too. The scriptures were in their home and they read them as a family; and, her father kept pictures of the Prophet Joseph Smith on the walls where the family could see them. She said that these things helped inspire her life.

Hazel was working as a house servant in Ephraim, Utah for a wealthy family. A son of this wealthy family took advantage of Hazel after giving her an aphrodisiac drug. When the pregnancy was discovered, the son was sent away to school and no further contact was allowed. This daughter, Refa, was raised by Hazel's father.

Hazel married **William Franklin NOKES** 28 Jul 1912 in Salt Lake City, Salt Lake, Utah. He was born 1 May 1886 in Payson, Utah, Utah. He was the son of Charles Mormon NOKES and Sarah Elizabeth SHORES. William died 15 Oct 1943 in Sacramento, Sacramento, California, at the age of 57.

After Ruby's mother died when Ruby was only a few months old, her father, Albert, went back to live with his parents in Levan, taking Hazel with him. Ellen (Nellie) Hartley, Albert's oldest sister, who had no children of her own, willingly took Ruby into her home in Salt Lake City. Aunt Nellie (as she was called by Ruby) was good to Ruby and raised her with love and kindness until she reached maturity and married. Aunt Nellie took in two other children to raise. One, Gertrude (although everyone always called her Gertie), came to Aunt Nellie from Levan as an infant. The second was Allie Christensen who came to live with Aunt Nellie after her mother died. When her father remarried she begged to be able to stay with Aunt Nellie.

As I recall Ruby went to business school and worked for a while as a secretary before she met Herman Karpowitz, a convert to the LDS Church from Germany. They seemed to hit it right off and were married in the temple. Herman was a practical German and gave Ruby gifts she could use, like

a new iron, for her birthdays. He was a butcher and made wonderful liverwurst. He owned his own business, Miller Meats, on Second Street and was a good provider. They were always able to drive a fancy car.

Ruby was a very pretty woman and always had nice clothes. She was an excellent housekeeper and had a lovely home at 892 North 11th East in Salt Lake City. Their yard was a large one and filled with lots of flowers. Ruby was also very loving. She and Herman were good to their own children and took Allie Christensen into their home as a teenager after Aunt Nellie died. Allie preferred to live with Ruby rather than with her own father and her step-mother. Ruby was good to her and Allie stayed there until she was able to get a job and live independently.

I have many fond memories of visiting Ruby in her home. Her son Carl was my age and we would have wonderful times playing pretend games. Sometimes Ruby would give us enough money to go downtown to eat at the Dollhouse Restaurant. Other times she would give us each 15 cents to go to Liberty Park for the afternoon. We could ride the merry-go-round for 5 cents and use the rest for food. Sometimes she would give us the money to go downtown to a movie. When my fingers were crushed and I was taken to the hospital in Salt Lake so my index finger could be removed, I needed to stay in Salt Lake for a few days so I could be near the doctors. I stayed with Ruby and she took great care of me at a very hard time in my life.

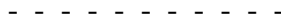

Henry Malmgren was born July 22, 1871, in Levan, Utah. He was the son of Sven Peter and Johanna Rosequist Malmgren. He was the fifth of twelve children, two older brothers, John Peter and Swen Edwin and two older sisters, Amanda Josephine and Johanna Cecelia. Henry attended elementary school in Levan and helped his father on the farm. He was baptized into The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints in a creek, name Chicken Creek by Levan on May 21, 1881.

At a very young age he was required to make a living for himself. At age 14 or 15, Lewis McCarty and he went to Wyoming and worked on a cattle ranch for a few years.

He had a freight outfit to haul freight to Nevada mines until the railroad came through with a branch line and put him out of business. He then hired a good horse trader and traveled around to dispose of his horses.

At age 27 his brother Ed and he ran a pack train at Apher, Colorado. They had about a dozen burros tied together one behind the other, loaded with boxes of food and supplies for the miners. They would load the burros with ore on the return trip, which they delivered to the railroad. They did this for two or three years. His sisters Minnie and Nell were their cooks and housekeepers. After this he found work in the mines at Bingham Canyon and Eureka, Utah, Telluride, Colorado, and Goldfield, Nevada. Sometimes he was lucky and had outside jobs. Later he worked as a foreman.

It was while working in Goldfield, Nevada that he met his wife to be, Sophia Jane (Jean) Smith. She was cooking for the men in the camp.

History of Sophia Jane (Jean) Smith Malmgren
(Information gathered from brothers and sisters of Jean)

Jean Smith was born June 21, 1884, in Spanish Fork, Utah. Daughter of Nicholas and Margaret Hood Smith and the third of thirteen children. As was customary for the Scotch people to nickname their "Janes" "jean," she was always known as Jean. She was a pretty girl with natural soft yellow hair and very good sense of humor.

On February 13, 1888, Jean was riding on a wagon loaded with gravel. She slipped and fell from the wagon and the back wheel ran over her right thigh. With this heavy load on the wagon, it is a miracle that bone in her leg was not crushed. There was no doctor in Spanish Fork at that time, so the people mostly depended on the Lord for help. The fact that she was running around within a week showed the prayers in her behalf were answered.

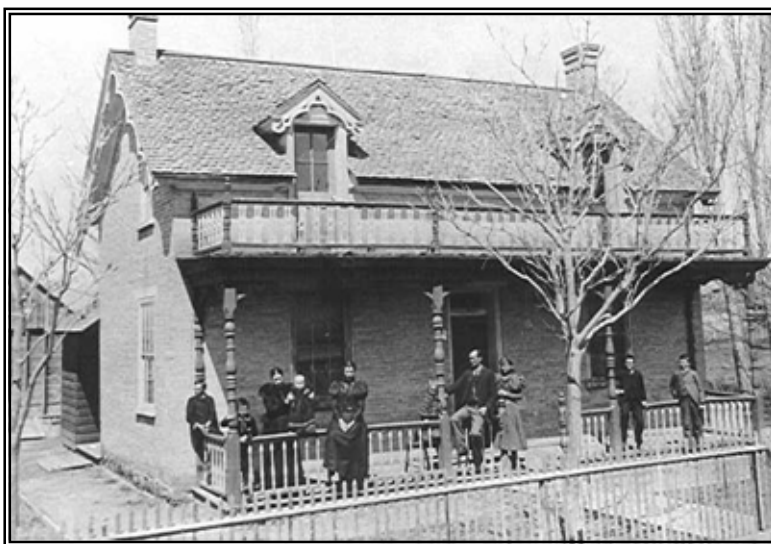
She started school in September 1890 in a little school house one block east of the Smith home. After two years there, she attended the old Ideal School. She finished her schooling at the Central School. She had to quit school before completing the eighth grade, supposedly for financial reasons. While attending school, there was always chores at home both morning and night.

As a child, Jean was a very healthy and robust girl. She liked to go to the farm and do boys' work. She thinned beets, onions and carrots, also weeded all kinds of row crops. She could ride a horse as good as any boy her age. Also drove a team of horses on some farm machinery. She like to herd cows. Jean made dolls of long clothes pins, corn cobs or of rags. She sewed clothes for them and made their beds from cardboard boxes, also made doll quilts. She made her doll houses from old boxes. She was very good at sewing. This seemed to come natural for her. She was also a good cook and housekeeper.

As a child, she attended Sunday School and Primary, later Mutual. She joined the First Ward Choir while quite young and sang with them whenever she was home. Also joined the ward glee club. She had a good alto voice and often sang solos or duets with her sister Angie and others. She was active in the Relief Society wherever she lived until her final sickness. She made many friends throughout her life.

From the time she left school until her marriage, she sustained herself by working wherever she could find work. She worked in Spanish Fork, Salt Lake City, Eureka and as a cook with a railroad construction crew.

Jean and Henry were married at his sister Minnie's home in Salt Lake City on December 23, 1912. They went to Los Angeles, California for their honeymoon. This included a trip to Catalina



Smith home where Jean and Dean were born.

Island and a ride in the glass bottom boat. This was one of the bright spots of their life and Jean liked to talk about it. They returned to Goldfield where Henry worked in the mine. Jean came back to Spanish Fork in September and Henry in October, just before Dean's birth. He was born October 18, 1913 in the Smith home (the same home where Jean was born.) She had a hard time after Dean's

birth, so they didn't return home until she was able.

Henry and Jean saved all they could toward purchasing a farm. In 1914 they moved to Ruby Valley, Nevada to start farming. Their outfit consisted of what household articles they could haul on their wagon. They had four good horses and a plow. That first winter they lived in a tent. They were able to keep warm with a good hot fire from sage brush. The soil was very fertile and the brush grew to six feet tall. They prepared the land and had wheat planted for 1915. When the wheat started to grow, the rabbits moved in and kept it cropped to the ground. They had to build a rabbit-proof fence around the 160 acres of land for the next year. Henry worked what time he could spare from the farm in the mines at Ely, Nevada as he had the winter before.

DeEtte was born July 3, 1915 at Ruby Valley, Nevada under anything but ideal conditions. The nearest doctor had to be at least twenty miles away and travel by horse and buggy. Jean swore she would never have another baby under such conditions.

In 1916 they raised a good crop and were able to build on to their house. They also purchased

a few necessities to make their home more comfortable. Jean went to Spanish Fork in February of 1917 where Esther was born on March 24 in the Smith home. A late frost that year took all their crop and again things looked very discouraging. Henry was still working in the mine at Ely when possible to leave the farm. The crop situation looked good in 1918. Henry had already been looking at a farm and bought 160 acres at Amsterdam, Idaho. They disposed of everything that couldn't be loaded into the wagon and moved there the summer of 1918.

Ruby was born December 26, 1918, in Amsterdam, Idaho. Just a month later on January 27, 1919, Esther was drowned in a cistern by the corral. This cistern was used to store water for the livestock to drink. Jean was drawing water for the stock, her attention was directed to them momentarily. Esther toppled into the cistern while Jean's back was turned. Jean rescued her as soon as possible but couldn't revive her.

They worked hard and were able to pay off the extra money borrowed for a down payment on the farm. Preparing for the spring of 1921, Henry cleared more of the land to plant. Had he lived one more year, he would probably have had the whole farm under cultivation. This was not to be. Henry died suddenly May 30, 1921 at home. No doubt the hardship of the last seven years had hurried his death. He was buried in Spanish Fork on June 2, 1921.

Jean and family went back to Amsterdam taking a nephew to do the farming. In the spring of 1922 she moved with her family to Spanish Fork, renting the farm to the nephew. This proved unwise for although it was a good year for crops, she did not receive enough to meet the farm payment. She let the farm go, salvaging what little she could.

From then on, Jean lived in Spanish Fork, trying to support herself and family by doing housework, washing, sewing, selling fruit, berries, and vegetables from her garden, and doing in-home care for the very sick. In 1926, Jean had the opportunity to take over the operation of a small grocery store. She borrowed money from her father, moved her family into the back room of the store, and rented her home. The store did show enough profit to support her family.

In February 1928, Jean was forced to bed, never to recover from cancer. She thought she had appendicitis, but when they operated on her, they found cancer throughout her body. She passed away February 18, 1928 in Provo, Utah.

Henry, I didn't know Henry too well because he was away when I used to go to Levan when I first started to go with Jennie. An' he just came home for a few days at a time an' he would be gone again. Later when he married and had a family why he used to come to Levan more often, an' I got a little more acquainted with him. But other than that why he was a very short man he wasn't like Ed an' like Lawrence. Lawrence was a tall man, too, but Henry was short.

Ya, he an' Ed was together. They went out into Colorado an' had these string of mules and pack horses that they packed this stuff into this mine an' packed it out. An' at that time I think there was Nell an' Min went out an' cooked for 'em out in that mountainous country.

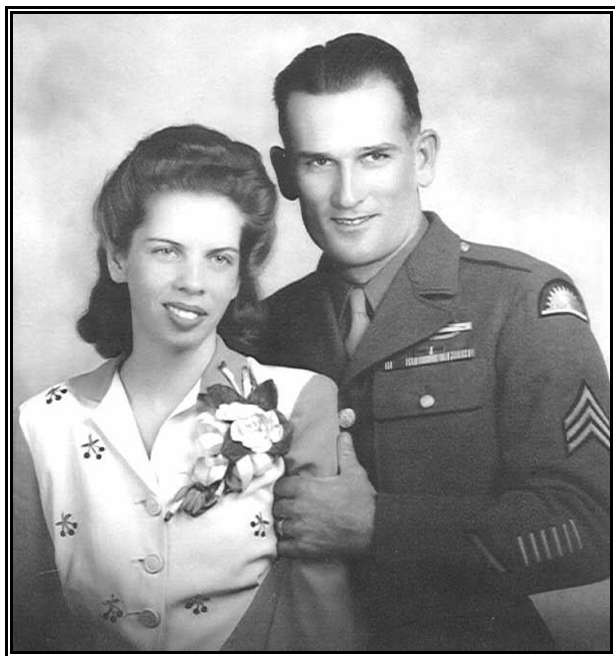
An' Henry use to tease Jennie an' tell her she was spoilt. But he was very thoughtful of her an' his mother. He gave Jennie a guitar watch that pinned on her dress and a zither, a musical instrument with lots of strings on it.

Memories of Grandmother Emma Ottomena Malmgren
By Josephine Jackman Simpson

It seems Grandmother had morning sickness when she was expecting a baby; the smell of food cooking would make her ill. Grandfather was very kind and thoughtful of her. He would have her walk outside in the garden where the air was fresh while he cooked the meals.

Memories of their home in Levan, Utah--A neat looking, one story brick house facing the north. The parlor had black leather upholstered furniture, white lace (crochet-type) curtains hung at the windows. The kitchen was on the back southeast corner of the house and contained an always spotless coal cooking stove, table and chairs near the window on the east, a cupboard which stood about 6 feet tall with glass doors on the top half, drawers in center portion, and shelves in the



bottom. There was a round wooden churn with metal handle which turned the wooden paddles inside the churn. They made butter. I remember helping churn, rinse and work the butter using a small wooden paddle and a wooden form to make the pound. How delicious it was fresh.

They had big brass milk buckets always polished and shining. Also a large tin tub for bathing which was in the shape of a regular bath tub. When it was not in use, it would be hung on the outside wall of the granary. In a small closet Grandmother kept a huge salesman's sample book about three feet by five feet filled with special cards and invitations she had saved and glued in it. She would get this out and let us look at it. It was fun to turn those huge pages and see the beautiful cards.

Grandmother kept her house spotless. She polished her wood floors and linoleum with milk until they shone. (Before floor wax she invented her own.) One man (a neighbor) told her he would rather eat off of her floor than off of the table in his own home. (A compliment to her good housekeeping.)

The kitchen door opened to the back yard (south) where the granary (west) and fruit and vegetable cellar (east) stood side by side. Then beyond these buildings to the south was the corral. The granary was built of logs and was divided through the center with bins on each side for grain. The cellar had a cement top on it about 1 1/2 to 2 ft. above the ground. It had wooden steps down into it and was roomy enough to stand up in. It was always cool and damp.

One time when Grandma came to our house and helped care for us when mother was down after the birth of a baby, she had my father make a mop stick from a narrow board for the handle, he put a crosspiece on one end with nails running through it. The nails stuck through the upper edge about a fourth of an inch to hold the cloth in place while mopping. Under the direction of Grandmother, Melba and I cleaned and mopped through the whole house every morning before school. We thought it was a bit rough at the time, but Grandmother taught us her feelings for order and cleanliness which I have learned to appreciate and use throughout my life.

A few times in the fall I rode the school bus from Nephi, Utah, to Levan and stayed overnight with Grandma. Grandpa's brother (Lee Jackman) drove the bus. He lived about two blocks west of Grandma's.

We visited Grandma when she was in a rest home in Logan. She always wanted to come home with us, until the last years when she didn't know us.

Grandmother, Emma Ottomena Malmgren Jackman, died 23 August 1966 at 90 years of age.

The History of Emma Malmgren Jackman

By Josephine Jackman Simpson

(Upon my request Grandmother wrote this history for me in December of 1940.

She was 64 years old and I was 15.



I was born at Levan August 7, 1876 of very dear parents, Mrs. Johanna Rosequist Malmgren and Mr. Swen Malmgren both born of Sweden. They embraced the gospel and came to this country with the Latter-day Saints. I was taught to pray as soon as I was old enough to say the words and kneel at my Mother's knee, and what a comfort it has been all through my life, to be able to go to my Heavenly Father in prayer.

When I was 16 years of age, I joined the chorus. I attended Primary, Sunday School, and Mutual. I also was a teacher in Sunday School and taught the second grade.

When I was 17, I started to keep company with Mr. Jackman; and when we were 18 we were married March 6, 1895. We had a big wedding at the parents of Mr. Jackman's. They gave a big supper and dance for more than 100 guests and all seemed to have a very nice time.

In almost one year from that time we was blessed with a baby girl that we named Arvilla who was born February 27, 1896. We were all very happy. Mr. Jackman still worked for his Father on the farm. Then November 16, 1898, the Lord sent us a son who was named Lester Albert. Then May 27, 1902, we was blessed with another son which we named Malend Swen after his Grandfather Malmgren. Then four years later we was blessed with another very dear little girl, and there was an electrical storm that was so severe they couldn't phone for a doctor. So had to go eleven miles for help. Well, I suffered terrible, but she came before the doctor got here. She was never very strong, but she stayed with us two years and eleven months, then the Lord called her home again, June 17, 1909. Well no one can tell what a heartache that was, only the ones that has gone through it. But I am so thankful for them three years and a consolation that I will have my little darling again some time. Then three years later May 19, 1912, we was blessed with another son Blaine E.

That same month I was asked to be first counselor to Mrs Della Tundsten to work in the Primary. Well, it looked impossible with a small baby and the rest of my family, but with the help of my husband and the Lord making it possible. I worked in that organization eleven years, as counselor six years, then president five years. Then while counselor, I was asked to go to Salt Lake to a Primary Convention and come back and report. I remember how terribly frightened I was, but I prayed to my Heavenly Father to help me remember what I heard so I could bring back what I heard. I took notes every day after each session, so I had them to refer to, but when I got up before the people at Sunday afternoon meeting I was so filled with the Spirit of my Heavenly Father I didn't need to look at my notes. I gave a (sketch) of every meeting. I surprised myself as well as the rest of the people that was there. That was one of the many times my prayers was answered.

May 12, 1912, my dear father was called home. Then some years later on Jan 15, 1923, I had to part with my mother which was terribly hard to do. Then on September 11, 1925, my husband was called home. I had to take the heavy load of being both father and mother, but the Lord has been with me or I couldn't bare these trials and heartaches for our lives are not all sunshine. We have to taste the bitter to appreciate the sweet.

Now my children are all married and have their families, and I am living alone. But I work in the Relief Society as a teacher and in the Singing Mothers Chorus, and in the Daughters of the Utah Pioneers and Social Security worker. I am plenty busy and so thankful to my Heavenly Father for health to be able to work, so thankful for my home that my husband and I built where we have always lived at Levan.

I have done some work in the Temple and hope to do a lot more, and seen one of my children with his wife get married there, and hope to see them all there some day. I am the mother of five children, eleven grandchildren and two great-grandchildren, and I am so thankful for these many blessings of having my children and grandchildren. At the age of fourteen I worked for other people, when I was not in school as my parents had a large family of twelve children, so we all must do our share to help and I have always been thankful that I could. I hope I can spend the rest of my days doing good wherever I can. This is but a few of my experiences. We all have many disappointments as well as pleasures. I have did work in the temple for more than 85 sister, but that is nothing to what I want to do. I enjoy my home in the summer and live with my children and grandchildren in the winter and enjoy it very much, plan on spending part of the winter with Norma at Pasadena, California, and part of it with Arvilla at Caliente. I have just spent a happy month in Salt Lake with

Lester and family and Verdena, my niece, who has a sweet baby boy, so I was nurse there. So thankful I am still able to do good.

Albert Mansfield Jackman and Emma Ottomena Malmgren

Albert Mansfield Jackman was the oldest son of Albert Lester and Mary Francis Jennings Jackman, born 16 of August 1876, at Levan, Juab, Utah. He attended school at Levan and lived there all his life, except 10 years spent in Juab in a small railroad town 5 miles from Levan. In Juab his father was owner of a small store and was also the Postmaster there.

Young Albert or Bert as he was called, worked mostly at farming. He like horses and owned several spirited animals. He always enjoyed riding horses and was a very good driver. His Grandma Jennings Wilson said she wanted him to drive the team when she was taken to the cemetery because he was always so careful.

He was a quiet person who never talked much, was good natured and happy, could tell a good joke. He was a good father and very proud of his children.

He was united in marriage to Emma O. Malmgren on 6 of March 1895 at Levan, Utah. Their wedding reception was quite an affair, one of the largest if not the largest up until that time. Grandpa and Grandma Jackman's home was the largest home in Levan so could accommodate more people. They came from Salt Lake City, Millcreek, Provo, Nephi, Juab, and Levan. Grandpa Jackman was County Commissioner at that time, so his friends holding high County Offices were there.

When they were married, Mother was a very pretty dark haired, brown-eyed girl of 18. Father was a brown-haired, blue-eyed handsome young man who also was eighteen years old. They are parents of five children, three boys and two girls. It was a very sad experience for them when their youngest girl passed away at three years. She (Emma Josephine) was a beautiful, light-haired, blue-eyed baby, who had never been too well since birth. There was an electrical storm and the telephone lines were down between Levan and Nephi. So a friend drove his team of horses to Nephi to get a doctor. The baby was born long before the doctor got there, and was taken care of by a good neighbor, but she didn't get enough blood and was always a delicate child. She was like a little angel and a ray of sunshine we all surely missed.

Mother was an excellent housekeeper, cook, seamstress and a lovely mother. They didn't have any modern conveniences, so mother really worked hard all those years. She was a lover of flowers and had a garden every summer till she was 78 years old. She always enjoyed pretty needle work and her pretty crocheted doilies adorned many homes of her relatives and friends. Her

crocheted stoles and baby sets have gladdened many. She quilted dozens of beautiful pieced quilts for herself, her children, grandchildren and others. She was always there to help at Relief Society on workday as well as lesson days. She helped out all she could. She has been a visiting teacher for many years.

My father and mother built a nice four room brick home that was always so clean and everything in its place. It was so inviting. They were hospitable people, enjoyed having their relatives and friends call and always made them so welcome.

When their youngest boy, Blaine, was only a few days old, the ward bishop asked mother to be President of the Primary. She accepted and did a very fine job for eleven years. My father cooperated in every way, tended the baby and helped her with the housework etc, so mother could devote the time necessary.

My father died from a ruptured appendix the 11 of September 1925 at the age of 49. I had never seen him sick in bed until this last illness. He didn't carry any insurance so mother had a real struggle from then on. But, she was equal to the task and carried on very well, raising her 12-year-old son to manhood.

In her 78th year, her health wasn't good at all. Now she is 88 years old and living in a very nice home for elderly people in Logan, Utah, called Sunshine Terrace. She has three living children, ten grandchildren, one died, twenty five great grandchildren and five great great grandchildren. She has three sisters and one brother still living.

Well Aunt Emmie was another one that I never got acquainted with 'til after we was married. Well, she worked at our house when I was just a young kid an' she was a little older. She was maybe in her teens, maybe not that old, when she worked at our house, but we had many house girls come an' work for us because my mother had a big family there. So I don't remember her very well. I guess they all tried to get us to work, an' we didn't. It was hard job to get kids to work. An' I can't remember Emmie.

After she was married, we used to go to Levan. When anybody come home they always had a family party. It was either down at the Malmgrens to up at the Jackmans. Emmie always made the most wonderful fruitcake.

Well, Emmie took care of Grandma for quite a little bit because we went away to California one winter or two winters, an' we left her, but when we were home she'd go to Nephi an' stay with us for awhile, an' then we would bring her back home for awhile. There was kind of a little care for her after Swen died.

An Invitation to Attend a Wedding

One of the greatest social events occurring in the history of Levan transpired on Wednesday March 6, 1895.

The Honorable A.L. Jackman, a member of the County Commission, invited the judge and selectman Deprezio to accompany him on the afternoon aforesaid to Levan to witness the ceremonies of the marriage of his eldest son, A.M. Jackman to Miss Emma Malmgren. Upon the arrival of the Court at Levan, the friends of the high contracting parties began to assemble at the elegant Mansion of Mr. Jackman. The house had been suitably prepared. One large room especially, having been prepared for dancing. The sweet strains of the violin and organ were soon heard directing the movements of graceful dancers. "And there was a sound of revelry by night."

Feasting began almost at the same time as the dancing. A sumptuous repast had been prepared by Mrs. A.L. Jackman of which all partook heartily. Selectman Deprezio especially distinguishing himself at this stage of the enjoyment.

The dancing and feasting were interspersed by song, recitations, readings, and so forth by various members of the happy group. Over 100 persons were assembled. After a few choice remarks by the judge, Bishop N.P. Rasmussen performed the ceremony which united two happy souls in the holy bonds of matrimony.

The bride is a beautiful and accomplished young lady and many were the compliments that were passed upon her by those who witnessed her modest yet ladylike demeanor.

At about three in the morning, the friends began to retire to their homes and further deponent saith not.



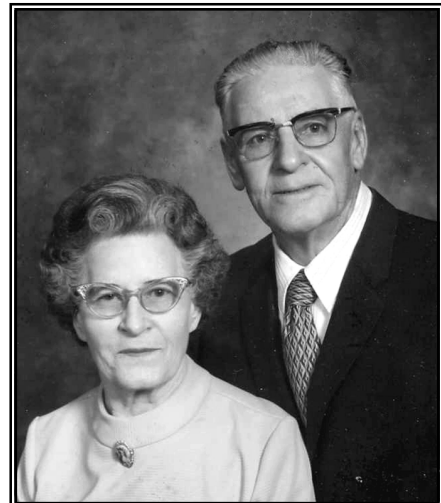

Malend and Ruth both came from highly respected, active LDS families. Their ancestors were among the early pioneer converts to the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Following their convictions, they crossed the plains with oxen-pulled, covered wagons in the early 1800's.

Arvilla, Malend's older sister, remembers him to be a very happy child. When he was five years old he nearly died from scarlet fever. His older brother, Lester, remembers what a hard worker Malend was. When they worked in the fields topping beets, Malend could finish two rows faster than the others could finish one. As a 10-year-old boy, Malend would milk cows in the dark in the morning in the winter time, then walk over a mile to school and later come home and do chores in the dark before supper. A lot of the time supper would be bread and milk.

He loved cats and they would follow him around. He liked to take his cat to bed with him. His dad and mother would make him put her out before going to bed, but he would sneak out and bring her in after they were asleep.

Malend met Ruth in Nephi, after an MIA meeting. They fell in love and soon married. They moved to Salt Lake City where Malend worked on the railroad. 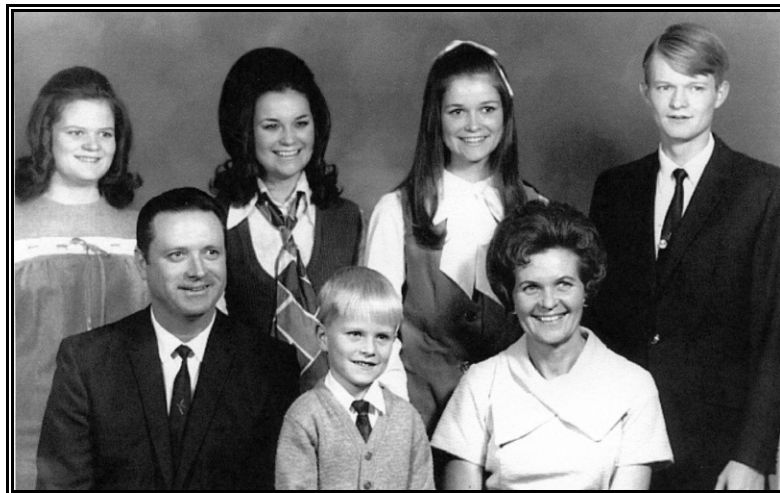

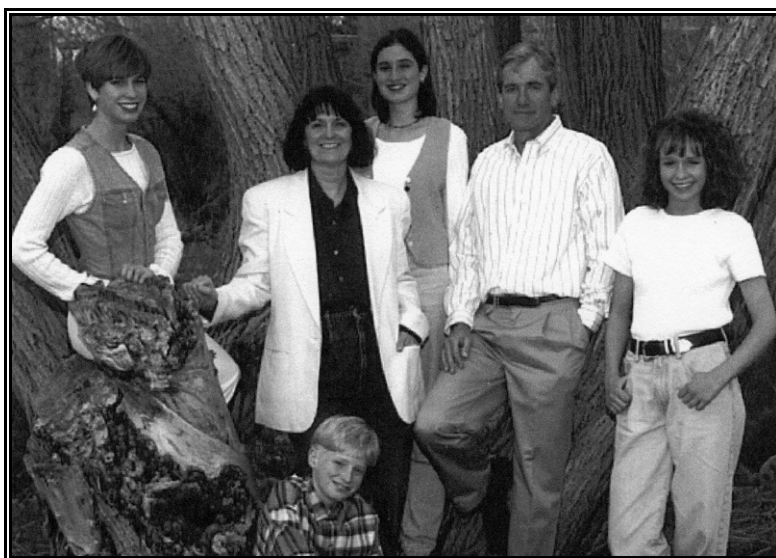
Their lives are centered in their family and have enjoyed many experiences through their children's growing up years. They have been grateful for the help of their parents' and grandparents' guiding hands.

History of Mary Rosanell Malmgren Jennings

December 7, 1878 ---- May 25 1967

Written by Ione Shepherd, July 1967



Mary Rosanell Malmgren Jennings, known as Nellie, was born December 7, 1878, at Levan, Juab, Utah, to Sven Peter Malmgren and Johanna Rosequist Malmgren. She was the 8th of 12 Children. Nellie was baptized into the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints on June 2, 1887, at the age of eight. She attended grade school in Levan where each grade was called First Reader, Second Reader, etc.

After she finished school she went to Provo to do housework for a family there for \$2.50 a week. I remember her saying the first Christmas away from home she had just enough money saved to buy her mother a cape, a gift for her father, and a set of dishes for her youngest sister, Jennie, and gifts for the other children in the family, but not enough to go home for Christmas. On Christmas Day, the man she worked for asked her why she didn't go home for Christmas. Mother told him she wanted to but didn't have money to pay for her fare home after buying gifts for her family. He gave her money and told her to go and stay for New Year's.

Later she worked in Colorado with her sister, Minnie, doing cooking for her brothers who were working there carrying supplies and ore to and from the mines.

Mother's parents were both from Malmo, Sweden, and were among the early Mormon settlers of Levan. They didn't meet until they arrived in Utah. Grandpa Malmgren homesteaded some land south of Levan.

Mother told me her first date with Father was at the age of 12 when Grandma and Grandpa Jennings took them to a circus in Nephi. As she was growing up she dated several young men, but always enjoyed going with my father best.

Mother and Father were married October 15, 1902, at Levan, Utah. They rented a house in Levan. This is where I, their first child, was born August 2, 1903. Not long after my birth, father was stricken with typhoid fever and was left with a bad leg. As soon as he was able to work again they moved to Bingham, Utah. Father was foreman of the Bingham Highland Boy Mine.

Mother and Dad's sister, Zelia, ran a boarding house in Bingham. They lived there until 1906. They moved back to Levan and Father bought Grandpa Malmgren's farm which was one mile south of town. They also bought a large city lot with a log house with two rooms in it. Father built on another room. Three lots were fenced off into four lots: the house on one lot; one was an orchard of apple, peach, pear, plum and cherry trees; one lot had the barn and corral for horses and cattle, a granary for storing wheat, large derrick and haystack, and a chicken coup; and the fourth one was a vegetable garden.

On January 5, 1910, a son, Raymond, was born. He was a welcome addition to our family especially since they had waited about six-and-a-half years him.

Mother was a flower lover and always raised lots of beautiful flowers around the yard. She loved to share starts of flowers with friends. I once heard a lady say after mother left Levan that she thought most everyone in Levan had starts of mother's flowers. She also raised strawberries, raspberries, currants, gooseberries, and boysenberries (they were so thorny). She also liked to raise chickens, turkeys, and geese. She would feed them while Dad fed and milked the cows and prepared the horses to go work the field. Both my parents arose early in the morning. As long as they lived, both of them were strong believers in getting as much done as possible before sun-up in the morning.

About 1915 they built a nice brick house. It was the first house in Levan with a bathroom. Mother had many large dinners in her lovely new home. She was a good cook. Whenever folks came from out-of-town from both families they often came to our home. About once a week neighbors would gather around four tables to play "500" and then have dessert afterwards.

My father died June 18, 1937, of a heart attack. That was a sad day for all of us as we loved him so much and he loved all of us. He always loved children. He and Mother always brought the grandchildren new clothes and toys at Christmas and birthdays. Dad loved taking the kids for a ride in the car. I can remember when he let Clayne pretend he was driving the car—sitting on his lap in the driver's seat. When Dad died, we didn't have funeral parlors, so we had the viewing at home. One little neighbor girl—about 8 years old—came to the house and just sat by the door all day long, close to the casket. She lived a block from Mother and Dad. When she left to go home she said, "He was the best friend I ever had." When she and her brother heard Dad's car, they would run to meet him. He would take them to town with him and buy them something to eat—sometimes candy or ice cream. Dad liked to play games with the grandchildren. He'd tell them to turn around and while they were turning, he'd put money in their pockets. Then he'd tell them they missed one pocket so they would try again and he'd have money in another pocket for them.

Mother kept the home in Levan until October, 1943. Our home was built on the last street on the south side of town. Behind the garden was a large creek where Ray liked to hunt quail and rabbits. He also liked to fish in the canyon. He went to visit Mother and Dad often, especially when Mother was left alone. When I suggested to Mother on May 21, 1943, to sell her home and move closer to one of us, she replied, "I can't sell my home. Ray enjoys hunting and fishing here so much." I told her he could spend more time with her if she was closer to us.

I left to go home the next day and the following day a man who had lived in Levan and had moved away came to see Mother. He said, "Mrs. Jennings, I heard you want to sell your home." Mother was so surprised. She said, "I have never mentioned selling my home to anyone, but Ione was here yesterday and suggested I sell and buy closer to one of them." Mr. Francom said, "Here is \$1,000 for a down payment. If you decide not to sell, I will take it back. If you decide to sell, you can stay here until you find another home. She sold her nice brick home for \$4,000. He also bought the 10-acre farm she still had. Ray's wife, Nora, hunted in Salt Lake for a house and I hunted in Tooele. I found a home near me for \$2,300 which mother wanted remodeled. She lived with me while they worked on her home. She never regretted moving. Ray and I helped her move from Levan to Tooele. She made a lot of friends there, also, and was very happy in Tooele. She raised beautiful flowers there, also, and furnished the church with flowers each Sunday during the summer months for several years. Her flower garden to the east of her home was enjoyed by so many. Mother taught Sunday School, Primary and was a visiting teacher in the Relief Society. She was also Vice President in the Daughters of Utah Pioneers.

Mother quilted a lot and loved doing handiwork. She made quilts for Ray and Nora and for Bill and me. She did a lot of tea towels and made pillowcases for all her grandchildren and great-grandchildren. She always insisted on having cookies in her cookie jar in case the grandchildren came to visit. They would always go for the cookie jar and find good cookies.

Mother got a burn in about 1954. She had hardening of the arteries and had momentary black-outs. She was ironing a dress when she had a blackout. The imprint of the iron was on her leg when she came to. She didn't tell me until that afternoon and when I saw it, it looked just like raw hamburger, burned almost down to the muscle. I called Ray. He called Dr. Galligan, and then we took her to Salt Lake to Holy Cross Hospital. She was there about 10 days recuperating. When we

brought her home from the hospital, the Bishop was by the door. He came to see when she would be home from the hospital. I asked him if he would give her a blessing. He and the First Counselor gave her a blessing. In her blessing he asked that if it was the Lord's will that she could be spared from her blackouts. I do not recall of her having any more from that day on.

When she was 65 years old she had to go to the hospital and have her left breast removed because of cancer. Bishop Lee Bracken and his son, Byron, came to our house and gave mother a blessing that her health would be restored again. She recuperated from her operation beautifully.

We discovered she had diabetes when she was about 86. The doctor told me I would have to give her insulin shots each day. I said, "I can't stick that needle in her. He said, "Oh, yes you can." I was chicken and called Ray. I always knew he was only a telephone call away and he always came to my rescue when I needed him. Ray stayed the first night and gave her shots every six hours that night and the next day. After that I could get courage to give them to her. I gave her the shots every day for two years. I remember seeing her try to give herself a shot one morning so she wouldn't be dependent on me. Mother was always so independent. She kept her sugar diabetes under control very well.

She had a gall stone attack and went to the hospital with that. While in the hospital, she got pneumonia and died, May 25, 1967.

She sold her home two years before as her health was failing, and it was too hard for her to keep up her home and yard. Bill and I enjoyed having her with us, and it was real lonesome for me when she left as we had spent most every day together since she moved to Tooele, 24 years before. Mother loved her children and grandchildren and all of us loved her very much.

Remembering Nellie

We used to go to Levan when anybody come home 'cause they always had a family party. Aunt Nell wasn't there. She was away with Mance with the mining company. They was all good cooks all the Malmgrens. I know that Nell was very good, she made chicken dumplings very rich an' very good.

Nell got married an' they lived in Bingham, but I never knew her in those days so I don't know much about her. But after she come to Levan to live an' Manse bought the Malmgren farm an' that, why I begin to know 'em there because we'd come out from Nephi and see 'em. Mance sold insurance kinda on the side, too, besides doing a little farming on this farm that he purchased off Malmgrens.

The house that they lived in was the little house that we lived in. We was in California down on where they was buildin' a big track of houses. Anda, we went an' looked at over a hundred houses maybe before we 'd decide what kinda house we wanted or what the size an' all of that. But we'd use to go down an' see that. An' then we bought a book off this real estate outfit showing their houses anda we brought that home. An' we built our house just the same as the one that was in the book any more we made it a little bit wider an' a little bit longer. We figured that the rooms was a little bit too small an' so. Then after I got ours built in Nephi, why we built one in Levan for Nell and Mance an' then we built one out in Gunnison on about the same floor plan again for Lawrence an' Anna. So they're all standing today. The year at we built mine was 1917. Anda it hasn't got a crack in it, an' I built a very good home there, an' it's still standing as good as the day it was built.



The first car we got was a Ford Roadster. It just had one seat in it, an' it had so you could put the top down. An' it had a kind of a slope in back where you could keep an extra tire underneath the slope.

Anda, I know we come out of Levan an' was goin' to pick up Jennie's mother. An' she got in an' she sat up in the seat with me. There was just room for about two in the seat. An' Mom, she sat down in the door. We opened the door an' we held the door open anda she had her feet on the running board. An' she rode to Gunnison that way. But when we got over to Nell's, Nell said, "Gee, I'd like to go with ya." 'N we said, "Well, where can ya get on?" 'N she said, "Oh, I can hang on this side." She sat on the back kinda with her feet down on the side just in front of the wheel an' fender. An' she rode to Gunnison that way. It's funny she didn't get throwed off, but she hung on anyhow. She hung onto the top. The top was down I think as I remember. But we got to Gunnison all right.

There was a white dust in those days. You didn't have any paved or graveled roads or anything like that. You jus' followed the tracks. You couldn't tell whether you was comin' into a bump or a piece of level road when you was drivin' because the dust was so deep. 'N it 'd just fly out when you dropped down into one of those holes. It was a wonder the front of the car could stand the trip. But, I know we went to Gunnison an' stayed; I don't know, I believe we maybe stayed overnight or maybe didn't, or maybe we come back that same day. But Lawrence he had a Ford. He had a two seater anda so he brought Nell back about 15 miles or 20 miles past Fayette because the dogs was kind of bad. They'd try to nip their legs. They had ta fight 'em off. But any how we made that trip, an' Nell's always said that was the best trip she ever had. She was always ready to go.

We ate lots of dinners with Nell an' Mance and Old Lawrence an' Anna an' Bert an' Emm. The kids had to wait until last, but if there's anything left, then they'd git some.

Nell, when she got in Levan why she run a kind of a millner's store there an' sold hats for a long while. There was no milliner's store in Levan so she started a millner's store an' she sold hats for quite a while. They'd buy a plain hat an' Nellie 'd decorate it all up the way they wanted it with flowers an' ribbons an' things. An' then she sold Excelsis or somethin' like that. 'At kept her busy goin' from one place to the other a selling stuff. Mance he jus' run the farm, I guess, an' he sold a little insurance on the side. So that's how they got along as I remember.

Beth adds: Aunt Nellie and her mother were awfully close. After Grandma died, they said that Aunt Nellie used to go over to Grandma's house and sit on the steps and cry because she missed her so. They were very, very close to each other. Grandma was buried from Aunt Nellie's house. As a child I, remember going there and looking at Grandma in her coffin in Aunt Nellie's parlor. I remember they had the viewing and the dinner and everything at Aunt Nellie's when Grandma died.

Aunt Nellie was always real handy in our home. Whenever she'd come and we had crowds, Aunt Nellie could just pitch in and she and Mother worked very easily together. She always would just kind of take over and the way she'd go and she could help Mother and they could fix a meal real fast together. They really worked well together.

Mother always sort of adored her because she was exactly ten years older, almost to the month, just a few days difference. Aunt Nellie was always so good to Mother. We still have the dishes that Aunt Nellie gave Mother when she was six-years-old when she was working in Provo. I prize them, I've handed them down now this will be the fourth generation that have those little dishes and there is only a handle broken off one of them. We have treated them ever so kindly.

But Mother said that whenever Aunt Nellie came home she always curled her hair when she was a little girl. Otherwise, she had to wear pigtails. But when Nellie came Mother got to wear ringlets because Aunt Nellie would take time to curl her hair and fix her up and make her pretty. And

she bought her her first little coat. And she bought Grandma the first coat she ever owned. Grandma wore shawls all the time. She never owned a coat until Aunt Nellie bought her a coat. We have part of the paisley shawl that Grandma wore for years and years and years when she went to Church and went out because she never owned a coat. They didn't have money to buy coats for her and all the kids. Aunt Nellie was a very thoughtful person of other people.

Well, Uncle Mance came to see us almost once a week. He came to Nephi after he got selling insurance. Aunt Nellie'd come with him quite often. When she'd know he was coming, why she'd get in and come. He gave me a quarter once when I was a little girl, and I thought he was the nicest uncle I ever knew. And he gave me that doll, Teeny, too. I just loved that doll and I carried her around all my life. I loved Ione's doll, too. She had a beautiful big doll. Oh, I was happy if Aunt Nellie would take that doll down off the wall an' let me play with it once in a while.

Personal Biography of Ione Shepherd
AUGUST 2, 1903 - JULY 3, 1992
Written June 15, 1979

I was born in Levan, Juab county, Utah, August 2, 1903, to Mansfield E. Jennings and Mary Rosanell Malmgren Jennings. I had whooping cough when I was three months old, and Mother said I coughed so hard I would go dark in my face and go so limp she thought I was going to die. Not long after, Dad was afflicted with typhoid fever and was hospitalized for a time. Mother told me he left the hospital before the doctors wanted him to, and it left him with a bad leg. Soon after, they moved to Bingham, Utah. Dad was foreman of the Highland Boy Mine, and Mother and Dad's sister, Zelia, ran a boarding house there.

Mother told me I had a little black and white cat that I loved. One day, when I was playing with it, for some reason, I slapped the cat. It yelled and ran away from me. Mother slapped my hands to let me know I shouldn't be so rough with the cat. Then the cat went to me and put its paw on my face. Mother said she felt it was telling her I hadn't hurt him, and she felt ashamed that she had

slapped me. I was only three years old when we left Bingham so I don't remember much about our life there. I seem to vaguely remember one little playmate named Marjorie. Maybe it is just hearing Mother tell me of her and how we used to dress our kittens in doll clothes and wheel them in our doll buggies.



It was 1906 when my family moved back to Levan and Dad bought Grandpa Malmgren's farm which was one mile south of town. My Dad was a strong believer that a successful farmer had to get to his farm early and was ready to work by six a.m. each morning. Everyone arose early and each had their own little job to do. When I was old enough to get breakfast I was awakened early to prepare it, while Mother fed the chickens and Dad milked the cows and fed the cows and horses. We also had pigs to feed. Sometimes he came home for lunch, but he always quit work early evenings – came home, did chores and ate; then, often, we would go for a ride in a one-seat-buggy. I sat in front on a little red chair.

When I was 6 ½ years old, a baby brother was born, Raymond M.. He was so welcomed and we have been real close all our lives.

When I was in grade school, I would get the mail from the post office at noon. I would go to Grandma Malmgren's which was 6 blocks away. She would always have a lunch prepared for me. She always had a dessert she called Red Mush, which was sago (small tapioca that would hold its shape that you can't buy now) cooked in fruit juice and Mormon Tea, which was hot water and milk. At night after school, I took Grandma Jennings' mail to her - which was another 6 blocks from Grandma Malmgren's house. I left Grandma Jennings' mail at Grandma Malmgren's at noon. Grandma Jennings ALWAYS had hot cinnamon rolls and a glass of milk for me. Ray remembers Grandma Jennings for her chicken soup and Danish dumplings and the big white Brahma chickens she raised. Grandma Malmgren was a small woman. She loved flowers and raised lots of them. She always kept her hands busy doing beautiful handwork in her spare time. Grandma Jennings was a tall stately lady. She didn't do either handwork or raise flowers, but she was a marvelous housekeeper. I always think of Grandma Jennings sitting in her rocking chair with a little white (stiff starched) apron, rocking back and forth. I loved both of my Grandmothers so very much.

I remember a small sleigh my parents had. They called it a cutter. Our family often went for rides in that. Ray and I had two little red chairs. We sat in front of Mother and Dad. In the winter Dad would hitch the horses to a Bob Sleigh, put sleigh bells on the horses and take our family and some neighbors for a ride. Then we would have hot chili, or some hot dish when we came home. All the neighbors were like one big family and we had real good times together. Wintertime was fun time.

Besides the sleigh parties, I remember going to Grandma and Grandpa Malmgren's on Christmas. We always found a toy, candy, nuts and a large candy animal that we tried to keep for a while. We also had a Christmas tree that had ornaments and candles that we lit on Christmas Eve. I remember getting a doll almost as large as I was one Christmas. I kept it until after I married.

As I was the oldest child, I drove cattle to the farm in the morning before school. I walked a mile there and a mile back home and then six block to school, the same after school at night. Before Ray was old enough to take the cows, my Grandpa Jennings gave us a Billy Goat and harness and a green wagon with a seat to drive the cows. But the goat would only go half way to the farm then would stop, and no matter what I did he wouldn't go further. As soon as I was out of the wagon he

would turn around and run for home—leaving me to take the cows the remainder of the way and then walk home. We had the goat for several years. Dad had a younger brother, Kenneth, three years older than I who teased the goat till he was mean and had to be killed. When Ray was old enough to take the cows to pasture, I lost my job. I did still go with Dad to tromp hay on the hayrack and tromped grain in the header beds. I also rode derrick horse to stack then—until Ray was old enough to take over that job too.

Before the water was piped into the house, we had to carry water, put it in a wooden barrel to settle the dirt, then boil it before drinking. On wash day, we heated our water in a boiler, then filled a washer that was turned by hand. We had no electricity in Levan. I studied by coal-oil lamp, then by gas lights before electricity came to Levan.

I've always loved gardening. I helped with Dad's garden in Levan from the time I was big enough to weed. I'm sure it was not a love duty at that time. I always needed a little prodding from my parents. Mother always had strawberries, gooseberries and boysenberries. I hated to pick berries. The gooseberries and the boysenberries were so thorny. We picked the fruit and Mother sold them for 5 cents a quart. Every spring we had to go up in the creek banks and pick wild currents. Aunt Emma and her children and Mother and Ray and I would take our lunch and go spend the whole day picking. They were sweet and good to eat, and made very good pie.

There was a big blow snake in our flower garden every year. Dad wouldn't let the kids kill it because it killed the gophers and mice. Birds built their nests on the porch post. After Dad got hurt, he'd sit on the porch and watch the birds build nests and feed their young ones. There were robins and bluebirds. He wouldn't let the nests get destroyed until the young birds were hatched and flew away.

I went to grade school and the two year high school in Levan. I remember playing baseball at recess and taking part in school activities. Jean Connely, Edna Anderson and May Mortenson were some of my good friends then. I went to Salt Lake Business College when I was 17 years old. I worked a while at the Levan plaster mill as a secretary until it closed. Dad thought I should finish high school, but by then, I was going steady with William Shepherd and we wanted to get married so I wanted to earn more money. I worked a while at the County Court House before we were married.

Both Mother and Dad's families were real close. We spent most of our vacations with family. I remember once we went to visit Dad's brother, Lloyd and family in St. George, Utah, and all of us went to Zion Park, Utah. Before my teenage years I spent summer vacations in Vermillion, Utah, with Father's sister, Mammie Gledhill and Zelia Colby, and families in Centerfield, Utah, with Mother's brother, Lawrence Malmgren, and family. I went with Mother's sister, Jennie and Lloyd Hobbs, wherever they were drilling water wells. I also spent time in Fountain Green during the summer vacations during my teenage years. I met a lot of good friends and had a very good time in each place.

The first vacation in my parent's car was to Yellowstone Park. We had a Model-T-Ford car—no windows. We wore caps with a scarf tied around it to hold it on our heads. We wore dusters to keep our clothes clean of dust. There were no cement roads at that time. Mother's brother, Edward's wife, Rena, and two children went with us in their Model-T-Ford that didn't have much power. When we came to a steep incline in the road, we would have to get out and push Uncle Ed's car up the hill. There were no motels along the way, as there are now, so at night we made our beds on the ground inside some farm fence. We always traveled till after dark. I remember one night we were just settled



for the night when a large bull came charging through the field. We were not slow getting through the fence.

There were no shows in Levan—dances occasionally. We went to Nephi for picture shows and dances. We had many good parties at my home. Mother would often make sandwiches and salad for the crowd and both Mother and Dad made cake and ice cream. They always enjoyed having young people come for a good time. Dad would pull the phonograph out on the porch and play the records while we danced on the cement. It was fun!

My first dates were with horse and buggy. Later cars came to Levan and we went in a car. William Shepherd and I were married in the Manti Temple, June 27, 1923. Bill was working at the Murray Smelter so we moved to Murray. While there I taught in the Religion Class Organization, also the Primary. In 1924 we bought a home in Salt Lake City, Utah. I worked in the Liberty Ward Sunday School. On December 6, 1925, a baby boy was born that made us very happy. The doctor came in to tell me I had a 6 ½ pound baby boy with brown hair and big brown eyes. That night I broke out with Chicken Pox and ten days later our baby was covered with pox. At that time we had our babies at home. Mother stayed with me for ten days. She had just left when I noticed he had pox on his body. We had a hard time finding a name good enough for our baby boy that we waited 2 ½ years to get. Bill finally came home with the name Clayne. I wasn't sure I liked the name, but told him he could name the boy, and I would name the girl. We lived on Herbert Avenue, just two avenues south of Ninth South, and a half block east of State Street. I often walked and pushed him in his Taylor Tot to town. He was a friendly baby and people would stop and comment on my beautiful baby with big brown eyes, and a happy smile.

When Clayne was three months, my Dad went to the hospital to have one knee cap removed. I went to see him each day, and very often walked and pushed the Taylor Tot. Dad was so proud of his little grandson. He would call the nurses in to see him and brag about the cute things he did.

We sold our home in 1927 and bought a home on 22nd South 2nd East in Salt Lake—not long after the Murray Smelter closed and employment was hard to find. Bill went to Tooele in July 1928 to work at the Tooele Smelter. I stayed in Salt Lake to sell our home. On September 12, 1928, we were blessed with a baby girl, Nelda. My Mother and Dad came up two weeks before she was born and took me to their home in Levan. Clayne remembers Nelda's birth even though he was not quite 3 years old. When I was in labor at the Jennings' house, Clayne had to stay with my cousins in a house across the street. He knew something very mysterious was going on at Grandpa Jennings' house. His cousins told him there were bears out in the street that would get him so he couldn't go over to his Grandparent's home. I stayed with my parents for two more weeks, then went back to Salt Lake and sold our home.

I moved to Tooele in February 1929. We rented our first house on 1st East between Vine Street and 1st South. In December 1929 we moved to 240 South 1st West. There we met several good neighbors and made good friends. The depression came during this time. The Tooele Smelter and Refining Company where Bill worked was cut down to a skeleton crew. Bill worked 4 days some months and some months only 1 day at \$4.00 a day. Both of our parents had a farm. My parents came up often and would bring meat, butter and flour. We raised a vegetable garden and rabbits. Two of our good neighbors and their children, Bill and I and our children would often eat together and put together what each had for dinner. We didn't have money, but we did have good social times at our homes, and our friendships have grown through the years.

Our landlord cut our rent in half and let Bill paint the house, which was frame, for part of the rent. In 1935 we moved to Mac and Emily Madson's home on 50 South 1st West. They had a two

story brick home and were working and living at the tram in Tooele Canyon during the week and would only come to their home during some weekends and then they lived upstairs. We were very good friends and had many good times together. Both Emily and I did a lot of handwork and we enjoyed many happy hours together. Emily died in April 1945. I felt like I had lost a sister. Emily loved the daffodils I grew and asked me to pick her a bouquet of them when she came home from the Bingham Hospital. She didn't come home alive so I bought some fern from the florist and made up a spray of daffodils for her funeral.

We had a big garden in back of Madson's house. The kids used to sell vegetables to get show tickets. Mrs. England, next door, said Clayne was always a salesman from the time he sold vegetables from his little red wagon. They sold a good big bunch of radishes for a nickel. We moved again in March of 1939 to 182 South 2nd West and lived there until we built our home at 263 South 2nd West where I still live in 1979. We have always had good neighbors wherever we have lived and continue to be life long friends.

Clayne graduated from Tooele High School May of 1944 and left a few days later to serve in the U.S. Navy, as World War II had started December 7, 1941. I think that was the hardest time of my life—to see my young son go to war. He was real good to write to us, which helped so much to know he was alive and also to let us know where he was at the time he wrote. He came home August 1946—and that was one of the happiest days of my life. Clayne married Ruth England August 14, 1947. They have three lovely children. Nelda married Dale Flinders from Grantsville, September 14, 1947. They have two lovely daughters.

My Dad died June 18, 1937, of a heart attack. That was a sad day for all of us—as we loved him so much, and he loved all of us. Mother sold her home and farm in Levan in 1943. She bought a home just two blocks from our home. We were so happy to have her near us. I spent time with her every day. She died May 25, 1967. Her death was real hard on me as we had always been so close.

I have always enjoyed gardening and my church work. Bill and I have always raised a vegetable garden and had a lot of beautiful flowers around our yard wherever we have lived. We've always had a good "two-year-food supply": 6 long shelves full of fruits, vegetables, and meat; another 3 shelves full of different kind of squash; two freezers full of a half of beef, homemade bread and

pies, etc; a little cupboard full of canned goods from the store; and flour for the bread I made twice a week.

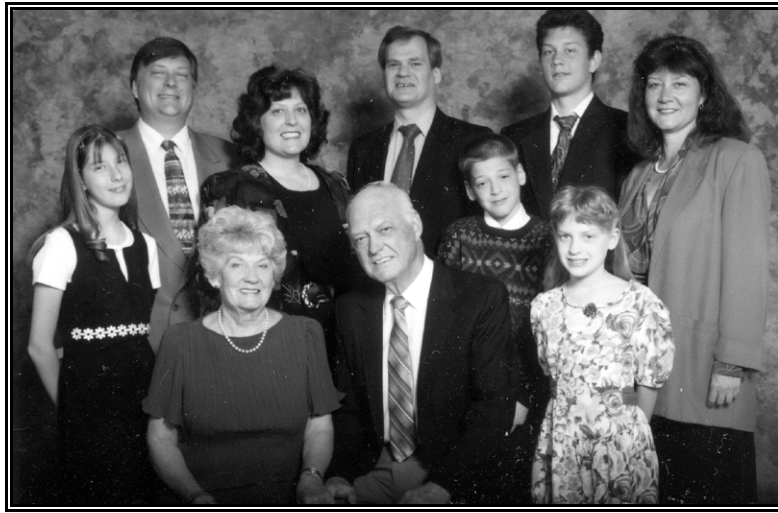
I have always been active in the church and love the gospel. Since moving to Tooele I have taught classes in Sunday School and Primary. I was Secretary in the Genealogical Society and Second Counselor twice and Quilt Director in the Relief Society.

Bill died June 16, 1977. Of a heart attack. Since then I have kept my home and tried to keep the yard and home looking as neat as possible. My children and grandchildren have helped me. Bill never wanted me to work outside the home. He felt the woman's place was in the home. I did sell some of my crocheting and also sold Christmas, birthday and holiday cards. I made pretty good. I remember Dad saying about selling: "There will always be salesmen before you and after you." I have crocheted many articles during my life. I have made about 1,000 baby sets during the past 30 years. I started making one for Christy before she was born and a lady who worked at TOD asked me to make one for her. She took it to work with her and several women called to buy one. Then a friend worked for Mode O Day Clothing Co., and ask me to put my Baby Sets in her store. The orders came so fast, I was injuring my eye sight, so I decided I would just sell from home. I sold the sweater, hat and booties for \$5. I now get \$15 for them. I crocheted a bedspread for Mother; hats and scarfs, vests and shawls for the granddaughters; and 12 afghans for the family. Dwayne asked me to make him one and didn't expect it one Christmas. I have never seen a kid so excited and thrilled over a present in my whole life. He hung on to it and took it with him everywhere Christmas day. I have also made quilts for my family and many people in the ward. I can remember Debra, when she was about 4 years old, telling me one morning, "Grandma, do you know what? You have made everyone else a quilt and you haven't made one for me. I would like one with horses on it." We went down the next day to the store and bought her some material with clowns on it—we couldn't find the horses. I have always tried to treat everyone the same.

I love people and feel fortunate in having so many loyal friends. I have tried to keep in touch with at least one member from each of my family and also my high school friends. I enjoy hearing from them.

The morning after his birth, Ione broke out with Chicken Pox and Clayne had them 10 days after he was born.

Clayne and Nelda would spend most of the summers of their young life in Levan and then as they grew older a lot of their cousins from Levan would come to visit them in Tooele. Clayne was a brilliant student in grade school. He got through high school okay, but most of his interests were in getting "side jobs" so he could buy a car and he had other interests on his mind other than school.

He enrolled in the University of Utah and took several classes. He dropped out of school to marry and run a restaurant in Tooele for a year after which he returned to school. They would wait for the chicken to lay the egg in the morning and go buy candy with that money in the morning and enjoy the candy the rest of the day. Almost all of their relatives had chickens, but they got most of their eggs from Grandma and Grandpa Shepherd. They had fun hauling hay and herding cows. It was especially fun when the hay wagon would turn over – luckily no one ever seemed to get hurt. Nelda wanted to be on the wagon when it turned.

Nelda had a vivaciousness about her that attracted both boys and girls and was a leader among her many friends. She sold tickets and ushered at the Ritz and Strand Theaters and worked in "Tate's Confectionary ." She never seemed to run out of energy or friends including her "Horrible 13 Club." She was a "Straight Arrow" or a "Pure Girl."

Nelda graduated from Tooele High School in 1946, after holding class offices and being a Co- Jr. Prom Chairman, and met her husband, Dale Flinders, when he was home on leave from the U.S. Navy. She had made arrangements to go to a beautician school, but then she decided to marry instead. She did her mother's hair, her daughter's hair, and many others for years. Nelda has received her 15 year award pin in banking and is manager of New Accounts. Dale was an Executive Salesman for Weber Office Supply Co. They lived in South Jordan, Utah, near Salt Lake, in a beautiful townhouse on a golf course. Nelda has always had a love of family and a commitment to serve the Lord through prayer and good deed. 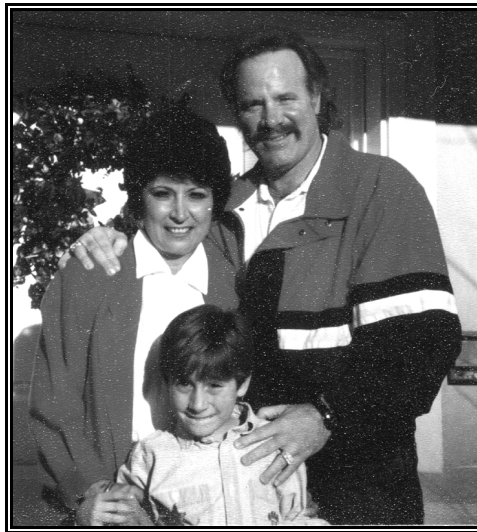

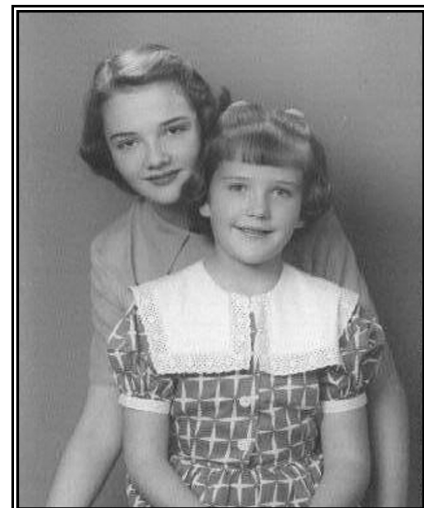

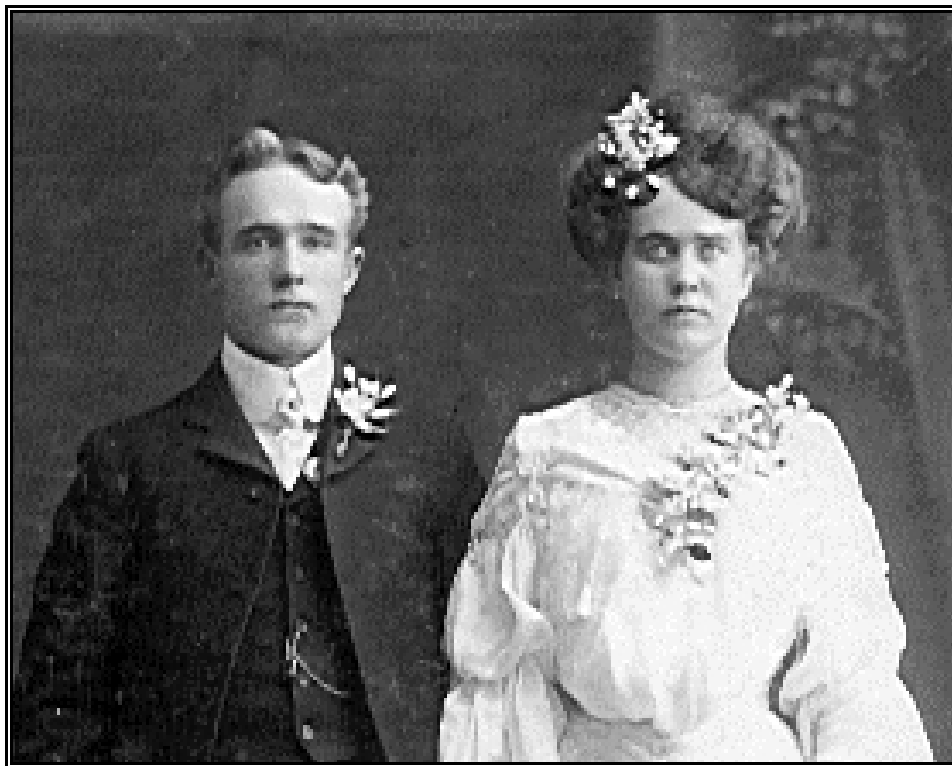

Minnie Amelia Malmgren Jackman April 11, 1883 -- August 20, 1967

I was born April 11th 1883, the tenth Child of a family of twelve children born to Sven Peter and Johanna Malmgren at Levan, Juab, Utah.

I was baptized, in a creek east of town (I think it was called Chicken Creek.) into The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints on 3 Sept 1895 by Erick Petterson and confirmed on 6 Sept 1895 by Nels Oagard.

When sixteen years old I taught a class of eight year old children in Sunday School. I was also a member of the chords at fifteen years, continued singing in different ward chords until at the age of seventy seven.

I went to school in a one room building where all the grades were held in the same room, until the sixth grade, when a new four-room building was built. I finished the eighth grade. Then it was necessary for me to work and help take care of myself.

The first employment I had was working in a ranch home where there were five in the family and four hired men. There was plenty to do, three meals a day, up at five every morning and possibly through doing dishes at around ten o'clock at night. Besides getting meals and doing dishes there was bread to bake, churning butter, washing and ironing, cleaning the house and tending babies. My salary was two dollars a week and my room and board. I was fortunated in obtaining work whenever I needed it.

September 9th 1903; I married James R. Jackman, son of Albert Lester and Mary Francis Jennings, Jackman.

We had born to us two lovely Daughters. Wanda Verdena was born in Juab city, Juab County, June 26th 1904, on her father's 21st Birthday. Erma was born April 29th 1906, In Salt Lake City, Utah.

Verdena had three fine sons, Benjamin (Ben) Joseph Haddock, Gerald (Jerry) Wayne Clark and Richard Dale Clark.

Erma had two lovely daughters Erma Joyce Hardy Jones and Carma Nadine Hardy Black.

I have had the privilege of teaching in Sunday School, Primary, Mutual and Relief Society. was president of the Y.L.M.I.A. for 15 years in the 29th Ward. I was secretary of the Relief Society in the same ward four years, class leader and secretary of the Salt lake Primary Stake Board for six years and class leader of the Park Stake Relief Society for 8 years. I loved the work in all the organizations and have a firm testimony of the Gospel. I know it is true, and that we are blessed according to our faithfulness in keeping the commandments of God. I filled three Stake Missions: one in Salt Lake Stake and two in Riverside Stake. (First Mission Oct 22 1943 to Sept 27, 1946. Second Mission Oct 24 1948 to Sept 24, 1950.)

When Grandmother Jackman was a young girl she liked to play tricks on her brother and sisters. One time she had some cinnamon bark and told them she found it in the log pile. They went looking and tasting all the different barks. She told me about this many times and she would laugh and laugh over this incident. There were other little tricks she did.

She told me how they scrubbed the wooden floors and put fresh straw under the braided rugs they made. They would hang the rugs over the clothes line and beat the dirt off of them.

One of the many birthdays of Great-Grandmother Johanna Rosequist Malmgren's, Grandma Minnie and the two girls rode the train to what was called the "Spur" in Juab City, Juab, Utah. (Juab City isn't there any more.) Someone would come and get them in a wagon and bring them to Levan to Great-Grandmother and Great-Grandfather Malmgren's house. They also stayed with Great-Grandmother and Great-Grandfather Jackman. Grandpa James R. Jackman was the conductor on the Union Pacific Railroad at this same time. A big birthday party was fixed for Great Grandmother Johanna Rosequist Malmgren. The adults ate first and then the children would eat after the adults got through. They stayed about a month and then came back to Salt Lake on the train. Grandma would have a nice visit with her sisters. They were very close and also to their brother. One could feel the love they had for each other and the cousins, nieces and nephews.

They were the only relatives that moved to Salt Lake from Juab County. This was after Verdena was born. Grandma and Grandpa's relatives would come and stay with them for weeks at a time. Some lived with them when they were going to school or working. Grandma told me they had people there all the time at their home. She never complained about the work to care for visitors.

After Grandma and Grandpa moved to Salt Lake their first home was at 140 Apricot St. and today is called the Marmalade District. It is a narrow street, on a steep hill. This house is still in good condition.

The second home they moved to was around Fifth West on third or Fourth North. This house has been torn down.

Their third move was to 523 Chicago street, a brick bungalow; and it is still in very good condition. Grandma's father, Sven Peter Malmgren, passed away in this home. Their second daughter, Erma, was born in one of these homes.

Their last move, the home they bought, was at 1139 West 3rd North (now 4th North) near the fairgrounds. This is the home I remember. Grandma worked at the Onegia School as a cook and made the soup when the girls were younger.

Grandmother worked for the Magnacoil Company in Salt lake City, on third South between Main and State Streets, in the middle of the block upstairs. She worked for about 20 to 25 years. She was called the Head Lady (manager). They made the first electric heating pads and blankets, and sold them in the different towns in the states. It was a large company for years, until the more modernized blankets of today were manufactured. This business finally terminated when Grandma retired.

I lived with her on and off in my early and teen years. Grandmother had a beautiful yard of flowers. Every Sunday that she lived in the 29th Ward Riverside stake, she would bring flowers to the chapel for all the members to enjoy. There were three pine trees in the backyard. Castor bean plants grew along the back of the house and were known to grow as tall as the house. We have a picture of them.

They had a fire in the home about 1932 and it burned many pictures, books and keepsakes. They had to remodel the house. I remember Grandma telling me the home was never the same. I remember the beautiful Oakwood around the doorways, thick and wide going to the living room and dining room. I just loved the beautiful wood. Her yard was as clean and beautiful as she kept her home. Her Mother, Johanna Rosequist Malmgren, passed away in this home.

Grandmother built a duplex in the year 1952 at 1034 and 1036 South 8th East. Her daughter Erma lived on one side and she and Grandpa lived on the other side. It had a patio outside and all the family came for dinners and parties in the summers. A fireplace and barbecue were built and there was always fire in the fireplace at night, all summer long.

She also owned a 4-plex next door that mother lived in until she moved to the duplex.

She cared for her yard and house until June 1967, when her daughter, Erma passed away. Then she went to live with her only living daughter, Verdona.

She got up early in the morning and washed her face and put on her makeup and combed and brushed her long black hair. It turned gray as she got older, and then was bobbed in back of her head.

She would get up early in the morning dressed and then put on her working apron. She never seemed to get any dirt on her. In the afternoon she changed her apron and dress to the clean apron and dress and refreshed herself. She wore a girdle from morning to night. She was always neat and clean and always had love and kisses for all her children and grandchildren.

She would help everyone in need. The neighbors always came to her for help and she gave unselfish love to her own children, and grandchildren. She helped everyone of us any way she could: helping us plant flowers, mend socks, sew buttons on clothes and mend clothes. She had her thimble with her wherever she went. I have that thimble in my possession (Joyce Jones).

She was very sick in her lifetime, but she kept going to the end of her life, and she was always active.

She had breast cancer at age 80, and after the operation she was bobbing her own hair even though all the muscle was removed under her arm.

She cooked red-mush puddings, potato candy, suet pudding and a special dip with a little brandy in it every Thanksgiving and Christmas. It just wouldn't be a holiday (without Grandmother's special pudding).

Grandma gave us root starts of her flowers and I have many of these flowers still growing. I have rose bushes she had when she lived at 1139 West 3rd North in my yard. They are growing still and have flowers on them.

When the grandchildren were ill, grandma would always bring ginger ale for them. We all thought this was a wonderful treat for us.

Grandmother and Mother would make our birthdays so special. They made so much fuss, and the person whose birthday it was felt so (very, very, special) after we sang Happy Birthday, Grandma would always sing, Love Brought Us Here.

Grandmother was active in the Daughters of the Utah Pioneers and was Vice Captain in the Flora B. Horne Camp.

Grandmother was active in the Union Pacific Women Trainmen Ladies Lodge 248. She served as a President.

Grandmother did ceramics as a hobby in her later life. She make a "Rose Doll" ceramic which Aunt Verdena had, until her death. It was passed to me, and I have it now in my possession (Joyce Jones). She made plaques for the wall and made each flower that is on them. My sister, Nadine, has these. She made other ceramics until February 2001. We will always remember her for her goodness. She passed away August 20, 1967 at 84 years of age.

Remembering Minnie

I didn't know Min very well because she lived in Salt Lake, an' we always called on her when we went to Salt Lake. You could go up to Salt Lake for a dollar on the train sometimes. I don't know just what the regular fare was, but you could go up there an' go out to Salt Lake.

The second year we went to Los Angeles, why she come down to visit with us. But we had a Jennie's mother down there at that time an' we was livin' in a house, I know, it quite a big house it was, it was owned by some people named of Reese. But we stayed with those folks, Reeses, that winter, an' Minn come down an' brought the two girls. An' we'd saved enough money to pay our fare back by way of San Francisco. An' so we went up to San Francisco an' looked around a couple of days, an' we went on up to Utah. It must have been in the Spring of the year.

One trip she went with us, an' we had some more friends with us to, buta we went to the Black Hills an' up an' entered West Yellowstone, an' went out of East Yellowstone an' went right up through Montana an' Wyoming an' went into South Dakota.

An' we found out when we got to Spearfish, South Dakota, they was havin' a Passion Play there that the next night. Anda we decided we'd better stay. But when we went to pay for our rooms for that next night they double the pay on us. Instead of paying \$9, we had to pay \$18 to sleep in the same bed. We didn't take those beds. We went on down the rode for ten miles an' got more reasonable rooms to stay at. An' then we just drove back up an' seen the show an' then after the show was over drove back down. An' we was still on our way.

We's goin' down to the see the Black Hills into a big cemetery there where Calamity Jane, Wild Bill Hickok, an' a lot of old noted desperados were buried in there. So we went in there an' then one of the biggest gold mines right in that country. But it was right there, too. Course today they tell me that the town had to move away from where it was located because they've mined this ore right back up to the grassroots. An' the whole country's droppin'. It's going right down. They've taken all the gold, the rock, out from underneath it an' it's droppin'. So that's what they tell me, I believe I read it in the paper too where this is happenin'.

One year Minnie went with us to Hawaii an' we stayed on the beach of Waikiki an' lived in little cabins there. An' it was very nice, but they tell me that about another two years after that why all that stuff was tore down. An' who was it come in there an' built big hotels. An' there's all big high hotels in there now. Buta we had a good time in Hawaii an' then another couple three years after that why Mom an' I we went back again an' with another tour from Provo.

Well, Min worked for a fella, name of Macumsey. An' he made electric blankets for hospitals. An' they were as big as a sheet. An' they put 'em on a hospital bed an' used 'em to keep

people warm an' give 'em treatments, an' this that an' the other. I've still got mine that I believe I bought it off of Mance Jennings. I've still got it, still use it.

We used to go she her at work. They had big machines in there, sewing machines. Big sewing machines they had to sew heavy more like leather. There was a lot of people worked in there. There was always the scraps that was kind of a heavy goods, an' she used to bring those scraps down to Mom. An' Mom 'd cut 'em an' make quilts--Star quilts, Wedding Rings, of every kind. Anything you'd mentioned my Mom'd make 'em. I think she made one for each of her sisters an' she made one for Macumsey, too. I still got some of the quilts there at home.

Oh, finally, they got a car. I don't know jus' what make it was, but we was up to Salt Lake. An' I don't know if we had a car or not, or whether we jus' come up on the train. Anda they had a car. Anda Jim was takin' us out to show us what Salt Lake looked like from an automobile. I remember as we was goin' down Main Street there was a negro crossing the street, an' it kind of startled Jim. Jim thought that the negro was going to stop an' he didn't so Jim had to. An' he pulled over by him' an' he says, "Hey," he say, "Did you know you're flirtin' with an undertaker?" to him. An' the negro just kind of laughed an' wheeling on. But I was kind of glad to get out that ride myself. It kind of scart me a time or two.

Minnie came down, I guess, on the train to Nephi the day Beth was named, and they went to Church with us and named Beth on Grandma's birthday in 1917, the 1st of July, 1917. I think that's the time we took George Howard to wheel us out there in his car. They, Erma and Verdena and Aunt Minnie went out and celebrated Grandma's birthday. It was her 73rd birthday that year.

Beth adds: And I remember that she was always fussy that she had the pans washed before we ate. Once she came to my house and my salt and pepper on the stove was dirty so she washed it for me. I also remember that Uncle Jim was a conductor for the railroad so he traveled all the time.

Oscar Lawrence Malmgren May 11, 1886---September 26, 1965

Lawrence's folks came to the United States and crossed the plains in covered wagons. They were married in Ephraim, Utah on April 24, 1864. They lived first in Circleville, Utah, then went back to Ephraim, and then moved to Levan, Utah.



Oscar Lawrence Malmgren was the 11th of 12 children. He was born May 11, 1886 in Levan. He attended school and graduated from the 8th grade. Shortly thereafter he left and went to Salt Lake City, Utah where he went to work for the city as a street car conductor. It was here that he met Anna Van Houten.

Anna's parents lived at Leavenworth, Kansas, and in High Prairie, Kansas. Religion was important to Anna's family. They walked seven blocks to church each Sunday, and Anna often commented on the reverence of the church meetings. In 1875, they migrated to Utah. Her father was a contractor and builder and a friend of his had started a flour mill and asked him to come and help finish building it. Anna's sister Grace, born August 21, 1876, was the second white child born there. Her parents moved to Salt Lake City, Utah in 1877.

Anna Van Houten was the last of 10 children and was born September 6, 1886 in Salt Lake City, Utah. She attended Lowell School for five years and summer school for three years, where she graduated from the 8th grade.

Her mother became very ill and she, being the youngest, was asked to stay at home with her, which she did for one year. At the end of that time, she decided to go to work instead of back to school. She worked for Great American Tea Store and later at Calloway Hook and Francis Crockery Store.

At this time the family was living on old 11th South, which later became 17th South. She had to ride the street car to and from work each day. The conductor was introduced to her by a friend. The conductor, Oscar Lawrence Malmgren, and she became good friends and courted a year before they were married.

Oscar Lawrence and Anna Van Houten were married at the Van Houten home on April 16, 1908 by Rev. R.G. McNiece. They spent one day in Salt Lake and then left by train for Juab, Utah. Lawrence's folks met them at Juab and then on to Levan by horse and buggy. This was Anna's introduction to her in-laws. They stayed at Levan, Utah for two days and then proceeded to Centerfield, Utah, where Lawrence had purchased a small adobe home. Mother really felt like she had reached the end of the world and total wilderness. She often said in later years she had never been so frightened in her whole life, and if he had brought her here before they were married she was positive she would have changed her mind, but here she was, and no turning back, so she decided to buckle down and make it work.

Lawrence and his friend Alma Dalby had 300 stands of bees, which Alma had taken care of while Lawrence was in Salt Lake working to help with finances to keep the bees going. Lawrence and Alma worked together for quite a few years. Later they split the bees and Alma went back to Levan, Utah.

Anna worked right along with Lawrence in the bees and gradually they had close to over 3,000 stands, as well as 47 acres of land which they farmed and raised cattle.

To this union was born four children: Edwin Lawrence March 9, 1909. Grace Roberta November, 11, 1913. Francis Dwight December, 18, 1919. J. Keith August 27, 1923

Lawrence and Anna lived in the small adobe house until just before Keith was born. At that time they built the home, a bungalow type, in which they resided until both passed away.

Lawrence and Anna worked very hard and diligently to provide a good home and food for their children. We never ever went hungry, but we were taught very early in our lives to be frugal and not to waste.

As children we worked on the farm and with the bees. We were paid wages, and with these wages we bought and paid for life insurance policies, school supplies, recreation, clothing that we felt we needed over and above what was supplied to us.

Mother came from a Presbyterian family and Dad from a Mormon family. We as children had the privilege of attending both denominations and judging the values for ourselves.

Dad always told us, "First to thine own self be true, and then thou canst not be false to any man."

In all our years at home I don't think any of us as children could lie to our parents. You couldn't look Dad in the face and tell even a white lie without him knowing, so consequently we didn't try.

Mom and Dad both were very interested in the community where we lived. They worked with PTA and the old folks committees. Mother was a beautiful piano player and loved her garden and

roses. Dad was Town President and later Mayor. He also was on the Board of Directors for the Gunnison Valley Bank. He was State Bee Inspector for many years. Lawrence was a member of the first group to go find top quality Hereford bulls, and buy some to improve the quality of livestock.

Mother always believed in treating other people as you would like to be treated yourself and she truly practiced it.

Dad was a great listener. If we had problems we could always talk them out. Dad would comment and ask questions, but he never said, "You do that," the decision always was left up to us and right or wrong then we lived with it or corrected it.

Hobos or tramps were quite numerous during our growing up period. I never remember one being turned away by my folks. They always provided them with at least a good meal.

Dad's nephew, Dean Malmgren, after the death of his mother came to live with us about 1927. He lived with us as one of the family until he grew up and married.

In later years Dad finally sold the business to the boys. They were more interested in farming and cattle, so the bees were finally sold and thus ended O.L. Malmgren and Sons honey business, which had supplied all of southern Utah business's and stores with honey.

From Anna's handwritten history
September 22, 1937

We went to Washington, D.C. with Farm Bureau. Toured around in buses and had pictures taken of the group in front of the Capitol Building. We went to Virginia and had dinner then back to Washington, D.C., and toured the points of interest.

We went to Miami, Florida to attend the Farm Bureau National Convention. While in Miami we took a sightseeing trip through the Everglades by boat. On our return the boat caught fire and they sent to Miami to get buses to pick us up.

We went to Havana, Cuba, by boat. We took buses to go sightseeing. We had dinner there and returned to Miami in the evening on a boat.

The tour took us to New Orleans and we toured the city. We took a train to Kansas City. We left the group there and took a train to St. Louis and visited our daughter Roberta and family for a week and came home to Centerfield.

We went with Lawrence's sister and husband, L.G. Hobbs, to the Black Hills of South Dakota. Visited Mt. Rushmore National Monument where Presidents George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, and Abraham Lincoln's faces are carved in Granite which is 6000 ft. high.

Ray and Edna Bardsley and Lawrence and I made a trip to Lehman's Cave National Monument, Nevada. We also made several trips to Bryce and Grand Canyon, also Yellowstone National Park.

Remembering Lawrence

Well all I remember about Lawrence was that he was a tall man. He worked in Salt Lake. He went there when he was very young an' he worked for the street car company in Salt Lake City. Then when he got married, of course, he come down to Levan. He got the folks to meet his wife. He's married in Salt Lake an' that's the first time the folks 'd seen her. An' then he brought her on down to Centerfield to her future home. She said, "I believe if I had seen what I had to live in down here," she said, "I would never have married him." Because she come to just a little adobe house an' a porch on it. An' I believe there was three rooms.

He and Alma Dalby I believe that they had about 30 or 40 stand of bees. But at that time why Dalby took his bees an' went back to Levan, an' Lawrence stayed in Centerfield with his. An' we was readin' in the diary how many thousand stand he finally had when he went out of business. It was several thousand stands of bees that he had when he went out of that business.

I was working out at the Siggard that was about 30 miles or 25 miles away from Centerfield. An' we was building a plaster mill. An' I got Jennie to come down an' stay ta the Hotel a couple of nights, an' then she went back on the train. I went up an' got her, an' she went back on the train. Lawrence picked her up at Mayfield, somewhere an' took her down to Centerfield.

Generally, when we'd go out there, we'd all have something planned. We didn't know what it was to sit around those days. I think I built his barn for him out there while we was out one trip. It didn't take too long.

Well, I used to go out an' go deer hunting with 'em, but it wasn't 'til after I had a truck or had a ton an'-a-half truck that I used ta bring when I come down here deer huntin'. We put our bedding an' all that stuff in it. And they'd go from Centerfield up through the mountains with it. It had a wood rack. They'd put on their hay an' their mattresses or their ticks an' that. They'd sleep on the ground. An' they go up an' stay a whole week.

I remember they'd been up there ahead of me. When I got up there they says, jus' tickled to death, "We got your deer all ready for you an' hung up in the tree out there." I said, "Well darn it. I want to kill my deer to take home. An' they said, "Well, we'll go huntin' in the morning then." We went huntin' in the morning, an' they showed my brother Clarence an' I where to go. An' they was goin' around the other way an' scare the deer right over by us. But they kept sayin', "It's right there in front of you. Right there in front of you," An' we could hear 'em hollering at us, but we couldn't see the deer. Finally, it did come right up to us, pretty close, an' we shot it. So we had a deer, an' they had another one over there for Clarence. We loaded three or four more deer in an' we took off an' come home. But they'd stayed a whole week.

Oh, one time we went up there an' we went as far as we thought we could with the wagon, or should; an' we got out an' started to walk. We walked way up on the side hill, Lawrence an' I. Finally, we set down. An' I thought, well, we're just sittin' down to have a rest. We hadn't been walkin' very fast 'n that. 'N I said, "Well, maybe we better get up an' go again." "No," he says, "Sit right here. They'll come to us up here." So we sit there on that side hill for quite a little while an' finally here came the deer out of a big patch of oak. Seven head come out. I shot but I missed mine seem'd like. Lawrence got one. There was only a couple of bucks out of the herd. But I missed mine an' Lawrence got his. I had mine anyhow down the draw. We had a thing made out a of kind of a lizard affair. We'd take up in there an' lay the deer on 'em. An' had a horse on the thing an' drag out. Two, three deer we'd put on it an' we drug 'em down to where we'd git 'em with a wagon.

Oh, I think I'd been out workin' for Lawrence doin' something out here. Maybe buildin' a barn, maybe helpin' with his bee house or I don't know what I was doin'. But I was goin' home to the other side of Fayette, why there was a nice pig sittin' in the the road, an' I thought, "Boy, there's some pork for me." I had Arvilla with me. I think she'd been out here visitin' somebody. So I got over by it, an' as soon as I stopped the car, why it started to run. An' I got out an' started to run after it, but it could outrun me every step. An' it run through the brushes. It'd run itself into a brush an' git stuck an' by the time I'd git ta the brush why it 'd be out an' gone again. But it wore me right out. So I was tryin' to head it back up towards the road, but I couldn't ever git around it so I had to give up an' let it go. I was give right out. An' the pig was too.

When we got a two-seated car the next year. I bought a two-seater Ford. My brother-in-law had one, Hickman, over in Manti. An' he said he was goin' to turn it in. It was a right good car. An' so Riley Judd, he was the agent for all of Utah maybe I don't know, but I told Riley when he picked it up I'd take it. An' so when they give it up, The Baker Lumber Company, why it was a right good car. An' I drove it for a year before we even had a puncture in it.

Well, the roads used to be terrible. They was just where the wagon wheels run is all you could, where the tracks was along. An' nails was in there in those tracks, an' horseshoe nails, an' horseshoes, an' everything, you'd run on most anything in those tracks. I know once comin' to Manti 'round by Nephi an' Manti down here, I had three punctures. I know we was way late for the supper; somebody's birthdays or something. But we had Burt Jackman an' Em with us.

I think the Swedish part was in 'em. I think that's what the Swedes do. Well, Mom, did the same thing at our house. She, every birthday, or like that, why she had a big supper. We use to have lots of company but we were always glad to have 'em.

Beth adds: Well they were great family for celebratin' birthdays, weren't they? Always trying to find excuses to get together. Oh, Uncle Lawrences and Aunt Anna always hit our house to eat. On their way to Salt Lake they always stopped and had a meal with us comin' or goin' or maybe both ways as they drove to Salt Lake. They used to come to our house a lot, too.

Edwin Lawrence Malmgren
By his wife, Fern Anderson Malmgren

Edwin was born March 9, 1909 to Oscar Lawrence and Anna Malmgren in Centerfield, Sanpete, Utah. He was born in a little frame home that included two rooms and a lean-to. He was the oldest of four children and was baptized a member of the Presbyterian church at a very young age. He attended church with his mother in Gunnison, Utah in a building west of the Gunnison Valley Hospital.

Ed's father was a beekeeper, and as a young boy he worked with his father in the bee yards. He attended the Centerfield public School and graduated from Gunnison Valley High School in 1928. He attended Utah State Agricultural College in Logan, Utah, for two years following graduation. Lawrence and Mr. Dalby dissolved their beekeeping partnership, and Ed became a partner with his father. They were known as O. L. Malmgren and Sons. This name was used on the labels they put on their honey containers. Ed was the oldest in the family and an extremely hardworking man.

On April 3, 1931, Ed and I, Fern Anderson, were married in Junction, Utah. We established our first home in Centerfield. We rented two rooms in the back of the Square Deal Store on Centerfield's main street. Our possessions consisted of a coal-oil lamp, cook stove, breakfast set, cupboard, bed, dresser, trunk, and two linoleum rugs. We used a hydrant to get our water as there was no running water in our rented home. Our milk was separated on a hand-driven separator to make butter. The butter was churned in a wooden churn at Lawrence and Anna's home. We took turns turning the handle on both the churn and the separator.

The first years of our married life, Ed hauled wood for our cook stove with horses and a wagon from the west hills. We used this as fuel and also to cook our food. We bottled our own beef and pork. We raised a large garden and bottled peas, beans, corn, carrots, beets and pickles. We didn't have a refrigerator until we had been married for almost eleven years.

A son was born to us on March 18, 1932. We named him Edwin Darnel. The doctor was Dr. J. A. Hagen and the nurse was Callie Sandstrom. Our son was born at our place and I had to stay in bed for eleven days while the nurse took care of the house and baby. Elliot Childs decided to start up a store in the Square Deal building after our baby was born and so we moved to a little home in north Centerfield. One morning I discovered our house was on fire. Eddie (our baby) was fourteen months old at the time. I remember that the kitchen was on the south side and there was a big window on the

east. Ed had just left for Salt Lake to purchase honey cans, and I had put Eddie in his high chair. I looked out the window and could see smoke pouring out. I picked up Eddie and ran out of the house. I could see one of the neighbors nearby. I called to him, and he came running with a bucket of water. He jumped on the roof and poured the water down the chimney. The water came into the kitchen. People started coming from all around to help with the fire. Most of the furniture was saved, but it showed signs of the fire. The leaves of the table were burned and the linoleum came off the floor in strips. We had to move because of the fire, and the home was never lived in again.

We moved for the third time to a little log house in Centerfield. Uncle Lloyd Hobbs helped Ed build a small two-room home across the street on our own property. The home had a full basement and was built in 1933. Lawrence and Anna's home was located directly west of us. A few corrals and a huge barn separated the two properties. I prepared meals for Uncle Lloyd, and he lived with Lawrence and Anna during the construction of our home. Ed had surgery for appendicitis in 1933 also.

In 1934 another son was born on September 16. We named him Lyle Robert. Dr G. Stanford Rees and his nurse, Mrs. Minnie Taylor, made the delivery in our home. This was a difficult year for us. There was a bad drought, and the depression was also in full swing. We stored our honey in a big warehouse in Centerfield. For several months there was absolutely no sale for the honey. Money was so tight that nothing could be sold. It was a difficult time to meet our debts and obligations without this income.

There were no jobs available during the depression years. The government set up a program called the Worker's Progress Administration (WPA). In our valley, men took their teams and horses and worked on different projects. They were paid for their labor. Ditches and canals were cleaned and work was done in the fields. This was a great help for people who didn't have a job. Teams and horses were used to do all the work. Ed was involved in many of these projects and it was during this time that he received his first Social Security card. For the first few years, farmers did not have to pay into the Social Security fund. Food stamps were necessary to get items of food from the government. Everyone stood in long lines to receive this food. Nylons for women could not be purchased, and people scrambled for the few products that were available.

When the honey market started to improve, Ed and his father purchased more land. Ed's two brothers, Dwight and Keith, were now young men who had graduated from high school and received some education at the University in Logan. Ed, Dwight and Keith bought a farm and pasture in Dover just west of Gunnison. Ed owned one-half interest in the farm. Lawrence owned a farm north of the one Ed and his brothers purchased. Later they bought the farm located on the south.

As the years went by, Malmgren's had bee yards as far north as Fayette, Utah and as far south as Circleville, Utah. Some were also located in Piute and Sevier counties. They extracted and processed their honey crop each year, and owned their own equipment. Eddie and Bob were small at the time, but they were hired by the business to carry honeycombs and frames for the hives back and forth at the bee yards. They were paid wages and encouraged to save their money. Each of them had a bank account. They had a lot of fun experiences during this time. They also loved to brag about their many bee stings. The Malmgren's sold honey in most communities between Centerfield and Fredonia, Arizona, for approximately 25 years. They were known as O. L. Malmgren and Sons.

During these years, we had many happy experiences as a family. Dwight and Keith both got married and many family trips to the canyon were enjoyed with their families. Lawrence's children and their families took many trips to the bee yards throughout the state and enjoyed picnics together.

Thanksgiving and Christmas each year with Lawrence and Anna's family and the Anderson family. Some years we did not have our own Christmas tree. We enjoyed the trees at our parent's homes.

As the years went by, Ed's health began to fail. We noted that he became very, very thirsty. He took several gallons of water with him to the bee yards each day. He was later diagnosed with Diabetes at the age of 35. The first time he went to the doctor, he had to stay in the hospital because of his high sugar level. It was during this time that Eddie began to have severe problems with his eyes. This was a trying time for our family because the medical community did not know much about these types of problems. Ed suffered many complications in his remaining years (Rabbit Fever, Encephalitis, and Diabetic reactions).

A daughter, Faye LaDawn, was born on February 21, 1942 at the Gunnison hospital. She was delivered by Dr. and Mrs. G. Stanford Rees. A son, Ira Rodge, was born on January 11, 1946 at the Gunnison hospital. He was delivered by Dr. G. Stanford Rees also.

When Ira was about one year old, we built an addition onto our home. Ed, Dwight, Keith and Lawrence did the construction work.

Ed was the Centerfield town mayor from the years 1947 to 1950. The city purchased the first road grader while he was the mayor.

Some years later the bees were sold, and the Malmgren's purchased another farm between Gunnison and Dover. It was purchased from Will Gribble and was later known by all as "Wills". They started to farm the land and purchased cattle. Ed enjoyed branding the cattle. He did a lot of irrigating at Dover and always rode a horse with a shovel thrown over his shoulder. The kids loved to go along with him. They also drove the tractor and helped on the farm. It was a big event each spring when the men in the family and many of the children took the cattle to the mountains. Each person rode a saddle horse and helped herd the large herd. In the fall, the roundup brought the same type of excitement. Our children enjoyed having their own horse to ride then and throughout the entire year.

Ed was a very good provider. We always had plenty to eat and most everything we needed. He always had a granary full of grain, a potato cellar full of potatoes and other vegetables, and a garage full of honey. He was gifted in auto mechanics and could fix any of the cars or farm machinery. He was always busy everyday and many nights. He and the "honey clan" moved bees at night. He helped chop hay at night and in the early morning hours while the dew was on the hay. This made the hay easier to harvest. We belonged to a group of friends whom we socialized with for many years. This was a very enjoyable part of our lives.

The Malmgren's were just getting well established with their farm and cattle when Ed passed away. He died in the Gunnison hospital on September 16, 1958 from Nephritis, another complication of the Diabetes he endured for many years. Eddie and Bob were both married, Faye was sixteen years old, and Ira was twelve. His burial was in the Centerfield cemetery. His temple work was completed at the Manti temple on May 4, 1960.

History of Roberta Malmgren Warburton Hammond

Written by herself July10, 1998

I was born November 11, 1913 at home in the small town of Centerfield, Sanpete, Utah the second child of Oscar Lawrence Malmgren and Anna Van Houten. Dad's folks were Sven Peter Malmgren born in Malmo, Sweden February 23, 1841. His mother was Johanna Rosequist born in Malmo, Sweden July 1, 1844. Mother's folks were Peter Van Houten Sr. born in New York City, May 5, 1834. Her mother was Mary Josephine Wilson born in New Concord, Ohio September 14, 1842.

My father was born in Levan, Juab, Utah. My mother was born in Salt Lake City, Salt Lake, Utah. After finishing school my father went to Salt Lake and got a job as a streetcar conductor. My mother rode the street car on her way to work. A friend of Mothers introduced her to Lawrence in 1906. They became good friends and decided to get married. Reverend R. G. McNiece married them at the Van Houten home April 16, 1908. Dad and Mother left Salt Lake by train to Juab. Then by horse and buggy to Levan, where my Mother met her in-laws. They stayed at Levan, Utah for two day's then traveled to Centerfield, Utah where Dad had a small adobe house and 30 stands of bees owned by Dad and his friend Alma Dalby. My mother stated if she wasn't already married, she would have flown the coop.

I had three brothers Edwin Lawrence Malmgren born March 9, 1909, Francis Dwight Malmgren born December 18, 1919 and J. Keith Malmgren born August 27, 1928. As children we worked on the farm and with the bees. We were paid wages and with these wages we paid for life insurance policies, school supplies, recreation and clothing that we felt we needed over and above what was supplied us. Mother came from a Presbyterian family and Dad from a Mormon family. We as children had the privilege of attending both denominations and judging values for ourselves.

I attended the local elementary in Centerfield, grades 7th thru 12th in one building for junior high and high school at Gunnison Valley High, and graduated May 1931. While in high school I had been dating LaVar Rosenberg. After graduation we decided to get married. We went to Salt Lake with my folks where he purchased and gave me a diamond. After being back home for several months I was going to Salina one day and along the way I ran into LaVar and some of his friends. He had a girl he was hugging and kissing. Well, I went home took off his diamond, put it back in the box and delivered it to his mother. LaVar came to see me and I told him to scat. If he couldn't be trusted before marriage I certainly didn't have faith he would be afterward.

I convinced my Dad to send me to Salt Lake and let me attend Henager Business College. This was during the depression years and I knew he couldn't afford college tuition. After graduating from there I went to work for the Telephone Company as a clerk in the accounting department. While working at the Telephone Company I met Thomas Ira Warburton and we decided to get married. We were married in a formal wedding ceremony at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Salt Lake City on November 7, 1940. Ira was born November 7, 1915 at Etna, Utah. He attended Grouse Creek, Box Elder County, public school and graduated from Box Elder high school, Brigham City, where he played basketball and football. He also attended Henager Business College in Salt Lake City.

Ladies at the Telephone Company at the time were not allowed to keep working. About this time World War II was becoming quite a big item. I went to work for a company making war material. We knew that Ira would be drafted because we didn't have any children. He definitely wanted to join the Air Force, but I would have to sign papers giving my permission. After a good deal of consideration I signed the papers and he was accepted into the Air Corps. After leaving Salt Lake and training in Kansas, I was allowed to join him and live off the base. When he finished his training and was shipped overseas. I came home. I knew I was pregnant so I went to Centerfield to live with my folks. Our daughter Vicki was born December 19, 1943 in Salina, Sevier, Utah.

March 1944 I received a telegram from the War Department that Ira was missing in action over Yugoslavia since April 16, Pilot of a B-17 bomber, Second Lieutenant Warburton 28, enlisted in the army air forces in May 1942, and was called to active service five months later. On September 18, 1945 he was declared dead by the War Department.

My Dad purchased a home for me in Salt Lake and I returned and went to work for an attorney. Dad's sister came to live with me and to take care of Vicki. My friends Dale and Donna Coburn called and asked me to go on a blind date with their friend. The friend was Spencer Hammond. He drove a truck for Coca-Cola. Later I needed a partner to go to a party, I called Spencer and he said he would go. We became good friends and went together. Later on he asked if I would marry him and we went to Las Vegas, Nevada and were married at Wee Kirk "O" Heather on March 3, 1947. We returned to Salt Lake and settled down which included my daughter Vicki Warburton now 3 years old.

Our daughter Kaye was born March 12, 1949 in Salt Lake City, Utah. Our son Blake was born September 20, 1950 in Salt Lake City, Salt Lake, Utah. Spence was working for Underwood when they sent us to Kirkwood in 1953. We left Kirkwood and came back to Salt Lake in 1956, Spence still worked at Underwood. Spence finally left there and went to work for Brandom Kitchens. He left there and went to work for Oscar Chytraus Company as a salesman. As the children became old enough to be at home alone during the day, I went back to work at the Telephone Company. After 5 years they bridged my services with the years I had worked previously.

Vicki married Douglas Chapman, finished High school and attending the University, lived in an apartment in our home in Salt Lake City. Four children blessed their home, Kaelyn, Jeffrey,

Russell moved to California where Karen was born. Vicki divorced Doug and moved back to Salt Lake. She married Robert Lambert, they have one son Michael Lambert. They moved back to California. Vicki now has a company called Lambert Appraisal Service.

Kaye left school and Salt Lake and went to California and married Michael Krautkraemer. They had two sons, Lincoln and Matt Krautkraemer. When they divorced Kaye and the boys came to St. George to live with us. She finished her education and is now a teacher living in California.

Blake graduated from Highland High School and other schooling. He met Robin Beck and married February 23, 1982 in Salt Lake City, Utah. They moved to Mesa, Arizona, where their first son was born, 18 February 1988, Nicholas Blake Hammond. They moved back to Utah in Sandy. A second son was born 14 August 1992, Sean Spencer Hammond. May 20, 1996, Benjamin Robert Hammond was born in Salt Lake City, Salt Lake, Utah. Blake manages an office for Republic Mortgage Corporation.

I retired from the Telephone in March, 1976 and moved to St. George, Utah April 1976. Spence remained in Salt Lake and sold our home. He moved down in October. We belong to the Bloomington Country Club and have enjoyed over 22 years here. We had a great time when our children and grandchildren visit us. 1997 we celebrated 50 years of marriage, with a surprise party from our children, they invited friends and family. What a great time had by all.

In 2001 we sold our home in St. George when needing help with our health. We moved to California and lived near Vicki and her family. August 2002 we moved to Sandy, Utah, near our son Blake and his family to a Senior Retirement Housing.

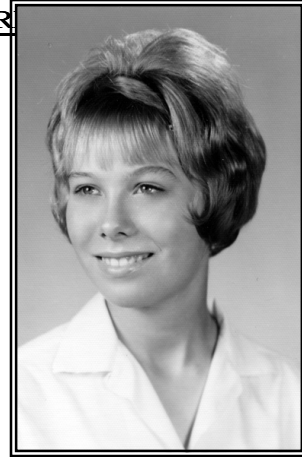

F. Dwight Malmgren 18 December 1919 - 19 July 1998

F. Dwight was the 3rd of 4 children born 18 December 1919 in the family home in Centerfield, Utah. He is the son of Oscar Lawrence (O.L.) Malmgren and Anna Van Houton. He was raised in the house that Lawrence built in Centerfield, Sanpete, Utah. He attended Centerfield Elementary grades kindergarten to 6th grade after graduation attended 7th - 12th grades at Gunnison Valley High. Dwight was involved in school activities that were limited with the workload he did with the family Bee business, O.L. Malmgren and Sons, and they kept expanding the farming enterprise. Upon graduating from High School he took over the management of the farming interest of the family's business. On a \$30 dollar Scholarship (big help in those days) he attended Utah Agricultural College (AC) in Logan, better known today as Utah State University. Auto Mechanics was his major till his junior year when he switched to Building Construction. He also took Agricultural courses. All this time he was dating the most beautiful and talented girl in Gunnison, Geneal Roberts, she came from a family of 8 children, General was 11 years old when her mother died after giving birth to a baby girl they named Grace. She was majoring in Home Ec., affiliated with the Zau-Tau sorority and Spur Organization a riding group were she was jumping horses in competition.

They were married 14 June 1941 at the Malmgren family home in Centerfield. That fall they returned to college in Logan. Geneal's father, Howard Roberts, was still helping with her college and Dwight's folks were helping with his college expenses. Then war broke out and his younger brother Keith and his cousin Dean Malmgren went into the military. (Dean had lived with the family since his 14th birthday after he lost both of his parents. Dean's dad Henry was Lawrence's older brother.) This required Dwight and Geneal to go home to help on the farm leaving both of them short of credits for graduation. They moved in with Geneal's widowed father to help raise the younger children till he remarried. That December Geneal went to work in Manti, Utah, at the parachute factory until their first child, a son, was born.

They rented their first home in Centerfield. Geneal's father helped them buy two acres in Gunnison a block west of the family home. They built their home at 68 W 200 South. With the war on they choose to build a basement home, where most of the home is underground. In 1954 they built the upstairs or Rambler home as it is today adding larger rooms on the main level. They were blessed with two children. Lee P Malmgren was born August 4, 1944 in Salina Hospital, he was so tiny weighing in at 5 lbs. A daughter Diane arrived April 15, 1946 and was delivered at the New Gunnison Valley Hospital by Dr. G. Stanford Rees weighing 7 lbs. with dark hair and blue eyes.

Malmgren Honey had bee hives all over the southern part of Utah. The whole clan helped. They tell that when Grandma had Keith she was nursing him and it was harvest time for honey, so when he was through nursing she would place him a long way from the hives for his nap then go back and help Grandpa, Edwin, Roberta, Dwight and Dean gather the honeycombs from the hives. Arriving back home the process started of getting the honey out of the wax pockets called combs by running it through a press then heating the honey that had been placed in a special vat, next the can's and bottles needed the labels applied with the company name Malmgren and Sons Honey. When it was ready to be delivered the large truck was loaded and they traveled all of Southern Utah selling the honey. Each year for the local and county parades the families built a float with beehives and all the cousins were dressed as bees and a beekeeper with the smoker, to collect the honey.

In 1950 the Bee Business was sold and the farming enterprise was expanded with the purchase of another farm between Gunnison and Dover. It was purchased from Will Gribble and was later known by all as "Wills". They started to farm the land and purchased cattle, red with white faces, Herefords. Dwight did the irrigating at Wills and always rode a horse with a shovel thrown over his shoulder. He broke the horse's that we had and trained them to work with the cattle and we can't forget his well mannered dogs that were great to help with the cattle. Crops like corn, beans, peas, potatoes, tomatoes and other garden items were all raised at the farm and at harvest time all the women gathered at his house in Gunnison to clean and bottle the crop.

Dwight had a work schedule that our neighbors could set their clock's by. He was up at the crack of dawn to milk and feed the cows that were at the house. When Lee was old enough he took over. Our dog and cats lined up on the fence for a squirt of fresh milk. Lee, of course, had to make sure Bessy was hobbled so as not to kick over the milk bucket. Then into the house and run it through the separator to separate the milk and cream so on Saturdays Geneal and Diane could churn butter. Next, Dwight would catch and saddle the horse, then load in the trailer. At this same time Geneal was fixing breakfast and Diane was feeding and tending to the chickens. Then Dwight was off to the farm working until noon. Also, in Gunnison the firehouse rings the noon siren. Then Dwight came home for lunch and a power nap for an hour, then he was back to the farm until dusk. At haying time he was up at 2 a.m. and at the farm chopping while the dew was on the hay. His brother Keith drove the tracker with the chopper and the kids drove the wagons to haul the chopped hay to the yard where it was unloaded from the wagons that Dwight had designed and built. Then Dwight, driving the loader tracker, would stack the hay, with another person on the hay stack packing the hay to keep it straight. They stopped each day after the sun came up and usually put up three crops in a good year. The brothers maintained and repaired all the equipment.

Each spring with grazing permits everyone would help take the cattle up to the mountains. The older one's rode saddle horse's with the dogs nearby. The pickups and cars with the small ones and the food would follow or meet them at a spot for lunch. Then they would pack up go on. Everyone started at 1 or 2 a.m. to begin the cattle drive. Most times it took a couple of days to get the cattle high enough on the mountains for the allotted grazing permits. The cattle rangers were hired to live at the cabin in the mountains all summer and patrol the mountains helping with stray calves and killing lions or bear if they killed any cattle. Then end of summer and before the deer season started, the cattle needed to be brought down to lower country or back to the farm to keep them alive. Many deer hunters didn't know what they were shooting at and would kill the cattle. After the cattle were home, the crops were in, and the county fair was over, it was time for a week or two for the men in the hills for deer hunting to provide food for each family thru the winter. When the deer were brought back to the home they would be hung up and aged then all the families got together and cut and wrapped all the meat and divided it equally. Great memories but back breaking work.

On September 16, 1958, Dwight lost his older brother Edwin from Diabetes and Nephritis. He and Keith purchased the farm, later splitting it and Keith sold his part.

In the fall of 1962 Dwight had the opportunity to purchase a purebred Hereford business. Lee became a partner after he completed his Diesel Mechanics course at the Salt Lake Trade Tech in 1966. Lee had also attended Utah State University in Logan after High school, at this time Keith kept the commercial cattle.

The motto of the Malmgren Herefords was "Breed the Best, Forget the Rest". HHH Regal Lad became the only Super Register of Merits Bull in the state of Utah and one of 63 in the United States. This Super Sire's offspring won every trophy that was given at the Red Bluff Bull Sale. No other

Hereford Sire has that honor. Their cattle topped sales and won First's all over the country. They also had the heaviest Senior Yearling Bull to ever show in Denver and the bull won 'First in Class' in twelve shows; in the 1981-1982 season he was undefeated.

Dwight helped organize the Sanpete Cattleman's Association, he was Director and later President and State Director. He served as President of Dover Irrigation Co. and Director of Gunnison-Fayette Canal Co. He was Treasure, Secretary and Director of the Sevier River Water Users.

On the sixth of March 1980, Dwight was paralyzed from the waist down in an auto accident. His spinal cord was severed, leaving Dwight confined to a wheel chair. His wife Geneal was driving, she died instantly. They were driving from Gunnison to Salt Lake City to the Cattle Convention where Dwight would be speaking. Dwight was sleeping on the back seat of their green Lincoln. They were traveling north on Highway 89 and just crossed the border of Sanpete County to Juab County. There was snow and slush on the road. They were traveling slow when they hit a slick spot that spun the car in front of an oncoming large truck loaded with building materials. It through the car engine 40 feet, crushed and caved in the front of the car killing Geneal on impact and throwing Dwight on the car floor hump. This severed his spinal cord. Dwight was taken to Provo hospital. Then, when he was able to travel, he was moved by ambulance to Holy Cross Hospital in Salt Lake City where his daughter Diane lived and could oversee his three months of rehabilitation. He had no feeling from the waist down and was wheelchair bound as a parapalegic.

Once leaving the hospital a van was purchased with a lift so he could drive himself around and still oversee the Ranch from the van or his wheelchair. He still kept the books and served on many boards. In 1981, Dwight had a specially built home constructed next door. Lee then sold his home and moved into the Dwight's family home.

Now on Sundays you would find Dwight at the 2nd ward of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Two out-of-state missionary assigned to Gunnison taught him the discussions. On October 12, 1985 he was baptized and then confirmed with all his family in attendance. Geneal's work was completed by daughter Diane Mathews in the Jordan River Temple 1982.

On March 9, 1998 Dwight attended graveside services at the Gunnison City Cemetery for his Grandson Shaun Malmgren Mathews age 16, who died of Pneumonia, at South Davis Community Hospital in Bountiful, Davis, Utah. There was a chilly, cold breeze with the sun hiding behind a cloud. Dwight got chilled and the next day entered the Gunnison Valley Hospital with pneumonia where he stayed, except for 12 days at the Mayfield Community Care Center, until his passing July 19, 1998 buried in the Gunnison Cementry.

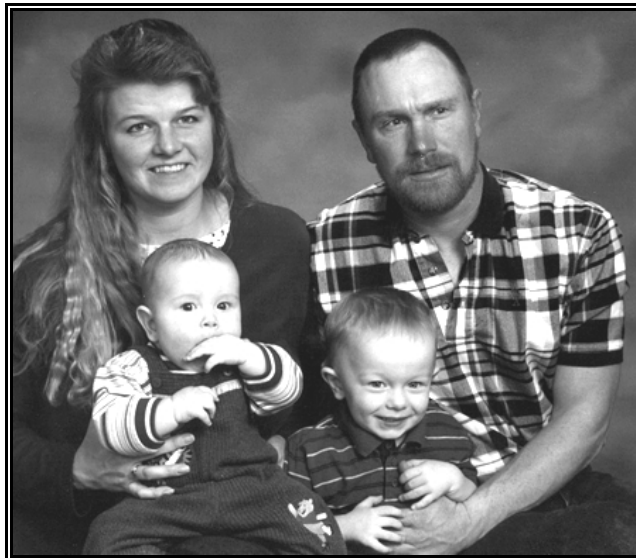

Came home to an older brother, Lee, in the home her father and his family had helped build at 68 West 200 South in Gunnison, Sanpete, Utah. Attended kindergarten thru 6th grade at Lincoln Elementary. Talents, dancing and accordion group with Rita Hill and Dixie Snow. 7th grade thru 12th at Gunnison Valley High. School was a lot of work and a lot of play. Played saxophone in the band, Toe danced at assembles and the BYU homecoming with Portica Peterson, Judy Beck, Lorene Kump. 1962 won the State 4-H Dress Review and a trip to National in Chicago; traveled by train. Was 2nd and 1st Attendant, then Miss Rodeo Sanpete County. Gunnison High

School Future Farmers of America Sweet Heart 1964. Active in the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. At the age of 8 she and her brother, Lee, (who was 9 years old) were baptized by Frank Bradley in the Gunnison 2nd Ward. Helped on the farm, driving trackers hauling hay, moving cattle on foot or on a horse, hoeing sugar beets, helping with the family honey business, building frames with all the cousins.

Graduated Cosmetology College in Provo after one year working in Salons, then married and moved back to Gunnison and opened Fashion Beauty Salon for 7 years. After a divorce moved to West Valley City Teaching at Cosmetology School and then excepted a National Consultant job with Zoto's International traveling and teaching in the seven northern western states 5 years. Then joined 1978-1980 Clairol International as an assistant district manager for the same territory .

1980 March 6th Friday, her mother was killed in a car accident as Diane was working in Portland, Oregon, and was scheduled to fly to Seattle, Washington. She listened to the still small voice that said to change airline tickets to fly back home for the weekend. Then she called the national Clairol office with the change and they said that her parents had been in an accident. She returned home that evening to visit her dad in the Provo hospital, planned her mother's services with her brother, Lee, and family. Then had her Dad moved to a hospital in Salt Lake, Holy Cross Hospital where, where she would be able to help in the care and rehab he would need. As her Dad was getting ready to go back to Gunnison they went out to a restaurant and had a good laugh. Her Dad, Dwight, was still wearing a plastic body brace with a neck support in front. It needed to be loosened and moved to eat. She asked the waiter if they would check to see if they had a screwdriver so she wouldn't need to go the her car. The waiter looked at them kind of funny and stated that they would need to go to a private club to drink. They had a good laugh and then asked for the tool called a screw driver. There were lots of barriers when going anywhere with wheelchairs Three months later her Dad went back to his home in Gunnison where he was cared for by Lee, Linda and kids.

At this time Diane been attending an evening Institute class that Dave Rees, the fellow she was dating, had signed them up for. The teacher was Brother Mathews. His wife died of cancer. He called for a date; They got along; and he ask her to marry him in August. She met the rest of the family.

It was a beautiful sunny day September 5, 1980. She was married in the Salt Lake Temple to James (Jim) David Mathews from Nephi, Juab, Utah. She became wife, stepmother to seven, Sally 6, Scot 9, Shannon 12, Steven 15, Sauni 17 and grandmother to Callie Piper, Jenny Hunter granddaughter's age 3 mother-in-law Susan and David Hunter, Shellie and C.A. Piper.

In 1981, their son was born three months early on April 26 and weighing 2 lbs 15 ozs. It was a blessing for him to be alive, but what a lot of work and learning of medical terms. Shaun was a happy child and very loving. They mainstreamed his education at Oak Hill Elementary and started a classroom for the handicap. He was living at South Davis Community Hospital in Bountiful, Utah and was attending Bountiful High when he became ill and died 6 March 1998 at 5 a.m. on a snowy morning. He was buried in Gunnison, Sanpete, Utah.

When Shaun was small, Diane had a Beauty Salon in their Bountiful home but she closed it and went for her Real Estate License in 1987. Shaun was unable to stand or walk. Shaun lived at home until the last few years of his life.

Diane taught 4-H clubs, many years and held many callings in the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Jim and Diane were Stake Missionaries assigned to the 2nd Ward in Bountiful, Utah. They both were Bountiful Temple Workers and Primary leaders. Diane was an active member in the Community Davis Chamber, a leader with the Davis Lakesiders and Women in Business. As a realtor she taught at the Salt Lake Board of Realtors.

Year 2002 honored with the Certified Residential Specialist of Utah for years of service in Real Estate. The children are married; They have 25 grandchildren and 2 great grandchildren and 2 more on the way. They accepted a Couples Mission call to Calgary, Canada, for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints for 2 years.

J. Keith was born August 27, 1923 the 4th child of Oscar Lawrence and Anna VanHouten Malmgren in Centerfield, Sanpete, Utah, USA. His folks were building a new home at the time so they finished one room so he could be born in the new home. He was welcomed by Edwin, Roberta and Dwight.

Keith's father and brother Edwin had a beekeeper partnership known at O.L. Malmgren and Sons. This name was used on the labels they put on their honey containers. As a young boy Keith worked with his family in the bee yards. As he got older he also worked on the farm and with the cattle. In the spring and during harvest they would work late into the night so they could work in the bees during the day.

He grew up and attended Centerfield Public School and played the trumpet in the band. He attended junior high and high school at Gunnison Valley High. Keith was on the track team and played in the band and was a member of a dance band that played for all the school dances.

Keith attended Ag Utah State University in Logan. The Second World War broke out and he enlisted into the Army. Keith attended basic training in Texas and Mississippi. He was sent to Germany. While there he drove convoy trucks through Germany and France.

After returning from the service he went back to work in the family business of farming and bees. One day as he was coming from the farm he saw his future wife walking home from school, he stopped to talk to her. She had met him before as he had been dating one of her girl friends. Her name was JoBerta Averett. She was the 4th child of Thomas Issac and Estella Sorensen Averett. They started dating in the fall of 1947. She was active in school, held several class offices, and was a cheerleader. March 29, 1948, JoBerta's birthday, he gave her a ring and they were married June 11, 1948. They moved into an apartment in Gunnison. JoBerta went back to school in the fall, later quit because she was going to have their first child. He was born March 28, 1949. He was very tiny weighting only 4 1/2 pounds and 18 inches long. We named him Jody Keith. When we arrived home from the hospital we both got sick and had to go to Centerfield where we stayed with Grandma and Grandpa Malmgren. Dr. Stanford Rees had made an incubator which we had to keep Jody in for 6 weeks until he weighted 5 1/2 lbs.

We soon found a home in Centerfield and moved there. We were blessed with four more children: Craig H., Sherrie, Van L., and Cindy. As the kids grew up we took a few trips. One we enjoyed was to Yellowstone Park where we meet some very good friends, Vernile and Veron Fjeldsted, and their girls. We loved to go to the Canyons camping and fishing.

We had cows and chickens. Jody and Craig milked the cows and they sold the milk for their spending money. As they got older they worked on the farm and also for the farmers in town. Van had a paper route, one morning when he was passing the papers he found one of his customers, an older lady, that had passed away in her yard. He came home to get us so we could get help and get in touch with her family. He also worked at a service station. Sherrie worked at a drive-in. All the children attended Gunnison Valley Elementary and graduated from Gunnison Valley High School.

Keith sold the farm and then worked at the Salina Auction and for some of the farmers in the valley. He had a heart attack. At that time he had surgery. It lasted for a few years. He then had to have open heart surgery. When he recovered from this we had many good times with a group of friends going camping and four wheeling.

Keith was baptized into the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. He held many callings in scouting for 30 years and received the 2nd Miler award for service in scouting. He also served as Centerfield Ward Finance Clerk. He enjoyed this calling but when his sight was failing he was released. He was a Charter Member of the American Legion and served as a member of Centerfield Town Board.

Keith and JoBerta spent their 50th wedding anniversary on June 11, 1998 with a surprise party from their kids and friends. Just shortly after this, on the 4th of July, we went camping with friends. History of Jennie V. Malmgren Hobbs
Written by herself September 1940

I was born December 4, 1888 in the little town of Levan, Utah, the twelfth child of Sven Peter and Johanna Rosequist Malmgren. All of my grandparents had passed on before I arrived so I have always felt that I missed a great deal in life. My childhood days were very happy ones. I played with my sister Minnie and brother Laurence just older than I. We were always up to something, Min could roll her stomach so Laurence and I could hear it, and tell us that she was dying, so that we would pick up all of the potatoes for her, and one day mother gave Min a piece of cinnamon stick, Min gave me a taste of it, and I wanted some so she told me she got it at the wood pile so I went down and tasted wood for quite some time trying to find a piece like it. As soon as I was old enough I herded fathers cows out on the farm and sewed doll clothes and made up sad songs while watching the cows. Our neighbors all had large families as well as my parents, and most every evening all the children would congregate in the street and play games until time to go to bed.

I always enjoyed my dolls, and one Christmas there was a big doll in the store window that is what I wanted very badly. I watched it until it was taken out of the window. It was the custom in Levan to have a community Christmas tree at the Church on Christmas morning, and Santa would give the children their presents. When I arrived at the church the doll was hanging on the tree, but I hardly dare hope it was for me, but sure enough it was, I doubt that any little girl has ever loved a doll more. My sister Nell was ten years older than I, so she went away to work, but when she was home she would always do my pigtails and ringlets, and once she brought me a lovely set of dishes.



I always enjoyed school very much. The year that I was in seventh grade I had to stay out quite a bit and help mother as her health was so bad. On graduation day one of my girlfriends and I went away and cried because we were afraid that we weren't going to make our grade, but to our happy surprise we did. I was not permitted to go away to college, mother was ill so frequently that I was needed at home. When I was seventeen I went to Nephi to work in the County Assessors office for a few months. It was a while there that I met my future sweetheart and husband. Our families had known each other for years, but he was always absent when we called at their home,(bashful).

When I went to Nephi I was keeping company with Alma Dalby who I liked very much. When Father Hobbs told me he was bringing his sons to Levan to work on the plaster mill, and didn't want the girls to keep them up late, I thought "You needn't tell me that, I'll never keep your sons up.", but when they arrived in town all the girls were so crazy about them that I soon got interested too, and was one of the first to disobey Father Hobbs.

A year later (1906) Mother was taken to the hospital in Salt Lake City for a gall bladder operation and I kept house for father. That winter I was given a position of teaching school for three months and was offered the job for the next year, but it meant going to school that summer. Mother came home from the hospital and needed me so I could not accept. That experience of school teaching was one of the happiest memories of my life.

Lloyd and I had a most happy courtship. He used to carry my egg basket home from the store for me most every evening. I used to sing with Lloyd and Cloe Shepard, and one evening I took Lloyd over with me to their place to practice, and while we were singing he was playing with a thimble he found handy, and flipped a little cross-eyed kid on the forehead and made him cry, I nearly died. He had a very fine horse and buggy and we had many pleasant rides together. It used to take him three hours to ride the eleven miles to Levan to see me, and he usually spent a good share of the night riding home.

One of my closest girl friends was Eva Jennings (McGee), and she and I had great fun dolling up an old horse of fathers and hitching it to a cart and taking a ride to cause a bit of excitement. It was a real struggle to keep the horse moving. One day we decided to use Eva's fathers buggy instead of our cart. It took us nearly an hour to lead the old horse up to Eva's after driving for some time, and it really took persuasion to keep "old Dick" on his feet Eva said, "I will have to help take Dick home?" I said, "I'll say you will". She said "Well we will unhitch the horse at your place and I'll pull the buggy and harness home". Another time we were all settled so comfortably on the Fourth of July in the old white top buggy watching the sports, Mother and Father in the front seat and Eva and I in the back with dusters over our laps. I noticed "Old Dick" had gone to sleep and slouched over on the other horse so I said, "Daddy, Dick has fainted." Eva always got such a kick out of the way I used to read the Swedish paper "kerrespondenten" to her. I really knew a very few Swedish words, but I managed.



Lloyd and I decide to be married September 27, 1911 in the Salt Lake temple. It was quite an ordeal leaving home as I was the last to leave and we had planned a California honeymoon, however we didn't rush off as we spent a week saying goodbyes which could be done in a day.

Lloyd come to get me on Friday night, we spent Saturday saying goodbye at Levan; Sunday at Nephi; Monday we went to Salt Lake; Tuesday we bought the license; Wednesday we were married in the Temple by Anthoney H Lund; Thursday we bought our tickets to California; and Friday we left on our honeymoon. We move much more rapidly now.

It was a most delightful trip and our lives have been just one long honeymoon ever since.

We went to California by train and stayed at the Rosslyn Hotel in Los Angeles for some time.

Later we rented a little cottage on 53rd Street. We had a grand time sightseeing and met such a nice group of people, Gertie and Fred Hoffman, Mrs. McNamee and Frankie, Ora and George Frenier, Aunt Emma and Uncle Meads, Frank Meads, Roy and Lue Meads and countless others. While Lloyd was at work I would take rides in the country with Frank Meads and George Frenier (relatives).

Mother, Father and Uncle Rosequist came to visit us the 23rd of November, and stayed until the last of February. January 28, 1912 Father Hobbs came down and stayed until my folks went back.

We had such a grand visit together. After Father returned home his health began to fail and we came home May 1, 1912 because he was ill. He passed away on May 12, 1912. Daddy and I had always been real pals and it was our first real sorrow.

We spent the next winter in California and took Mother with us but we missed Daddy so much.

The summer of 1914 Father Hobbs and Lloyd built a well driller and Lloyd drilled wells and I went with him and lived in the dearest little camp house that Lloyd equipped for me. In 1915 we bought a lot on the corner of fourth south and second west in Nephi from Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Brough, and began building us a new home. Lloyd worked days, and we spent evenings and mornings on the house, I used to hold the lantern while he did the lathing. We lived in our little camp house on the lot until we moved into two rooms in December of 1916.

On April 21, 1917 our sweetheart Beth arrived and were we happy and proud parents. We had a little trouble training her the first six weeks but finally let her cry for two hours and she has behaved herself since. Mother lived with us, and Beth was named on her 74th birthday July 1, 1917. She was so proud of Beth. Mother spent her winters visiting her children and summers at home so that she could have her flower garden.

On September 30, 1919 we were proud and happy again when our son Gordon arrived. When he was nearly six years old he became very ill, but was spared to us through faith and prayers.

On November 19, 1921 Father Hobbs passed away with cancer of the face. He was such a big man and had such a wonderful faith. He would sit for hours and tell of his experience when He was helping to settle San Juan County.

In the fall of 1922 we went to California to spend the winter and let our folks and friends see the children. It took us five days to drive down in an open Ford, long hours each day, as the roads were so bad and the Ford was not so fast.

January 5, 1923 we received word that mother was very ill. The children and I rushed home on the train but she passed away almost before we had received the word. It was a hard blow as we loved her so much.

On August 24, 1927 another baby soon came to bless our home whom we named George Peter for his two grandfathers, but he was only permitted to live one day, and we were so sad to lose him, but happy that my life was spared as I was very ill for weeks and only through faith and good care was I healed.

I was given during this illness a most remarkable testimony as I was permitted to pass to the other side and was asked if I would like to remain there or come back to my husband and children and pain. My reply was, "I want to go back and raise my children". When I came to I was suffering untold agony, but after weeks of illness I was able to care for my loved ones again.

On February 11, 1932 Mother Hobbs passed away and was buried on the 14th. They were wonderful parents, they both were firm believers of the Gospel, and we loved them very much.

Another baby girl arrived to bless our home on July 10, 1932, and we named her Joana after her Grandmother Malmgren as she was born the same month of the year. We were all so happy to have her, and she has brought so much joy and comfort into our lives.

In 1935, Beth graduated from high school and Gordon from Junior High. Beth entered the L.D.S. Hospital Nurses training School in September of that year.

In the spring of 1936 Lloyd and Joana and I went to California while Lloyd was working down there, and left Beth and Gordon at home to go to school, this was the first time for eighteen years that we had been away from Beth on her birthday.

Beth and Gordon graduated on May 27, 1938, from Nurses training and high school respectively.

Beth took her first job at the Salina hospital and in June of 1939 accepted a job as public Health Nurse in Sanpete county with Headquarters at Manti, Utah.

Gordon worked for a year after finishing high school with his Dad on the Spanish Fork school house, and then went to the Brigham Young University for a year before leaving for a mission to the Central states on October 17, 1940.

I have always tried to be a faithful member of the Church, and I began teaching Sunday School when I was 14 years old in 1902, and have been working in Church organizations ever since. In 1905 I was appointed secretary treasurer in the Y.L.M.I.A. and served for six years. When I was married I was working in M.I.A., Supervisor of the Primary, in Sunday School and a teacher in Religion Class and Primary. In 1918 I was called to work on the Stake Board of the Primary and on August 18, 1924 was called as first counselor of the Stake Primary Board with Minnie J. Smith as President. We were released May 29, 1932 by request as Joana was coming. I served on the Y.L.M.I.A. Board Stake Board 1934 and 1935. From 1933 to 1938 I was ward president of the Y.L.M.I.A. and was released by request. I started working on the primary Stake Board in 1937 and worked there until I was appointed Second Counselor, after turning down the Presidency, of the South Ward Relief Society September 1, 1938, and am still serving. Lloyd and I were Chairman of the Ward Reunion Committee. I have been first vice president of the P.T.A. Organization in 1932 and 1940-41. Daddy Built the South Ward amusement hall in 1937 and 38.

On June 5, 1940 Beth was married to Morris Harding Taylor in the Manti Temple, and now we have another fine son, they are living in Fargo, North Dakota at the Present time. On August 15, 1940 we left for a trip to visit Beth and Morris. We met in the Black Hills of South Dakota, and all went to Canada to see our relatives and see the Cardston Temple. We have had some wonderful trips together, and I hope we have a lot more to come.

Mother loved beauty in all it's forms. She loved her handsome husband, all the beautiful relatives and friends she was surrounded with, the wonderful Gosepl of Jesus Christ, and she loved flowers. All winter her geraniums bloomed for her in the sun porch and when the crocuses popped through the cold ground in February or March she was so excited. Mother loved iris and she had many beautiful ones. She had many lovely peonies, lilacs, roses, sweet peas, tulips, daffodils, poppies, bleeding hearts, Canterbury bells, and clematis. She was happy when there were lots of flowers for Decoration Day.

"It isn't in doing what you like to do, but liking what you have to do." This was a saying of Mother and she followed it. We would always do our work first every day, and then we were allowed to play. Mother would "fancy work" as she called embroidery, or crochet. Mother did beautiful work. She made embroidered pillowcases for all the newlyweds with her self-padding stitch. It was fairly fast and easy, but lovely. She would make rolled rosebuds on the baby dresses for the girls. She had doilies all over her house that she had crocheted. She crocheted table clothes and a bedspread. She also loved to quilt, and made some lovely bedspreads and quilts. She was a very fast quilter and made even stitches. I remember coming home many times and playing under the quilt in the front room while Mother and her friends were enjoying a quilting bee. Mother would never sit and do nothing, she always had some embroidery or crocheting to keep her hands busy.

"If it is worth doing at all, it is worth doing well." Mother loved music and singing. We enjoyed many hours around our player piano and singing in the car. Beth and I took piano lessons and Gordon played the cornet. Mother had Beth and I learn to "recite." She taught us how to say the

poem with feeling and she gave us lessons so we would improve and do well. We would sing, "Here's a Ball for Baby," to all the babies, and Mother loved to rock them to sleep and sing, "Rock a Bye, Don't you Cry." Mother and Dad's favorite song was "Let Me Call You Sweetheart." They truly were sweethearts, and are a wonderful example of a loving and caring celestial marriage.

Mother loved learning new things and gaining knowledge. She was only able to finish the 8th grade, but she read many books and loved the Relief Society lessons. She would always come home after Relief Society and give Dad and I a complete review of what she had learned. She always took notes so she could remember the things that were taught to her.

Mother had a grateful heart. She truly had an "attitude of gratitude." She was grateful for her dear companion, her children, her friends, the gospel, her home on University Avenue, the BYU, and everything the Lord had blessed her with. Even after her stroke she appreciated her nurses and everyone who came to visit. She could not talk and tell them thanks, but we could see it in her eyes. She had several of the nurses at the home where she was come to her funeral. What a beautiful way to be! She was a dear, sweet, wonderful lady whom everyone loved. I am so grateful that she is my Mother!

Beth H. Taylor was the first child born to George Lloyd Hobbs and Jennie "V" Malmgren Hobbs on April 21, 1917 in Nephi, Utah.

She loved to recite. She learned elocution and began her public career as she first recited at age 5 to radio station KHJ, out of Los Angeles, from the largest radio station in the country at the time. She recited to large and small groups. She participated in all her high school plays.

Beth graduated from L.D. S. Hospital in 1938 as a registered nurse. She then worked at the Salina Hospital from 1938-39, in Manti from 1939-40 as a public health nurse, and at North Dakota Agricultural College in 1941, teaching Red Cross mother and baby care.

Beth married Morris Harding Taylor June 5, 1940 in the Manti Temple and immediately left her home in Nephi to follow her new husband to Fargo, North Dakota, where he had a job with the federal government. Morris worked most of his career for Utah State University as an Agricultural Economist, working with the Extension Service. They had 6 children and lived most of their married life in Hyde Park, Utah.

She was PTA President in Hyde Park and served as president of the region. She served as President of Utah State University Extension Womens Association. She was the Administrator of Sunshine Terrace in Logan, Utah from 1960 to 1968 and as the Administrator of Hillhaven Convalescent Center in Ogden, Utah from 1972 to 1974.

Beth was the First Fellow in the American College of Nursing Home Administrators in the State of Utah. She served on the Bear River Health Council. She was a Fellow in the American College of Nursing Home Administrators. She was in Who's Who Among American Women from 1968-74. She was active in the Utah Nurses' Association, and in 1964 she helped organize and was the first Chairman of the Geriatric section in that association. She was honored with a lifetime membership in the UNA. She served as a member of the Soroptimist Club in Logan. She taught teenagers in 4-H Club for Utah State Extension service for many years.

Education was very important to Beth. Morris set the standard in the family with his doctorate degree from University of Wisconsin. All of her children received their Bachelor's degree and some received advanced degree from USU. Beth's immediate family had 13 degrees from USU; and including her son-in-law and daughter-in-law, there were 17 degrees from USU. Beth decided at age 52, she wanted a degree from Utah State as well. She received her Bachelors' degree from Utah State University in 1971.

Service in the church was important to Beth. Beth's four sons all served missions and she had 19 grandsons and granddaughters serve missions. She was active in the LDS Church. She taught in the M-Men and Gleaners, served as stake mother education leader and taught in the ward Relief Society and Sunday School. She sang in the choirs and encouraged her children to sing.

She was a friend to children and made friends with small children quickly. She loved to hold babies, especially her great-grandchildren. Beth was the core, the true revered matriarch of her family; who adored her. She had a loving influence on her family. Prayer was her solace and

comfort. She sometimes prayed for hours in a day, evoking the blessings of God on her dear family and friends. She had many miracles in response to her prayers.

From Beth's Personal Biography

What I have in mind is that I want to leave my testimony so that my grandchildren will know how much I love the Lord and Jesus Christ. My life has been full of miracles, great ones and small ones. They started when I was about eight years old when Eunice and Bessie Irons, Gordon and I went on an Easter egg roll east of Nephi and couldn't remember our way home. We said a prayer and afterwards we found the sheep lane where they use to bring the sheep into town and followed that a long ways. We had a good walk until it turned down to the highway. Then we followed the highway back to Nephi. Grandma Stanley had about the first house on the south of town and when we got to her house we were happy to see her. She gave us cookies before we went on home. Heavenly Father answered our prayer and helped us find our way home. This is when I first gained a testimony.

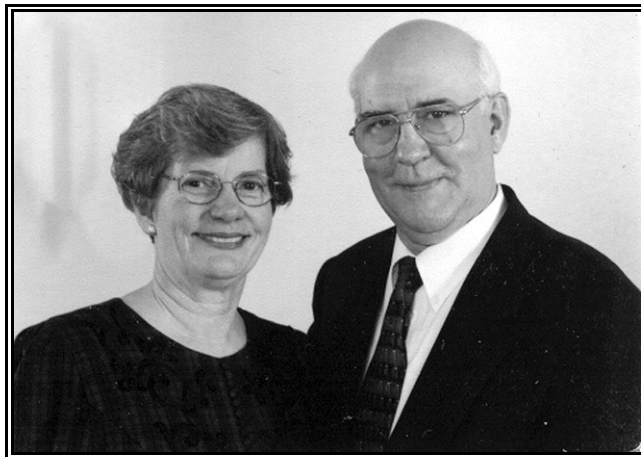
When I was ten-years-old Mother was pregnant and one morning as I went in her bedroom she was having convulsions. It terrified me and I ran for Aunt Mabel Greenland, a neighbor. They took the baby, inversion extraction, on the kitchen table. It was a little boy and they named him George Peter. He lived for about 24 hours. I stayed right by the box they had him in. They put him in front of the oven to act as an incubator. This was very, very hard on me to have this baby die. I wanted a baby so badly to play with. I could hardly stand to see babies for a long time after he died. I prayed real hard for the baby to live and I realized that God has a purpose and that you don't always get your prayers answered the way you want them.

It was at this time that mother, being so sick, died and went to the other world. When she was there she was given a choice of staying or coming back with us. I was ten and Gordon was eight and Dad was in love with her. She chose to come back. She said it is the most beautiful place you would want to see and that as her spirit re-entered her body it was the most excruciating pain she ever suffered. Mother had a fear of death and this experience gave her a new understanding of what it was like there and she always talked about planning to go there again. It was with this experience that I realized that God does answer prayers if we're worthy and we should always try to be worthy.

The night after my index finger was cut off I was very, very bitter and angry at God for not letting me keep it. I spent most of the night praying and debating because I figured I had been worthy of my prayer being answered. When Mr. Whitehead gave me a blessing he didn't promise me my finger and I was very upset. I decided that since I had tried to be good, if God didn't appreciate it then maybe I should serve the devil. I struggled with that through the night. By morning I decided that God had a purpose for me to lose my finger, and he did. For it made me much more aware of things people had to go through and I was able to talk to them and help them understand that God still loves us even if he doesn't fully answer our prayers every time. So I decided to serve God and it has been a blessed thing in my life.

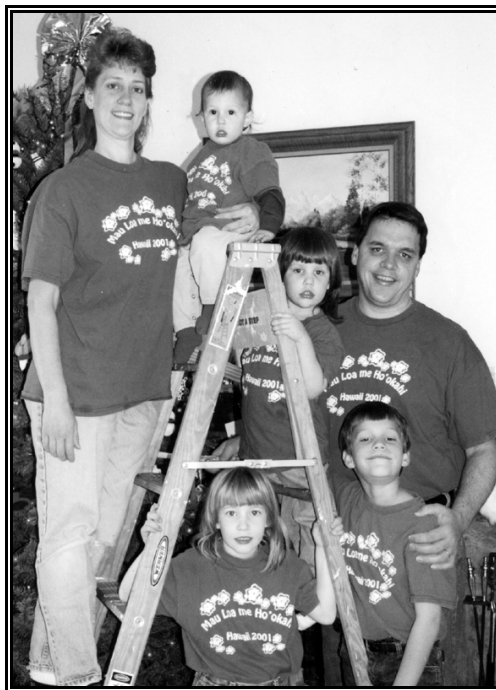
I served an LDS mission to the Gulf States, completed a Master's Degree from George Washington University in Information Systems Management, and served in the United States Air Force retiring in 1994 with the rank of Colonel. Many years ago the need for a family council came into our family. My wife, Susan, delivered twins to add to our family of two little girls. The oldest was not yet 4. We felt the awesome responsibility of caring for these children and being able to manage our lives. A year passed and family management challenges did not ease. I knew that God had the answer.

One Sunday a lesson at Priesthood meeting in Arlington Virginia suggested that a family meeting or council could be used to manage the family affairs. This meeting could be separate from family home evening and the idea hit my heart. I was told that this was your answer. I came home like Archimedes of old and announced, "Eureka! I have found it. Councils are the answer to our problem." Susan was agreeable to try anything that might work even though we had no clear idea how to start. We recorded our meetings over the years by taking minutes and the volumes of notes are both insightful and at times hilarious as we tried to meet the various challenges of the children. These personal experiences, service in various church callings, and personal insight from talks given by general authorities have added to our knowledge. Our family of eight children is now grown and has benefitted from the concept of a family council in the home. God did have the answer. He knows us and our needs and will provide the answer if we will ask in faith. He loves His children and wants them to be happy.

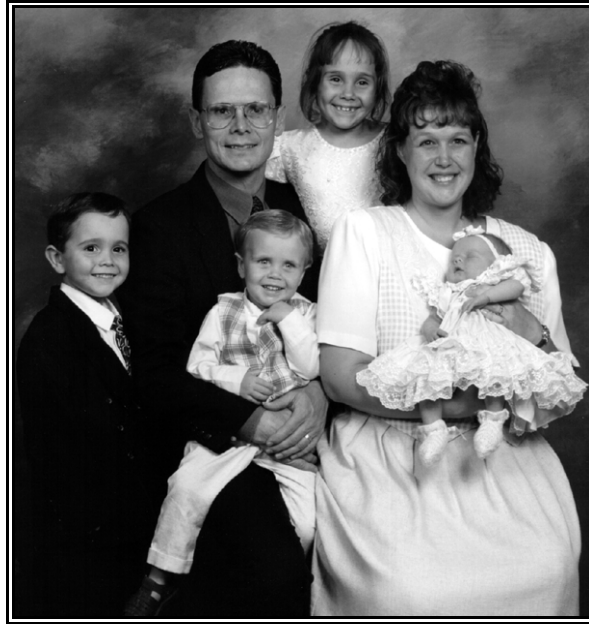


I graduated from USU in 1969 two weeks after the birth of my first child. I had earned a Bachelor's Degree in Elementary Education and Child Development and a Master's Degree in Child Development, both awarded the same day. I also gave the valedictory address for the College of Family Life and was given an award for having graduated with the highest GPA of any woman that year. After my children were raised I began working as an instructor at BYU and completed a Doctorate in Marriage, Family, and Human Development with a specialty in Early Childhood Education. As I was completing my dissertation, I began working in the as a faculty member in Education Department at Utah Valley State College.

When my daughter, Debbie, became ill very suddenly with pneumococcal meningitis her doctors had little hope she would live. We had been traveling and stopped at the small hospital in Moab, Utah, when she lapsed into a coma. They called for a life flight helicopter from Grand Junction, Colorado. As I rode with her in the helicopter watching her thrash about although tied into a mummy bag, knowing she was very ill, I had to be willing to let her return to her Heavenly Father even though her father had given her a blessing in Moab of complete recovery. I held to that blessing through the first night but she was still in a coma the next day. Our ward in Albuquerque fasted for her the second day and she began to regain consciousness early on the third day. Even though the doctors gave us little hope she would live and then none that she would ever walk again, the third day her seminary class fasted for her and that evening she wiggled the toes on her left foot. Before we left the hospital two weeks later, she could walk dragging the left leg and four months later she danced with her drill team in state competition with no visible signs of paralysis.

Even though the Lord has given me this dramatic miracle to teach me of his love and power, more precious to me has been the quiet witness of the Holy Ghost in quiet times of sorrow or pain that my Heavenly Father knows me personally, cares about my small trials, and guides my footsteps. The constant companionship of the Holy Ghost speaks peace to my soul daily. "I know my Father lives and loves me, too."

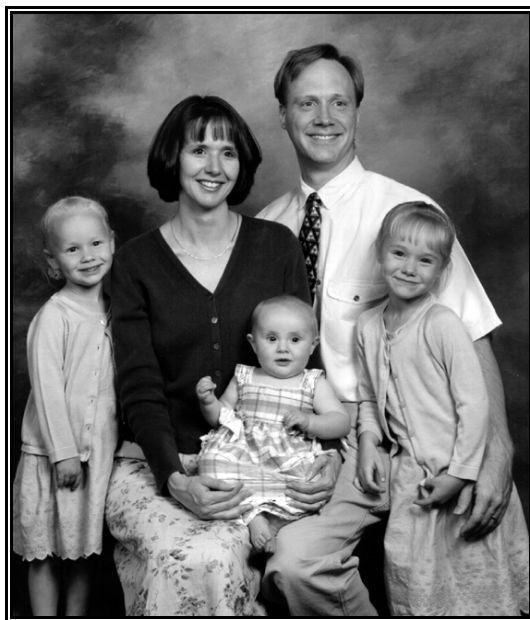

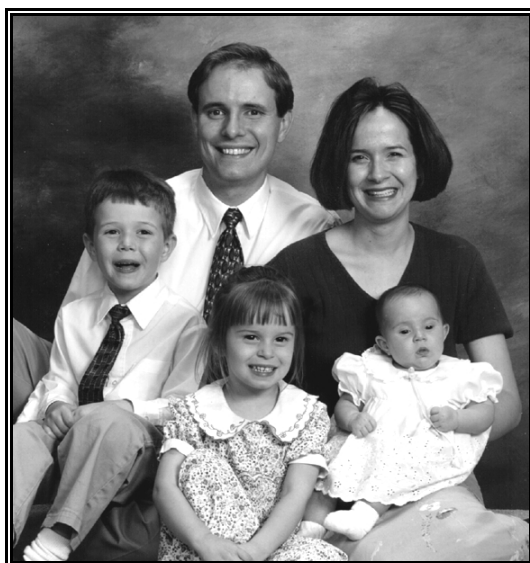

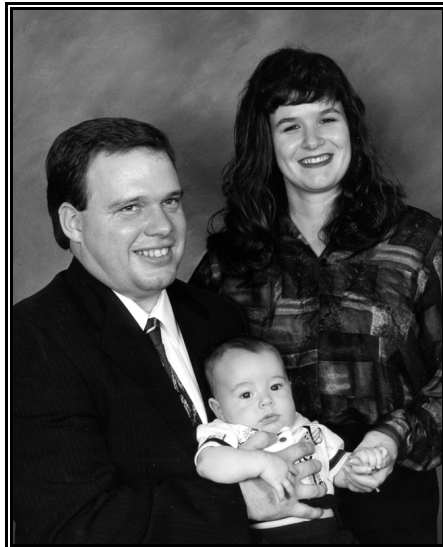

History of Lloyd Gordon Hobbs

Gordon was born September 30, 1919, to Lloyd and Jennie Hobbs in Nephi, Utah. He had two sisters: Beth and Joana, and a younger brother, Peter, who only lived a short time.

Gordon was a very pleasant, happy child. He had a lot of friends and enjoyed school. He was always active in the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. He contracted polio when he was 5-years-old. A miracle from God, and many prayers made it possible for him to survive and not be crippled, like many others in Nephi were.

Gordon worked with his father, who was a carpenter, from a very young age. He milked the family cow and helped maintain a beautiful and large lot around their home. His family did considerable traveling and spent many winters in California because of better job opportunities in construction.

He graduated from Juab High School in 1938 and from Juab Stake Seminary the year earlier. He loved his High School days with his many friends. He and Vaughn Paxman were especially close and each named their second sons after each other. Gordon played trumpet in the band and Vaughn the saxophone. He attended BYU for a year before his mission.

Gordon completed an honorable mission to the Central States from 1940-1942. At his farewell held in the Nephi South Ward on September 29, 1940, he and his three friends, Vaughn, John Vickers, and Lawrence Memmott sang, "I'll Go Where You Want Me to Go, Dear Lord." It was a farewell for the four of them, they all went to the mission home together, but to different missions. Apostle Reed Smoot set Gordon apart as an Elder, and then he was ordained a Seventy. He spent most of his two years in Eastern Kansas and he loved the people he served and they loved him. Gordon served several Stake Missions in California. He was always a missionary wherever he went.

He was only home from his mission a few weeks before the Nephi Draft Board was "breathing down his neck" as he said. He was inducted into the Corps of Army Engineers where he served during World War II for the next three years, October 1942 to December 19, 1945. He served in New Guinea where he contracted Malaria Fever, which he suffered from, from time to time the rest of his life. Being a carpenter, one of his duties was to make coffins for soldiers who had been killed. He attended BYU after he returned. His folks lived in Provo. Then he was offered a job by his Uncle Clarence Hobbs in California.

Gordon married Gereldine (Gerry) Hansen on October 29, 1948, in the Manti Temple. We honeymooned in California for 47 years, until Gordon's death on May 15, 1995. We have five lovely children, Marlene, Ronald, Vaughn Raymond, Janice, and Lorraine. They have all been through the temple, have educational degrees and good careers. Four have served missions for the LDS Church. Four have been married in the temple, and we have 14 grandchildren that are all delightfully different, thoughtful and considerate, and all seem to love each other and enjoy being together whenever the opportunity arises. All are active in the Church, all doing well in school. What more could grandparents ask?

By working with his Dad through his youth and high school years, Gordon learned to become a first-class carpenter. After he returned from the military, he worked for his Uncle Clarence Hobbs installing windows in schools, churches, and large homes for about 20-plus years. Then he worked for school districts, mainly for Downey Unified School District, where he retired after 20-plus years of service. He made lots of friends. They appreciated his good work and friendly personality. He stayed with Downey until he was 67-years-old. They gave him a delightful surprise retirement party.

Gordon and I enjoyed extensive travel together before and after his retirement. We bought a 31-foot Bouncer Motor Home with all the amenities. We traveled extensively in Canada and some in Mexico, all 50 United States, including Hawaii and Alaska. We enjoyed ten good years of travel time, would have liked more, but thankful for what we had.

We had a delightful life together; it couldn't have been better. It would have been nice to have had a few more years together but we can't make those calls. I look forward to joining him and continue our eternal life together. He was a wonderful husband and father, the very best, and I loved him so very much.

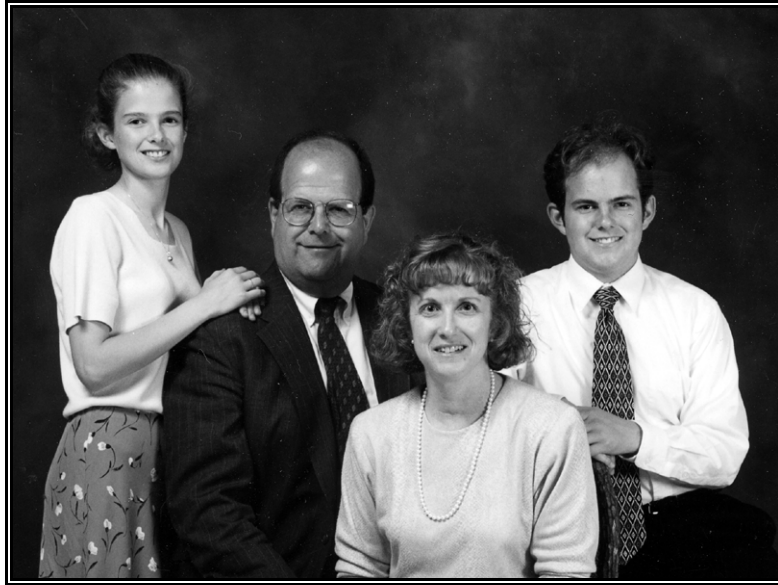

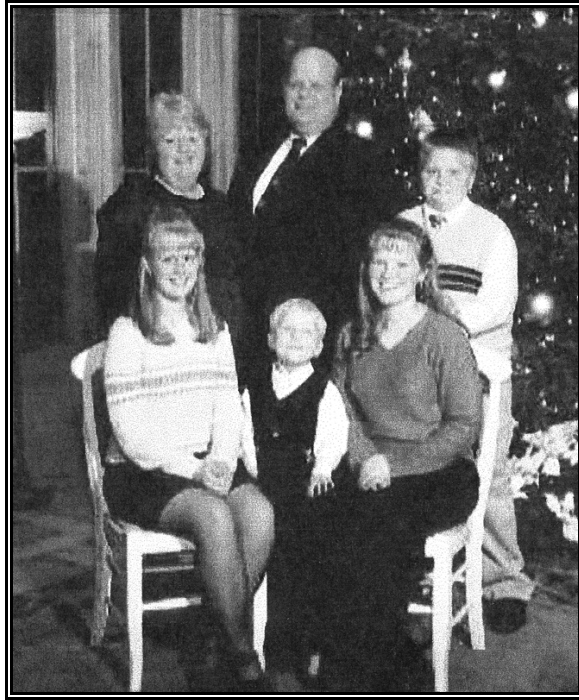

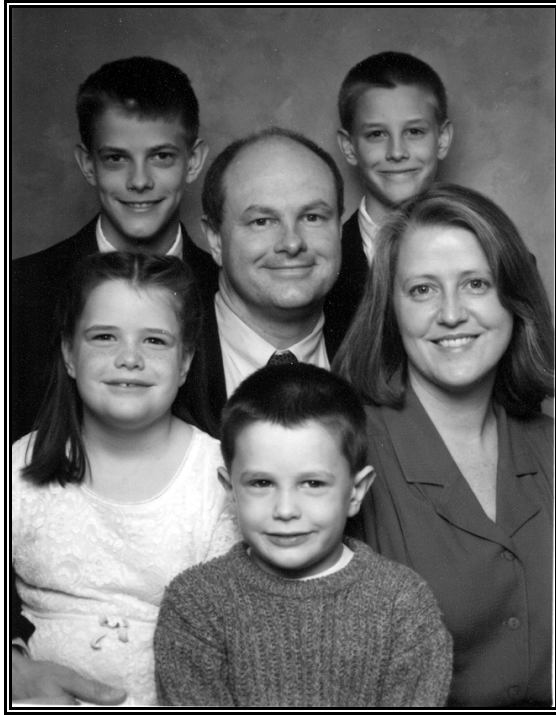

Autobiography of Joana Hobbs

I was born of "goodly parents" in our family home in Nephi, Utah, on Sunday, July 10, 1932. Jennie V. Malmgren and George Lloyd Hobbs were my dear parents. Mother was 44 years old when I was born, Beth was 15 and Gordon was 13 so I was the "little sister." I was born at 8 a.m. and Beth had most of the town informed of my birth before Sunday School. Our phone number was "4."

I was named Joana, after my maternal grandmother, Johanna Rosequist Malmgren, and I have always been proud to have her name.

My childhood was very happy. We had a beautiful home and yard. "A Thing of Beauty is a Joy Forever" was one of Mother's favorite sayings. We had a diamond-shaped rose garden out front, lilac bushes, crocuses which came up before the snow was melted. I loved them. We had peonies and iris. My parents loved to travel and Dad always had a nice car to travel in. In 1933 the five of us

motored to the Chicago World's Fair. I don't remember much, but I was proud to say I had been to Chicago. I attended Nephi Central Elementary School from Kindergarten to 4th grade.

I remember December 4, 1941. Mother and I were in the car going to see my aunts in Levan when the radio announced the bombing of Pearl Harbor. Next year the war department decided to build a steel plant in Utah County, Geneva Steel. They needed contractors, so Dad was hired. The commute was tiring, so we moved to Provo that summer, it was going to be temporary, but they loved the many cultural advantages there and later on sold the Nephi home and settled at 892 North University Avenue.

The summer I turned ten-years-old we were living in an apartment in Provo while Dad worked on the construction of the Geneva Steel Mill. I contracted rheumatic fever and was very ill for several weeks. Mother and Dad did everything they could to help me get better including priesthood blessings. They even tried taking me to a chiropractor when the regular doctors were unable to help me. Still, after three weeks when I was still unable to move my legs Mother had my name sent to the Manti Temple so they would pray for me in the prayer circle there. Shortly after Mother had sent my name to the temple I awakened from a nap and tried to move my legs. To my delight they responded and I walked into the room where Mother was to tell her I was better. Several months later Mother and Father happened to meet the President of the Manti Temple in Salt Lake and were talking to him about my sudden recovery. After inquiring about the exact day and hour of my recovery, he commented that my recovery had occurred on the very day and hour that prayers had been offered in my behalf in the Manti Temple. It was truly a miracle. Even though I had a slight heart murmur for a little while afterwards. I made a complete recovery.

I attended the Brigham Young Training School and High School. My favorite school teacher was Miss Maeser, fifth grade. She was short with a hump on her back, but a slight smile on her lips, and a love big enough to encompass everyone. Mother allowed me to take drama lessons from Kathryn Pardoe. She was such a dear lady, she always hugged me at the end of my lessons. I took piano lessons from Gerit DeJong. He was a fine teacher also. At BY High I was active in drama, chorus, and band. I played the flute. When I graduated from BY High in 1950 I was named one of the outstanding graduates. Janet Oaks and Ellen Terry, my best friends, were also on that list along with Dallin Oaks. (I got the mumps the week before graduation and got out of quarantine just barely in time.)

My brother Gordon was drafted in the army soon after the war started. We surely prayed hard that he would be safe. He served in New Guinea for three years. We were so grateful to have him return home. In 1940, Beth married Morris H. Taylor and in 1948 Gordon married Geraldine Hansen. They both were married in the Manti Temple.

At BYU I was active in Cougarettes, drama, Acappella Choir, and my senior year I was Student body Secretary-Historian. Duke Major consented to be my campaign manager the spring before, even though he was engaged to be married to another girl. That engagement broke off and we exchanged letters while he served in the army in Austria. I graduated from the Y in Theater Arts, and began working on an elementary teaching certificate. When he returned we became engaged and were married on September 1, 1955 in the Salt Lake Temple. Because both of us were the youngest in our families, all of our siblings were able to be with us at that important event. It was a beautiful day.

We lived in Southern California for 8 years, in Downey and LaHabra. We were blessed with four wonderful sons, Robert Drew, Douglas Lloyd, Dale Leroy, and John Darren, while in California. After we moved to Pleasant Grove, Utah, we were able to have our sweet daughter, Julie. Duke is a

I have served in all the auxiliaries in the church, was Relief Society President, have had many music callings. I taught piano for 14 years, then taught school for 9 years. I have been in several plays at the Orem Hale Theatre, other local theaters and have done a couple of commercials. I am active in the Daughters of the Utah Pioneers.

Our sons are all Eagle Scouts and all 5 children have served missions for the Church of Jesus Christ and graduated from various universities. We have 18 wonderful grandchildren.

In 1998 Duke and I were called to serve a mission in Nauvoo, Illinois. I was the only one who had not been a missionary, so I was very excited to serve. We had many wonderful experiences, the most memorable was being at the groundbreaking for the rebuilding of the Nauvoo Temple. We sang in the choir, what a thrill! Our son Doug and his family were there that day and President Hinckley was his usual, wonderful self.

I feel greatly indebted to my wonderful ancestors who embraced this beautiful Gospel of Jesus Christ. They came to Zion, pioneered this state, and I and my family are enjoying the fruits of their hard work and sacrifice. I am grateful that I Know that the Church of Jesus Christ is His only true Church on the earth today.

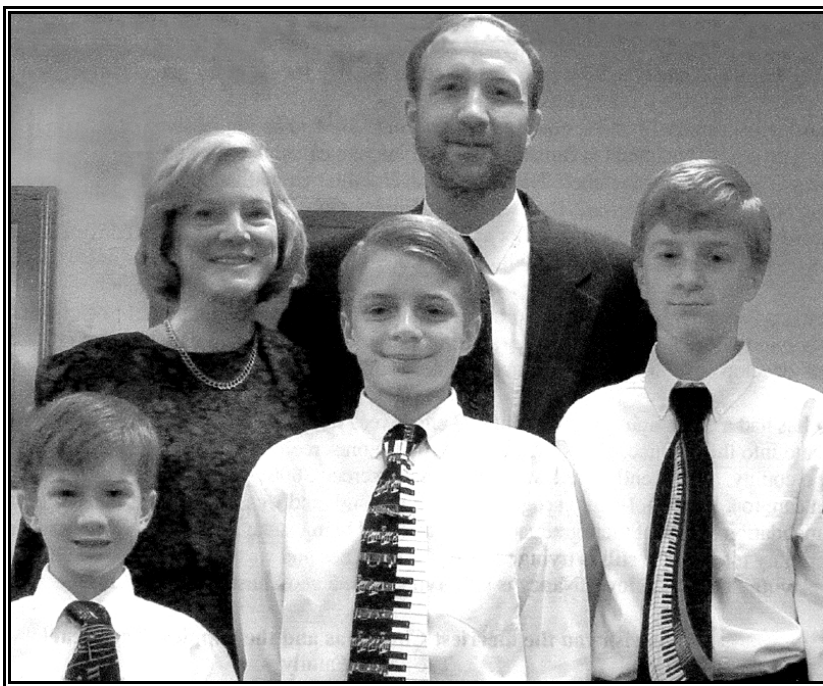
